A rich tradition at Rochester

Commencement season has always stood out as the "supreme festival" on Rochester's academic calendar, Arthur May notes in his history of the University: From earliest years, "Oratory flowed in full spate, the literary societies put on their finest performances, trustees convened for annual decision-making, and prizes and diplomas were handed out amidst a panoply of pomp and circumstance." Though the size of the graduating class has grown from 10 men in 1851 to more than 2,000 men and women today, and though many other developments have reshaped the ceremonies, today's program, like 1851's, marks the happy celebration of each graduate's academic preparation and the hopeful prospect of new ventures.

The gowns have a long history

Some of the features in today's ceremony date back to medieval times, such as the academic attire which recalls the gowns that were required dress at many European universities. Yet academic regalia did not figure into Rochester's earliest commencements: Both here and at other U.S. universities, wearing the gowns was thought to be snobbish and undemocratic, possibly because university educations were associated with European upperclass privilege. So for a number of years, only the president and the person who carried the diplomas wore gowns; the graduating class didn't wear them until 1892.

The hood's color is the clue

The most colorful portion of the academic costume is the hood, the color edging indicating the discipline to which the degree pertains: White and yellow-gold for arts and sciences; orange for engineering; apricot for nursing; green for medicine; pink for the Eastman School of Music; light blue for the Margaret Warner Graduate School of Education and Human Development; and drab for the William E. Simon Graduate School of Business Administration.

Symbols of authority

The mace, originally a medieval weapon of defense, has in modern times become a symbol of authority, dignity, and privilege. English universities have used maces in academic processions for many centuries; Rochester's

mace first appeared at the 1935 induction of Alan Valentine as president, and has been used in academic processions ever since. About four feet long, it is made of mahogany and hand-wrought silver. On the head, the seal of the University appears. The names of the University's presidents are engraved on two silver bands, and the dandelion, the floral symbol of the University, is the decorative motif of the silverwork. The mace is carried by the University marshal, who leads the procession alongside an associate marshal who carries the less-imposing baton.

Words to live by


Commencement speakers have been inspiring Rochester graduates ever since Henry Ward Beecher gave a speech on "Character" at the 1851 ceremonies: Theodore Roosevelt, then governor of New York, spoke in 1900; New York Governor Mario Cuomo spoke in 1985, and another holder of the governor's seat, Thomas E. Dewey, spoke in 1957. Richard Nixon gave advice to 1966's graduates, and Prime Minister Winston Churchill, accepting an honorary doctorate by trans-Atlantic radio during 1941's commencement, pleaded for Anglo-American unity in a characteristically rousing speech.

Happy at heart on this day

Perhaps the single feature that best links today's ceremonies to 1851's commencement is the audience. From 1851 onward, enthusiastic crowds have turned out to cheer on Rochester graduates. Newspapers say thousands of spectators witnessed the first commencement, as Scott's Brass Band led a parade toward Corinthian Hall. Following the band, "presumably in ascending order of dignity," Arthur May notes, were the University janitor, Rochester schoolchildren, undergraduates, teachers at the common schools, Board of Education representatives, the mayor and his top lieutenants, officials of state and county governments, University founders, courtroom judges, the 10 graduating seniors, professors, trustees, the chancellor, and the high sheriff of Monroe County.

Among today's thousands of spectators, many are as distinguished and, no doubt, bursting with as much pride as the onlookers of 1851.

Richard D. McKelvey

Interdisciplinary approaches to problem solving have earned Richard McKelvey kudos as an innovative scholar.

McKelvey earned a Ph.D. in political science from the University in 1971. Now a professor of political science at California Institute of Technology, McKelvey has the rare ability to tackle problems through a combination of disciplines and techniques. His current research ranges from analyzing the importance of information and learning for voting and other behavior, applying evolutionary models to political matters, and developing sophisticated mecha-

George T. Walker

Winning the 1996 Pulitzer Prize in Music is George Walker's latest achievement in a successful career.

A 1957 doctoral graduate of the Eastman School of Music, Walker won the Pulitzer Prize for his composition, Lilacs for Voice and Orchestra. He is the first black composer and the eighth Eastman-affiliated composer to win the prestigious honor since its inception in 1943.

Walker has built an impressive career as a pianist, composer, and educator. He has published more than 70 works in a variety of compositional forms, and they have been performed by virtually every important orchestra in this country and England. Following graduation from

Ross Watts, professor of accounting at the William E. Simon Graduate School of Business Administration, draws praise for his persistent attention to student success and tireless devotion to the school's Ph.D. program.

Colleagues and former students alike say this year's winner of the University Award for Graduate Teaching is accessible and eager to regard students as equals in scholarly pursuits. Often he presents his own papers for criticism and input. He draws praise for insightful comments and quick turnaround on student papers.

One former student who now teaches at a leading business school remarks: "He was always available to talk with me about my research, despite many other (often pressing) demands on his time." Others write that they try to apply the "Ross-model" to their own classroom and one-on-one endeavors.

His research is published in the scholarly journals of a wide range of disciplines, including computer science, economics, political science, and statistics.

For the profound impact his theories have had on a wide variety of fields, McKelvey in 1993 was selected for membership in the National Academy of Sciences, one of only a handful of political scientists to receive the honor. He also is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Science and the Econometric Society.

Oberlin College, Walker attended the Curtis Institute. He toured Europe for several years before enrolling at Eastman. After graduation, he returned to Europe on Fulbright and John Hay Whitney fellowships. Throughout his career, Walker also received two Guggenheim and two Rockefeller Foundation fellowships, as well as five National Endowment for the Arts awards and numerous research grants.

Walker has held academic appointments at Smith College, the University of Colorado, Peabody Institute, and the University of Delaware. He was a distinguished professor at Rutgers University before retiring in 1992.

Watts' dedication to the Simon School's Ph.D. program is a primary reason for its success producing outstanding Ph.D. graduates, colleagues say. Top business schools vie for his students, many of whom have gone on to teach at the likes of the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania, the Sloan School of Management at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and the Kellogg Graduate School of Management at Northwestern University. In addition, since his arrival in 1971, he has played a major role in shaping the school's teaching and research agenda in accounting.

The University Award for Graduate Teaching was established in 1987 to recognize faculty members who have excelled in graduate instruction, especially in doctoral programs. The award complements the longstanding Edward Peck Curtis Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching.



The Procession

The academic procession, one of the most colorful traditions, begins with participants assembling on the Wilson Commons lawn. The University carillonneur strikes a march tune, and the procession heads down Wilson Boulevard to the pealing sounds from the bell-tower. As the procession approaches Eastman Quadrangle, the University marshal escorts the president, provost, and representative of the board of trustees to a reviewing stand where they greet the participants as they arrive on the quadrangle.

Today's master's degree candidates are at the front and center of the procession. Each school and degree is marked by a banner matching the candidates' hoods. The outer four columns of the procession are baccalaureate candidates; again, each school is marked by its college banner.

When the candidates have passed, those on the reviewing stand join faculty, other University officers, distinguished guests, and honorees. Signaled by the Wind Ensemble's fanfare, everyone in the audience stands while the marshals, carrying mace and baton, escort the platform party to its place on stage. Then the commencement ceremony begins.

Hutchison Medal

David T. Kearns

The Hutchison Medal, first awarded in 1977, is the highest honor the University gives its alumni; it recognizes outstanding achievements and notable service to community, state, or nation.

David Kearns, this year's Hutchison medalist and commencement speaker, once said that our nation's greatest natural resources are the minds and hearts of its people. For this reason, Kearns has proved a tireless supporter of the University's mission and a leader in national education reform.

Kearns was tapped in 1991 to become deputy secretary of the U.S. Department of Education, where he earned high marks for a conciliatory negotiating manner. He left in 1993 to become a senior university fellow at Harvard Graduate School of Education for two years; he currently serves on the executive committee for the Harvard Project on Schooling and Children.

A strong desire to strive for excellence also served him well as chairman and CEO of Xerox Corp. from 1982 to 1990. Under his leadership during those crucial years, Xerox demonstrated to the world that American business could reinvent itself and compete successfully in a global economy. He co-wrote a book, *Prophets in the Dark*, detailing the rebound at Xerox.

Today Kearns continues his passion for reform as chairman of the board of New American Schools Development Corp. The private, nonprofit organization was established by American corporate and foundation leaders in 1991 to explore ways to improve American education. He co-wrote Winning the Brain Race, which outlines a plan to make American schools competitive.

A 1952 business administration graduate of the University, Kearns also served in the Navy. He is a trustee of the University and the Ford Foundation.

Edward Peck Curtis Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching

Thomas G. Hahn

If one word could describe Thomas Hahn's unique teaching style, that word would be "enthusiasm." As an associate professor of English specializing in medieval studies, Hahn's devotion to scholarship and to teaching has earned him the respect of students and faculty alike.

Since his appointment at the University in 1973, Hahn's unconventional methods have made their mark. Students past and present praise his contagious interest in course materials and literature. Preferring class discussion to lecture, Hahn develops the intellectual growth of his students by allowing them to work out their own conclusions, rather than besetting them with his own.

Genuine personal concern for his students keeps Hahn on a first-name basis long after final exams have been graded. Students line up outside his office to explore research topics, seek advice on graduate school, or simply chat. Many of his students have gone on to win Mellon Fellowships, Younger Scholar Awards, and other honors.

As the former director of Medieval House and the Early Connection Orientation, a pre-freshman program, Hahn's commitment to the undergraduate community has also extended beyond the academic sphere.

The Curtis Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching was established by Edward Peck Curtis, Sr., a life trustee who died in 1987. It has been awarded annually since 1962.

James William Johnson, Orator Those who receive honorary degrees and other honors at commencement are people whose accomplishments have truly made a difference in the world. The University's orator expresses that impact in a prose citation, which he reads when presenting the candidates to

the president. J. W. Johnson, professor of English at the University, is the orator. As a professor in the College, he teaches 18th-century British literature, modern drama, and film. He has written eight books.

Eastman Wind Ensemble

The Ensemble members are Eastman School of Music students, many of whom are graduating at this commencement. From its formation in 1952 by Frederick Fennell, the Eastman Wind Ensemble has taken an approach decidedly different from that of the traditional wind band.

The Ensemble has since become a model for others of its kind around the world, and has been credited with spurring a renaissance in symphonic wind music. Donald Hunsberger, professor of conducting and ensembles, has directed the group since 1965.

Seven major tours have reinforced the Ensemble's reputation. During the summers of 1990, 1992, and 1994, they made extensive tours of Japan. The group routinely performed as many as five encores before enthusiastic, sell-out crowds in Japanese concert halls. Plans are being made for their 1996 Japan Tour.

The Ensemble's more than 50 recordings have set the performance standard for wind ensembles. "Carnaval," a 1987 release of turn-of-the-century cornet solos with Wynton Marsalis, was nominated for a Grammy Award and reached #1 on Billboard's Compact Disc Chart. The most recent release is "Live at Osaka," a Sony Classical CD recorded during the 1990 Japan Tour.

The Ensemble received the 1994 Crystal Award, one of two prized Symphony Hall International Music Awards presented by the Asahi Broadcasting Corporation (ABC) Music Foundation in Osaka, Japan. Past winners include the Vienna Philharmonic, Emanuel Ax, Isaac Stern, Jessye Norman, and Yo Yo Ma.
