#### **All Applicants**

- Attach a check or money order for the nonrefundable \$50 (US funds) application fee. Make checks payable to "Wayne State University." Cash is not accepted.
- United States citizens living in Canada are not to complete this Undergraduate Admission Application for Canadians. Please complete the domestic Undergraduate Admission Application that can be downloaded at admissions.wayne.edu, or contact the Office of Undergraduate Admissions for the appropriate application at admissions@wayne.edu or (313) 577-3577.

## Canadian Landed Immigrants

To be considered for admission as an undergraduate student, applicants must complete the pre-university educational program in their own country, including all provincial/national examinations required for university entrance. Students who have transferred to Canadian high schools, colleges or universities must list all previous institutions attended and submit their official transcripts, mark sheets or other appropriate records of all secondary and/or university-level coursework. The recording of one or more colleges' or universities' grades on the transcript of another institution does not meet this requirement. It is imperative that this office receives all official, attested or original documents indicating courses taken with final marks, examinations and diplomas/degrees. The information you furnish should be as complete as possible, since additional correspondence will delay the processing of your application.

Additionally, if you have taken any of the examinations listed on the application, it is your responsibility to ensure that the Office of Undergraduate Admissions receives all official scores.

### Required Admission Documents

Please refer to the Application Checklist for Canadians on the back page of this application packet.

#### First-Year Students

#### **High school students:**

- Wayne State University will consider a combined 68 percent or better grade percentage average. A student must take a minimum of six U or M courses.
- Wayne State does not consider C courses.
   Students must take one U- or M-level English course each year they are in high school.
- Students with a grade percentage average between 62 percent and 67.5 percent can take the SAT (minimum composite score of 990) to gain admission. Otherwise, we do not require Canadian students to take this test. SAT information can be found at collegeboard.com. Students intending to compete in any sport at the varsity level must complete the SAT in order to qualify for NCAA-sanctioned competition.

#### **Transfer Students**

#### University/College transfer students:

- The transfer admission requirement is a minimum of 12 transferable semester credits and a minimum cumulative gradepoint average of 60 percent (or 2.0). Professional programs of study have up to two years or more of prerequisites and require higher percentages or averages for admission. Please refer to the section "Programs of Study and Contact Information" for additional information.
- Students must request that official transcripts from all prior institutions be sent to Wayne State University.
- If you are a transfer student taking coursework at the time admission is granted, please request that your institution mail an official transcript reporting the additional credits to Wayne State University, Office of Undergraduate Admissions, PO Box 02759, Detroit MI 48202-0759 USA.
- Transfer applicants with fewer than 12 transferable semester hours of college or university coursework should submit an official high school transcript.
- Applicants on probation with a grade-point average of 2.0 or lower, or those who have been asked to withdraw from another college or university are required to wait one calendar year before applying for admission to Wayne State. At that point, the transfer admission requirements must be met.

### University Application Due Dates

August 1 — Fall semester (September-December)

Nov. 1 — Winter semester (January-April)

March 1 — Spring/summer semester (May-August)

Applications received after the above due dates will be processed as quickly as possible. However, if an application cannot be completed for the preferred semester, a renewal application must be filled out and submitted. Canadian applicants with transcripts/mark sheets outside of Canada are strongly advised to begin the process of application at least **four months** before the start of classes for the semester of interest. It is the applicant's responsibility to request official transcripts from all Canadian and non-Canadian secondary or postsecondary institutions attended.

## **English Proficiency Requirements**

The following applicants are exempt from taking the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), the Test of Written English (TWE) and the Oral Proficiency examination:

- Canadian citizens or landed immigrants whose native language is English.
- Applicants who have completed all of their secondary or postsecondary education in Canada or another English-speaking country such as the United Kingdom, Australia, the West Indies or other countries as specified by the Office of Undergraduate Admissions.

For those applicants not meeting the above exemption requirements, English proficiency requirements are TOEFL with a minimum score of 550 and TWE and oral scores of 5.5 or more, IBT (Internet-based TOEFL) score of 79-80, and computer-based TOEFL with a minimum score of 213 and oral score of 5.5 or more. Test results cannot be more than two years old. Applicants also may take the University of Michigan English Proficiency Exam (MELAB). The minimum MELAB score required for Wayne State admission is 85. For more information about the MELAB, contact the University of Michigan at (734) 764-2416.

French-speaking Canadians are required to present results of the TOEFL/TWE/Oral examinations. However, if academic credentials indicate different circumstances, exemptions are possible. For more information, contact the International Undergraduate Admission Counselor at (313) 577-3577.

The TOEFL/TWE Bulletin of Information and Registration Form is available from many agencies, high school counselors and university counseling offices. If this information is difficult to find in your local area, visit www.toefl.org, write to TOEFL, Box 6151, Princeton NJ 08541-6151 USA, or contact TOEFL by phone at (609) 921-9000.

#### **Professional Programs**

Applicants applying to professional schools, such as Pharmacy and Health Sciences, Nursing or Social Work, should note that there are additional requirements for admission consideration. In many instances, the professional school will require a supplemental application. Please contact the respective program for additional information and refer to the information listed in "Programs of Study and Contact Information" section of this application. Applicants who do not meet admission requirements for the professional programs may be eligible for admission into the pre-professional programs in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.

## Financial Documentation of Support

Resident or commuting Canadian students must provide an official Statement of Financial Support showing the sponsor's willingness to pay for tuition, registration fees, books and supplies, and living expenses (if applicable) for the anticipated study period at Wayne State University.

Your ability or that of your sponsor to provide the needed funds must be verified by a third party such as a bank. Use the enclosed "Funding Statement" form or request a letter from your sponsor's bank indicating the name of the bank, the account number, the account holder's name with signature and the bank official's signature. It is advised that the student request two original copies of financial documents: one for the visa application and one to submit to Wayne State University. (p. 8 & 10)

## Border-Crossing Documents for Part-Time Students

Landed immigrants are not allowed to be parttime students. USCIS regulations require these students enroll full-time (minimum 12 credits fall and winter). Citizens of Canada are permitted to enroll as part-time students (minimum six credits fall and winter).

## Border-crossing Registration Procedures

The Certificate of Eligibility (Form I-20) accompanies the letter of admission with additional information about registration procedures. Under no circumstances should students cross the US-Canadian border without the Form I-20. If you misplace your Form I-20, please contact the OISS at (313) 577-3422 for a duplicate Form I-20.

All Canadian students who are admitted to Wayne State University must present the following items to the OISS prior to the beginning of classes:

- Form I-20
- Proof of Canadian health insurance
- Driver's license
- Proof of landed immigrant status (if applicable). Landed immigrants must obtain a student visa from the US Consulate office in Toronto. For more information, contact the OISS at (313) 577-3422 or oiss.wayne.edu
- Passport (if applicable)
- Proof of Canadian citizenship (for naturalized Canadian citizens)

#### Canadian Student Loan Program: Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP)

Most full-time Canadian students can use OSAP funding to study at Wayne State University. The student loan can cover 50 percent or more of the yearly tuition and book supplies in the United States. OSAP funding cannot be used as proof of funds on the Funding Statement. Information is available from OSAP at osap.gov.on.ca.
