



Winter is Coming - Know Where To Enjoy the Snow



WHERE TO PLAY IN THE SNOW

Foxtail Picnic Area and other day use fee areas may be open, with restrooms & parking, when there is snow. Lee Canyon is popular for snow play, but can be very crowded on weekends and parking is limited. Find a safe place to play far from the side of the road.

SNOW PLAY SAFETY TIPS

- Never play near roads or vehicles.
- Avoid dangerous objects like large rocks and trees.
- Be aware of others so you don't run into them!
- No sledding in areas with less than 12" of snow.
- No snow play on private land or "closed" areas.

IMPORTANT TO KNOW...

Park off the road. All wheels must be to the right of the white line (fog line) to allow emergency vehicles to pass. Illegally parked vehicles can be fined and towed.

Pack it in, pack it out. Pick up trash & keep area clean. Pets must be kept on a leash. Please clean up after your pets.

Public Restrooms are located at open picnic areas, the Visitor Gateway, or open campgrounds.

Poor cell phone service. Pay phone is located across from Lee Meadows or Mt Charleston Fire Station.

There are no gas stations. Start with a full tank.

- No puede jugar en la nieve en áreas privadas o "cerradas".






Gallery Exhibit at the Laughlin Library
