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**September 20, 2020**

**November 1, 2020**

1. The blessed people are the poor in spirit, the sorrowing, the people with little status, the hungry and thirsty, those who show mercy, those with pure hearts, those who make peace, and those who are persecuted for God's sake.
2. God invites all people of all time to become the People of God.
3. The beatitudes ask us to show kindness, make peace, and welcome the poor and lonely in Jesus' name.
4. Jayden needed to talk with Mr. Eubanks because he needed to talk with someone about his bad day.
5. The word *beatitude* comes from the Latin word *beatus*, which means "happy" or "blessed."

**November 8, 2020**

1. The Foolish Girls wouldn't have learned from their mistake; the Wise Girls also could have run out of oil.
2. He is worth looking for, waiting for, and being ready for.
3. Making both good and bad decisions builds wisdom. We often learn more from making poor choices. We can also find wisdom from good role models and through regular prayer.
4. The Wisdom books are Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs, Wisdom, and Sirach. They contain advice about how to act and handle life's problems.
