

Volatility of Job Markets

- 1997 2021: Crisis after crisis has led to a more self-reliant workforce
- "As pandemic life recedes, U.S. workers are actively rethinking their job and career choices and searching for roles that offer more money, flexibility, advancement opportunities, and more, which is leading to a dramatic increase in employee resignations," said Jim Burke, Workforce Logiq's CEO. "Our quarterly and year-over-year predictive volatility benchmarks highlight the impact of this 'Great Resignation' period and indicate this trend will continue well into the fall." 


Demographic Shifts in Student Population

- 2025 peak size of high school graduating class (3.93 million)
- Millennial generation now the largest living generation: they are driving enrollments in the market
- Gen Z will be even larger than the Millennials, and is beginning to make its mark:
 - They are not enrolling in traditional degree programs at the same rates as older generations.
 - They are opting for more online and other non-traditional modalities of education
- "Non-traditional" students already make up almost 75% of university students enrolled in degree programs
- Most diverse socio-economically, racially student population ever

Higher Education Terms of Art

- **Degree**: accredited program in an area of study, 2+ yrs, generally offered by a university or college
- Certificate: specific skill(s), <1 year, career-oriented
- Course: stand-alone educational offering, ranging from a few hours to a few weeks
- For-Credit: applicable toward a university degree
- Non-credit: not applicable toward a university degree (with some exceptions)
- **Semester hour**: equivalent to 1 hr/week of instruction (typical course is 3 hrs/week)
- Contact hour: hour of engagement with instructor
- Accreditation: certification by government-recognized entity (SACS)






