Communion Breakfast—April 21 Paul Cassidy is Latin Man of the Year

Paul W. Cassidy '35, whose leadership as mayor guided the community of Parma Heights for parts of six decades, has been chosen the 2002 Cathedral Latin Alumni Association Man of the Year.

He will be honored at the association's 51st annual Communion Breakfast to be held Sunday, April 21, at the Cleveland Marriott on Public Square in downtown Cleveland.

Featured speaker at the event will be Chuck Kyle, recognized English teacher, motivational speaker, head football and track coach at arch-rival St. Ignatius High School and the husband of Cassidy's daughter, Patricia.

The noon brunch will follow a 10:30 a.m. Mass at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist in downtown Cleveland.

The 82-year-old Pittsburgh native came to Cleveland as a child and attended St. Aloysius Parish on the city's east side. As a student at Cathedral Latin School, "Droopy" was

active in the sodality, cheerleading and intramural sports before graduating in 1935. He earned his bachelor's degree from John Carroll University and his law degree from the Cleveland Marshall Law School before being admitted to the Bar in 1947.

The World War II veteran served as a navigator with the 447th Bomb Group of the 8th Air Force from 1942-45. He later was recalled to active duty in Korea, and served as base legal officer at Porter Air Force Base in Greenville, S.C. in 1950-51.

Upon his return to Cleveland, Cassidy immersed himself in the local political arena. He was named Young Republican Chairman for Cuyahoga County in 1951-52, and has served as a member of the party's Executive Committee since 1951.

His first taste of community politics came in 1953, when Cassidy was appointed to fill a vacancy on the Parma Heights City Council. He was re-elected to the seat later that year, and in 1954 was named the city's law director.

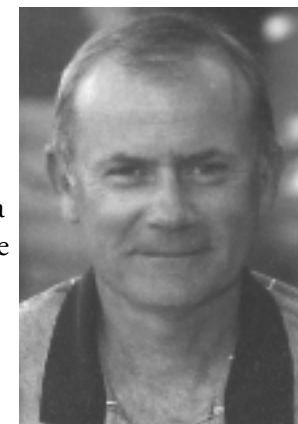
In November of 1957, with Dwight D. Eisenhower in the White House,

voters in Democratic stronghold Parma Heights chose the young Republican to be their mayor. He didn't relinquish the position until Dec. 31, 2000 – a span that made him the longest-serving mayor in Cuyahoga County upon his retirement.

Cassidy's tenure spanned decades of tumultuous change in Northeast Ohio, as families began migrating from the central city toward the southwest suburbs. While neighboring Parma enacted exclusionary zoning policies, Cassidy pushed for the enactment of a fair housing code in Parma Heights.

He once told a reporter his racial tolerance stemmed from his World War II experience. During bombing raids over Europe, he quickly learned to appreciate his air cover from a black aviation squadron headed by Col. Benjamin Davis, who later became Cleveland's safety director.

Over the years, the affable Cassidy earned high marks from Republicans and Democrats alike for his soft-spoken, bipartisan style and for his concern for the region as a whole. He was known for marshaling suburban forces against the city of Cleveland in their battles over control of the transit, sewer and water systems. Suburban officials praised him for giving suburbs a stronger voice in county affairs.

Judge George McMonagle '24

George J. McMonagle, 95, one of Cathedral Latin School's most honored and recognized alumni, died at his home in Rocky River Feb. 14. Services were held Feb. 16 at St. John Cathedral in downtown Cleveland.

A graduate of the class of 1924, McMonagle was named the Cathedral Latin Man of the Year in 1968.

The son of an Irish immigrant and a Toledo tool maker was widely considered the standard by which generations of Ohio lawyers and judges measured themselves. He already had a successful 30-year career as a trial lawyer when he was appointed to the bench in 1964.

A longtime trustee of the Latin Alumni Association, McMonagle achieved his greatest renown with his

later careers as a trial judge in Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court and as patriarch of a distinguished family of lawyers spanning three generations. Sons Richard J. and James J. followed him onto the bench, as did nephew Timothy J. and his wife, Christine. Two grandsons maintain the tradition as an assistant county prosecutor and a first-year law student.

His boundless energy and impeccable professionalism won the Republican consistently high marks from both sides of the political aisle. His docket was usually so efficiently managed that McMonagle was asked to try cases for other judges.

Though formally retired from the bench in 1976, he continued to sit as a visiting judge until the age of 90.

His noteworthy cases included the 1980 bench trial of Summit County Probate Judge James V. Barbuto. McMonagle found him guilty of gross sexual imposition and intimidation, the first sitting Ohio judge in 177 years to be convicted of a felony.

In addition to his wife and sons, McMonagle is survived by a daughter, Sally Duffy, of Lyndhurst.

To date, 65 memorial donations totalling \$3,600 in have been made to Cathedral Latin Alumni Association.

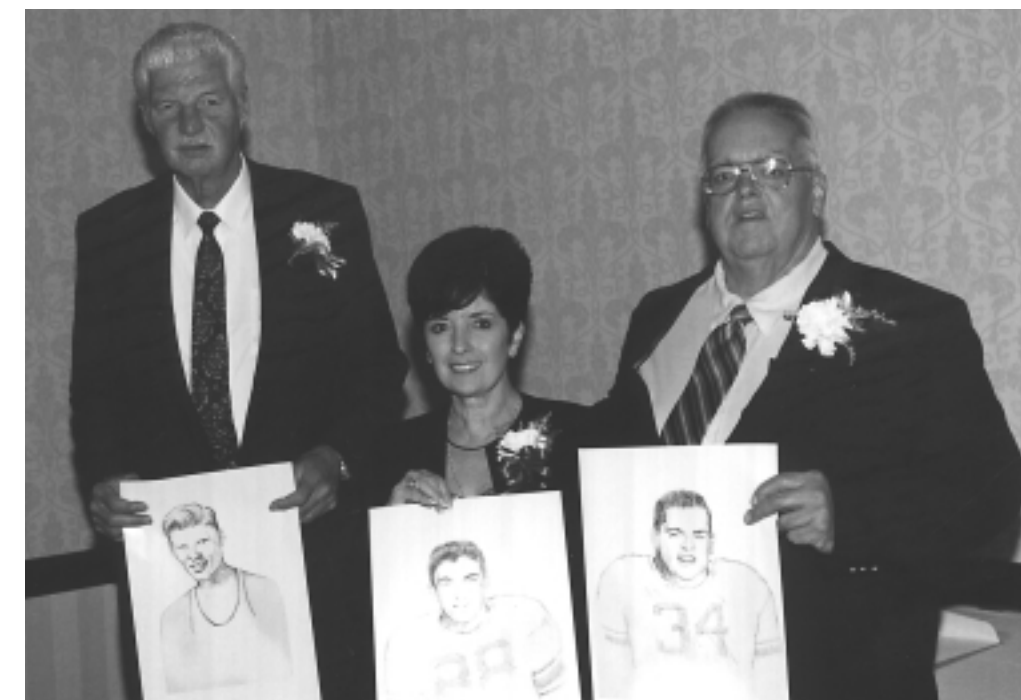

Siting impact of his high school years, Latin alum leaves inheritance to NDCL

William George Madansky '33, has bequeathed a substantial gift of money to Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin School. His family said he hoped his gift would enable others at NDCL to benefit from the positive educational experience he had at Cathedral Latin.

Madansky died last April in California after suffering from Alzheimer's Disease for the past few years. A celebration of Bill's life and that of his second wife, Mary Thelma, was held this past August in Alta Loma, Calif. His wife had preceded him in death earlier in the year.

According to his family, Bill reminisced often about his time at Latin. He felt the ideas and education he received had served him well.

His years at Latin had also provided the experience that changed his life from seeing the world through the eyes of his neighborhood ethnicity to seeing it through a more diverse world of all ethnic backgrounds. This had a profound effect on him and stayed with him throughout the rest of his life.

Born in Cleveland in 1915, Madansky was raised in a predominantly Slovakian section of the city, his parents having immigrated to the United States. After graduating from Latin, Bill worked at various jobs in the Cleveland area and eventually, with the help of his family, started a local business.

After building up the business into the early 1940s, he left Ohio for California where he joined his older brother, John. He found work in the shipyards of Oakland on the east side of San Francisco Bay. It was in Oakland that he met and married Gladys.

While working on Navy vessels, he joined the Navy in November 1944. He served on the aircraft carrier USS

Casablanca. This particular ship was the first of a series of small aircraft carriers built by Henry J. Kaiser of Kaiser Steel Industries. Kaiser Steel perfected the art of mass production of ships before and during the war years starting with the "Liberty Ships" designed to supply our allies overseas.

Bill was on the USS Casablanca, steaming toward Tokyo, when America dropped the atom bomb. Shortly after the surrender, his carrier entered Tokyo Bay and the crew helped secure the bay for U.S. Naval occupation.

After leaving the Navy in January 1946, Madansky held several positions doing mechanical work. With financial assistance through the G.I. Bill, Madansky attended City College of San Francisco and graduated in 1951 with a degree in the area of refrigeration.

After holding a number of positions with companies in the bay area, in 1960 he accepted a position in with Lockheed Aircraft Corp. in Sunnyvale, Calif. He and his wife moved to Fremont, Calif. to be closer to the plant where Bill was in charge of all air conditioning in the physical plant. He remained with Lockheed until shortly after his wife's death in 1975.

Madansky retired in 1976 and married another widower, Mary Thelma Johnson. Like Bill, she had lost her spouse a few years earlier and had no children from her previous marriage.

Over the next several years, Bill and Thelma traveled extensively throughout the United States in a motor home and enjoyed a cruise to Alaska and trips to Mexico. Most recently, they had enjoyed summers in the bay area and winters in Palm Springs.

Madansky also has a sister, Agnes Madansky Novicky, who lives in Parma, Ohio.

NDCL students excel in state proficiency testing

The results of the Ohio Proficiency Tests taken back in October are in and NDCL students performed admirably.

In the category of writing, the state average was 76 percent and NDCL students tested out at 92 percent. The state reading average was 91 percent while NDCL students scored a perfect 100 percent. In the important category of math, the state average was low at 63 percent while NDCL students scored 90 percent. NDCL students scored a very high 96 percent in citizenship vs. the state average of 78 percent. Last, but not least, was the difficult category of science where the state average was 72 percent as compared to NDCL students testing out at 95 percent.
