# **KEYNOTE SPEAKERS**

# Frank Gardner, BBC Security Correspondent



Frank Gardner is the BBC's award-winning Security Correspondent, reporting on a wide range of global security and terrorism stories. He has written three Sunday Times bestsellers: *Blood and Sand, Far Horizons* and *Crisis*. His bestseller *Crisis* will become a Hollywood TV series.

While filming in Saudi Arabia in 2004, Frank was shot six times at close range by terrorists but survived after numerous operations and many months of hospitalization. From 1997-2000 Frank was the BBC's Gulf Correspondent in Dubai, then BBC Middle East Correspondent in Cairo. He was awarded the OBE by HM the Queen in 2005 for services to journalism, Honorary Doctorates of Laws from 7 British universities, the McWhirter Award for Bravery, Spain's El Mundo Prize for International Journalism, the UAE's Zayed Medal for Journalism and voted *Person of the Year* by the UK Press Gazette.

# Margaret P. Knudson, MD, FACS



Margaret (Peggy) Knudson MD, FACS is a Professor at the University of California at San Francisco. For 20 years, she served as the Director of the San Francisco Injury Center for Research and Prevention, one of the first CDC-funded Centers nationally. Her research focuses on resuscitation, venous thromboembolic disease, and pediatric injury prevention. Dr. Knudson served on the Committee on Trauma for 17 years, including four years as the Vice-Chair for the central COT. She was awarded the National Safety Council Award from the COT/AAST for her work in trauma and injury prevention. She has also been on the Board of Managers of both the Western Trauma Association and the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma. She served as the Science Chair for the National Trauma Institute for 4 years and continues on their Board of Directors. Dr. Knudson has recently been appointed as the Medical Director for the Military Health System Strategic Partnership with the American College of Surgeons.
