At the end of this year, we have given approximately 20,060 books to 2,419 children; this is something we are VERY proud of!

Let's keep up the great work. Thank you to all who have supported our program by volunteering, reading and donating used books for our book sale at the fair. We also wish to thank those in the past years who have given us grants. This year we received a grant from the Ann Marie Foundation.
