

Union brings battle over the Shore Hotel to the City Council

A Hollywood agent trying to open a new restaurant inside the Shore Hotel has become wrapped up in a years-long conflict between the hotel worker's union and the hotel's owners. The latest battlefront is an alcohol permit for the restaurant called Avery.

On Tuesday, the City Council will decide whether to deny a conditional use permit for Avery after Unite Here Local 11 filed an appeal citing ongoing litigation between the Shore Hotel and the Coastal Commission.

The Shore and the Coastal

Commission are scheduled to go to trial this summer over concerns the hotel did not provide adequate information during the permitting process and is thus operating illegally. Without a valid permit, the Shore could face millions of dollars in fines or be completely shutdown until meeting certain conditions.

In February, the Shore agreed to pay \$100,000 in back pay to three workers as part of a separate settlement with Unite Here. Workers complained they were disciplined and then fired after testifying at the Coastal Commission that the hotel was violating its permits.

Helicopter service takes Santa Monica festival-goers to Coachella from SMO

A tech start-up known as the "Uber for helicopters" has launched a new service at the Santa Monica Airport, beginning last weekend with quick trips to the Coachella Valley Music and Arts Festival.

The New York based ondemand helicopter service, Blade, is also brokering trips to Palm Springs, Ojai, Santa Barbara and San Diego in under an hour.

"There is no such thing as rush hour in the sky," is Blade's official tagiine.

A seat on a helicopter to

Thermal or Palm Springs ran for about \$700 this weekend each way. Outside of the two weekends when they are providing regular service to Coachella, Blade will not schedule regular flights out of SMO. Instead, flights are booked on demand through the Blade app.

The app allows you to "crowd source" a flight on your own schedule and see if anyone wants to join you. Blade's marking and communications officer Caitlin Deering explained customers buy and sell extra seats for credit toward future flights.



38th Annual SMC Student Photo Show April 18-29

Green celebrities

Dear EarthTalk:

Who are some of the greener movie stars out there today and what are they doing to fight for the planet?

WHILE A HANDFUL OF HOLLYWOOD

A-listers — Robert Redford, Meryl Streep and Ed Begley Jr., to name a few — have been actively campaigning for the environment for decades, a new wave of green celebrities is using star power to help convince millions of fans around the world to live greener lifestyles and speak up for environmental protections and climate mitigation.

Leonardo DiCaprio continues to distinguish himself as one of the greenest stars out there. He started the Leonardo DiCaprio Foundation in 1998 with the mission of protecting the world's last wild places, and has since then channeled millions of dollars in grants toward various direct action initiatives and awareness-raising campaigns all over the world. His 2007 documentary, The 11th Hour, features interviews with a variety of leaders and luminaries in documenting the grave environmental problems facing the planet's life systems, while his 2016 film, Before The Flood, focuses on the environmental impacts of global warming on different locales around the world. Last December, DiCaprio met with then-President-Elect Trump to discuss the importance of the U.S. remaining committed to reducing greenhouse gas emissions and honoring its commitments as part of 2015's Paris climate agreement.

Another big star that's gone green is Arnold Schwarzenegger. The Terminator earned his environmental cred during his six years as California's governor when he shepherded legislation through a hostile state legislature establishing the most stringent emissions reduction mandates in the nation, and issued executive orders to up the energy efficiency requirements for existing and new state government buildings. He also helped pave the way for the introduction of automobiles powered by emissions-free fuel cells by building the beginnings of a hydrogen refueling network across California. Schwarzenegger has been outspoken about the need for state and local governments to take the lead in the battle against global warming — a message that never resonated more clearly than now with climate-denier Donald Trump in the White House.

Mark Ruffalo may have played The Hulk in Marvel Comics' Avengers movies for good reason: He's pretty green-and resource extractors don't like him when he's angry. The A-list actor is outspoken against the environmental and health ills of fracking, a technique that recovers gas and oil from shale rock by drilling down into the Earth to direct a highpressure water mixture at the rock to release the gas inside. He founded the non-profit Water Defense in 2009, and later went on to join engineering professor Mark Jacobson, banker and solar executive Marco Krapels and filmmaker/activist Josh Fox to launch The Solutions Project, which aims to help move the U.S. to 100 percent renewable energy. He has also been active alongside the Standing Rock Sioux in fighting the Dakota Access Pipeline in North Dakota.

Some other movie stars for the environment include Edward Norton, Brad Pitt, Cate Blanchett, Daryl Hannah, Pierce Brosnan, Charlize Theron, Matt Dillon, Matt Damon, Julia Roberts, Will Ferrell, Tom Hanks and George Clooney. At least you can feel better about going to the movies now that you know the stars on the screen are using some of the money they are making at your expense to help the planet.

New Medicare help for people with chronic illness

IF YOU HAVE MEDICARE, THERE'S A good chance you have two or more chronic conditions such as arthritis, cancer, diabetes, heart disease, or dementia.

"Essentially, you can open your app - it takes 3 minutes - put all your information in and the helicopter will arrive within 20 minutes of booking," Deering said. "You don't even have to talk to anybody."

While Deering declined to describe their target clientele, Blade advertises itself as a premium service. Over the weekend, the company set up a lounge for customers heading to Coachella sponsored by the tequila company Casa Dragones. Passengers received a glass of tequila with a single handcut cloudless spherical ice cube (yes, artisan ice is now a thing) when they arrived. A team of flight attendants takes care of the traveler's bag – which has a maximum weight of 25 pounds.

'The experience starts as soon as you get to the lounge, it's not just the helicopter flight," Deering said.

It's not clear what impact this new service may have on airport traffic. Year over year, helicopter operations are down 36 percent at the airport, with 149 flights in February 2017, according to the most recent monthly operations report. Helicopters accounted for just three percent of total operations.

Anti-airport activists fear the new service



flies in the face of the City's short-term goal of reducing airport traffic by shortening the runway and long term goal of shutting down SMO for good.

As for the City, leaders were caught off guard by the news of the service on Good Friday. City Manager Rick Cole told the Daily Press Friday afternoon he was trying to get Blade's president on the phone to learn more about their business. Cole believes Blade at a minimum needs a business license to operate in Santa Monica and may need a commercial operating permit.

"You would absolutely think that would be worked out before they took off, but on the other hand they are operating like Lyft and Uber," Cole said. "These are new companies operating in the grey area of the law."

Cole says the company is pushing the envelope on charter operations. Blade serves as a liaison between commercial pilots who presumably have permission to fly out of SMO and passengers. When it comes to current law, the fact Blade does not usually schedule flights – but merely facilitates them – may be an important distinction. Cole declined to comment on how the service fits into the City's overall goals for the airport.

"It's not really a question about our feelings, the question is what are the rules."

Unite Here's research analyst Danielle Wilson is hoping the City Council will step in and make a statement about the Shore Hotel's past actions by denying the alcohol permit for the restaurant.

"I think the bottom line for them is that they originally approved a limited amenity hotel and the Shore is trying to disobey that," Wilson said. While the Shore did at one point list the new restaurant as an upcoming amenity, it has since taken the advertisement off its website.

There is limited information available about the restaurant called Avery that will be opening inside the hotel, except the owner is Peter Trinh, a Hollywood agent who also owns the Craftsman Bar and Kitchen in downtown Santa Monica.

"The Landlord has zero say in our operation and business," Trinh said in a letter addressed to the City Planning Division. Trinh did not return the Daily Press's phone calls asking for comment. In the letter, Trinh says his company, Full of Flavor LLC, is simply a tenant in a lease agreement and not involved in the legal dispute surrounding the Shore.

"We are really confused as to why we are getting dragged into a dispute between the Appellant and Landlord," Trinh said.

City staff reached out to the Coastal Commission, and representatives told them pending litigation should not impact the CUP for alcohol service by a third party applicant, according to a staff report provided to the Council. City staff is recommending the Council deny Unite Here's appeal and grant the permit.

The Planning Commission debated the issue over two separate meetings before granting the alcohol permit to Full of Flavor earlier this year. Commissioner Mario Fonda-Bonardi said that absent a proven link between the restaurant's owner and the Shore, he couldn't deny the application.

While Full of Flavor is a distinct entity from the Shore Hotel, critics argue hotel guests will benefit from the proximity of the restaurant.

"There are a lot of question marks here for us and for the community," Wilson said.

Avery will open regardless of the Council's decision on the alcohol permit.





The Nose Knows

Neurologists have gathered more robust evidence that one's sense of smell is linked to one's chances of developing dementia.

They looked at medical records of nearly 2,500 adults between the ages of 70 and 79. At age 70, they were asked to identify a dozen different smells. None of the participants were diagnosed with dementia at the time. Nine years later, those who had performed poorly on the initial test were two to three times more likely to have developed dementia than those who had performed well. Moderate early scores indicated a 1.8 times greater risk.
