The Morehead History and Railroad Museum will present the first Morehead Model Train Show at the Conference Center 11 E. First Street, Morehead, KY. The train show will be open on Saturday, August 25, from 10:00 am until 6:00 pm and on Sunday, August 26, from noon till 6:00 pm. The show will feature layouts, demonstrations, exhibits, trains, and accessories. Admission to the show is \$5.00 for the entire weekend. There is also a train museum across the street from the Conference Center and admission to the museum will be free.

Directions to the Conference Center

On I-64 take the Morehead Exit 137. If you are coming from the west, coming down the ramp turn right onto Route 32. If you are coming from the east, turn left at the bottom of the ramp onto Route 32. Go for three miles into Morehead. Once you pass Main St. (at the BP gas station) turn left onto E. First Street. Follow E. First Street to the conference center. Several members of our T-Trak SIG plan on attending and including their modules in a display being organized by Bruce DeMaeyer from the Lexington group. Sam Delauter will have more information about the show and the T-Trak modules during our August meeting and during the T-Trak gathering after the regular meeting.

UPCOMING CLINICS Bob Osburn, Clinic Manager

The July clinic will was presented jointly by Tom Harris and Mark Maynard. They demonstrated two different techniques on how to produce cloud formations for our backdrops. This was a very interesting and informative clinic including some hands-on participation. Thanks, Tom and Mark. We always enjoy what you have to show us.

Coal Division member Jesse Smith will present the clinic for August. His experience as a Railroad Engineer will be evident from his presentation "An Engineer's Trip Across the Road, Russell to Clifton Forge".

Jesse J. Smith is a retired locomotive engineer, having worked for C&O, Chessie System and CSX from 1979 through 2017. Marked up in "Road Service" beginning in 1986, he ran coal, manifest and any other trains out of Russell, KY east to Danville, Elk Run, Logan, Handley and Hinton, WV; and then all the way east to Clifton Forge for the last four years of his career.

His presentation for our group takes us aboard his engine for the 247-mile trip with a single-stack container train all the way from Russell to Clifton Forge, a job

which he worked from 2013 through 2017. And these are the pictures he couldn't show during his time of employment!

Jesse is a lifetime model railroader, photographer, a student of the old C&O, and has authored countless articles for the C&O Historical Magazine on subjects such as C&O passenger service, the Greenbrier Resort, and Chessie's Steam-Turbine locomotives. He lives in Ona, WV with wife Katy, a cat and two dogs

The MADD session for the August meeting is freight cars, but remember the MADD session is a time for us to discuss, display, ask questions, and solve modeling projects as a group.

As the other columnists have noted, Picnic on the Platform was a great success from the food to the clinics to the contest and to a Coal Division T-Trak milestone. We were pleased to host Bruce DeMaeyer, the MCR T-Trak leader.

The next day Bruce and I attended the Division 2 meeting in Morgantown, WV. T-Trak got a warm reception there as the continued operation of their Freemo layout is in question. The following Saturday Bruce and I were in Louisville for the Division 8 meeting. There are already some Division 8 members participating in T-Trak but we did see lots of interest and lots of question were asked about the T-Trak concept.

The turnout and track replacement on my railroad has taken its next step forward with track removal at the south end of Bridgeville. The new turnouts have been built, Micro-Mark Switch Tenders have been purchased, and it has been determined that Tam Valley Depot has the decoders I need to operate them. The decoders arrived the other day so there is no excuse to keep on working on this project. Demolition (ballast and track removal) is almost complete, that last bit of ballast has to go but is hard to remove. After I return from Kansas City, track laying should begin and the railroad should be ready for its September 13 operating session.

In the last few days we have heard that the Chinese factory Atlas uses to manufacture its locomotives and cars has suddenly closed. They note that this does not affect track. I sure hope this is not an omen of things to come.

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







