Section 1: Getting Started

This section helps you to quickly start using your device.

Understanding this User Manual

The sections of this manual generally follow the features of your device. A robust index for features begins on page 140.

Also included is important safety information beginning on page 96, that you should know before using your device.

This manual gives navigation instructions according to the default display settings. If you select other settings, navigation steps may be different.

Unless otherwise specified, all instructions in this manual assume that you are starting from the Home screen. To get to the Home screen, you may need to unlock the device. For more information, see "Securing Your Device" on page 9.

Note: Instructions in this manual are based on default settings, and may vary from your device, depending on the software version on your device. and any changes to the device's Settings.

Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary, depending on the software version of your device and any changes to the device's Settings.

Special Text

In this manual, you'll find text that is set apart from the rest. These are intended to point out important information, share guick methods for activating features, to define terms, and more. The definitions for these methods are as follows:

- Notes: Presents alternative options for the current feature or menu.
- Tips: Provides quick or innovative methods, or useful shortcuts.
- Important: Points out important information about the current feature that could affect performance.
- Warning: Brings to your attention important information to prevent loss of data or functionality, or even damage to your device.

SIM Card

Your device uses a 4G LTE SIM (Subscriber Identity Module). The 4G LTE SIM is a small, rectangular plastic card that stores your device number, information about your wireless service, and other information such as messages and contacts.

If you purchased your device at a Verizon Wireless store, the SIM card is activated and ready to use. If you ordered a new device, the card may need to be activated before you can use it. For more information about activating the SIM card, visit:

http://www.verizonwireless.com/4GSIM.

Caution!: Do not bend or scratch the SIM card. Take care when handling, installing, or removing the SIM card, and avoid exposing the SIM card to static electricity, water, or dirt. Keep the SIM card out of reach of small children.

Installing the 4G LTE SIM Card

The SIM card must remain in the device when in use.

Important!: Turn the device off before installing or removing the SIM card. To turn the device off, press and hold the Power/Lock Key.

- Open the SIM card slot and carefully insert the 4G LTE SIM Card into the slot, with the Verizon Wireless logo facing up.
- 2. Push the SIM card in gently until it clicks into place.

Warning!: Do not insert a microSD or other memory card into the SIM card slot.



Removing the 4G LTE SIM Card

Important!: Turn the device off before installing or removing the SIM card. To turn the device off, press and hold the Power/Lock Key.

- Open the SIM card slot and gently push the 4G LTE SIM Card inward to release it.
- Carefully slide the 4G LTE SIM Card out of the slot.



Battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-lon battery. A Wall/USB Charger (Charging Head and USB cable) are included with the device, for charging the battery.

Note: The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your device for the first time. A fully discharged battery requires up to 4 hours of charge time.

After the first charge, you can use the device while charging.

Warning!: Use only approved charging devices. Approved accessories are designed to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

Battery Indicator

The battery icon in the System Bar shows battery power level.

Before the battery becomes too low to operate, the empty battery icon will flash and a tone will sound. If you continue to operate the device without charging, the device will shut down.

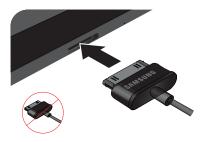
Charging the Battery

Your device comes with a Wall/USB Charger (Charging Head and USB cable) to charge your device from any 110/220 VAC outlet.

Note: The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your device for the first time. A fully discharged battery requires up to 4 hours of charge time.

After the first charge, you can use the device while charging.

1. Insert the USB cable into the port.



Connect the USB cable to the charging head.



- 3. Plug the charging head into a standard AC power outlet.
- When charging is complete, unplug the charging head from the power outlet and remove the USB cable from the device.

Turning Your Device On and Off

Turning Your Device On

Press and hold the bear Power/Lock Key. While powering on, the device connects with the network, then displays the Home screen and active alerts.



Turning Your Device Off

- 1. Press and hold the \odot Power/Lock Key.
- 2. Follow the prompts to confirm the shut-down.

Prepaid Month to Month Data Plans for Tablets

Verizon Wireless now offers month to month, pay as you go 4G LTE Mobile Broadband service that puts you in charge of your Internet access on your tablet. Your Google Account

Your new device uses your Google account to fully utilize its Android features, including Gmail, Google Talk and Android Market.

When you turn on your device for the first time, follow the prompts to set up a connection with your existing Google account, or create a new Google account.

To create a Google account, or set up your Google account on your device at any time, use Accounts and sync settings. For more information, see "Accounts and sync" on page 86.

Roaming

When you travel outside your home network's coverage area, your device can roam to acquire service on other compatible digital networks. When Roaming is active, the Roaming icon appears in the System bar of the display.

Tip: You can set your device's roaming behavior. For more information, see *"Mobile networks"* on page 75.

During roaming, some services may not be available. Depending on your coverage area and service plan, extra charges may apply when accessing data networks. Contact Verizon Wireless for more information about your coverage area and service plan.

Securing Your Device

Use your device's screen lock features to secure your device.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

Locking the Device

- By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out.
 - or –

Lock the device by pressing the $\, \Phi \,$ Power/Lock Kev.

Unlocking the Device

Unlock the device using the default unlock, or for increased security, set and use a personal screen lock PIN, password, or pattern.

Press the 6 Power/Lock Key, then touch and drag the 6 lock icon out of the circle.

- SIM Card Slot: Install the 4G LTE SIM card, for 4G LTE service.
- 2. 3.5mm Headset Jack: Plug in an optional equipment.
- 3. Speaker: Play alert tones, music, audio, and other sounds.
- 4. Power/Lock Key: Press and hold to turn the device on or off, or to access Silent mode, Airplane mode, or Restart your device when the device is turned on. Press to lock the device, or to wake the screen for unlocking.
- Volume Key: From the Home screen, press to adjust Master Volume. During playback, press to adjust volume. Press to mute an alert notification.
- 6. Widescreen HD Display: View device UI and media.
- USB Power/Accessory Port: Connect a USB cable for charging or to sync music and files.
- 2 Megapixel Front Camera: Use when taking pictures and recording video.
- Speaker: Play alert tones, music, audio, and other sounds.
- 3 Megapixel Camera Lens: Used when taking photos or recording videos.
- 11. Camera Flash: Used when taking photos.

Home Screen

The Home screen is the starting point for using your device.



Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this User Manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.

All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary, depending on the software version of your device and any changes to the device's Settings.

Display settings

You can customize display settings to your preferences. For more information, see "Screen" on page 77.

- Action Bar: Always available at the top of the screen.
 Changes to provide options, navigation, and other items related to the current application or screen.
- Shortcuts: Shortcuts to common applications. For more information, see "App Shortcuts" on page 20.
- System Bar: Always present at the bottom of the screen, to show notifications, system status, and soft navigation buttons.

Navigation

Warning!: Please note that a touch screen responds best to a light touch from the pad of your finger. Using excessive force or a metallic object when pressing on the touch screen may damage the tempered glass surface and void the warranty. For more information, see "Warranty Information" on page 114.

Touch

Touch items to select or launch them. For example:

- Touch the on screen keyboard to enter characters or text.
- . Touch an item to select it.
- Touch an application's icon to launch the application.

Touch and Hold

Activate onscreen items by a touch and hold gesture. For example:

- Touch and hold a widget or app icon on the Home screen to move it.
- Touch and hold on a field to display a pop-up menu of options.

Flick or drag

Flick or slide your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen. For example:

- · Unlocking the screen
- · Scrolling the Home screen or a menu

Pinch

Using two fingers, make a pinch motion on the screen. For example:

- · Pinch in to zoom in on pictures or screens.
- Pinch out to zoom out on pictures or screens.

Extended Home Screen

The Home screen consists of the Home panel, plus 4 panels that extend beyond the display width to provide more space for adding shortcuts, widgets and folders.

Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to scroll to the left or right side panels. As you scroll, outlines on the right and left of the screen show whether another screen is available.



Customizing the Home Screen

You can customize the Home screen to include your favorite widgets, shortcuts to applications, wallpaper and more.

- 1. Navigate to the Home screen you want to customize.
- Touch Customize in the Action Bar at the top right of the screen.
 - or –

Touch and hold on the screen.

- 3. Touch a category of items:
 - Widgets: Add widgets to the screen. For more information, see "Widgets" on page 18.
 - App shortcuts: Place a shortcut to an application. For more information, see "App Shortcuts" on page 20.
 - Wallpapers: Choose an image from Gallery, or select pre-loaded still or live wallpapers. For more information, see "Wallpapers" on page 21.
 - More: Add shortcuts to specific types of content, such as Browser bookmarks, shortcuts to directions in Maps, a music playlist, or a specific setting. For more information, see "More" on page 21.
- Touch an item to place it on the current panel, or touch and hold to drag it to a different panel.

Action Bar

The Action Bar is always available at the top of the screen, and updates automatically to provide access to options, navigation, and other items related to the current application or screen.

Google Search

Touch \mathbb{Q} Google to enter criteria to search the web or your device.

Touch Ψ to speak your search criteria.

Apps

Touch Apps to open the Apps screen to launch applications.

Customize

Touch — Customize to configure the current screen to your preferences.

Menu

In some cases, a context-sensitive **Menu** is available at the right side of the Action bar. Touch **Menu** to display options for the current screen or feature

System Bar

The System Bar offers navigation tools, plus information about your device's current status.

Home

Back

Touch **Back** to return to the previous screen, option or step.

Recent apps

Touch Recent Apps to display apps you recently launched. From Recent Apps, touch an app to return to it. Touch and hold Recent apps to go to Apps.

Screen capture

Touch **Screen Capture** to take a picture of the current screen.

Screen captures are saved as images to the ScreenCapture folder in device memory. You can access them from Clipboard, in Gallery, with My files, or other graphics apps.

Open and Close

Depending on the screen you're on, you can touch **Open** or **Close** to move between screens.

Mini App Tray

The Mini App Tray is available from the Status Bar, and offers shortcuts to useful apps, such as Calendar, Task manager, or Calculator, that you can launch at any time from any screen.



- From any screen, tap ____ in the middle of the System Bar to open the Mini App Tray.
- 2. Touch an icon to launch the app.
- Touch at the left of the System Bar to close the Mini App Tray.

Notifications and Status Details

The right side of the System Bar contains icons that tell you about messages and device status. Touch an icon to display Status details for more information.

Notifications appear in the right side of the System Bar.

From any screen, touch a notification icon to display more information.

Status Details

The Status details area of the System Bar contains icons that tell you about messages and device status. Touch Status details to display more information.

Touch items to open them, or touch ${\bf X}\,$ to dismiss the notification.



Quick panel

The Quick panel displays current date and time, battery status, Wi-Fi status and notifications. Touch Status details in the System bar to launch Quick panel.

Slide your finger left and right across Quick settings to find available settings. For more information, see "Quick Settings" on page 68.

From Quick panel, touch Settings to access all settings. For more information on all the Settings available on your device, see "Settings" on page 68.



Status & notification icons

The right side of the System bar shows the current time and icons to indicate system status, including these common icons.

- Battery Level: Shown fully charged.
- Charging Indicator: Battery is charging.
- **Device Power Critical:** Charge immediately. If not charged, device will shut down.
- USB Charging Indicator: Connected to PC via USB cable.
 When connected to a PC, the battery only charges when the device is turned off
- **USB Connected**: Connected to a PC using a USB cable.
- Updates Available: Updates to the applications you have downloaded are available.
- Airplane Mode: Airplane Mode is enabled. You can use many of your device's features, but cannot access online information.
- New Gmail Message: You have new Gmail. Touch the icon for additional information.



Configure input methods: When the keyboard is displayed, touch for a menu of quick keyboard settings.



Bluetooth Active: Bluetooth is turned on.



Music Player: A song is playing. Touch the Music icon or Status details to see the song title and controls.



Wi-Fi Active: Wi-Fi is connected, active, and communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Searching for GPS: Device is searching for a GPS signal.

Widgets

Place widgets on the Home screen for quick access to your favorites.

Adding Widgets to the Home screen

- Navigate to the Home screen where you want to place the widget.
- Touch and hold on the screen.

- or -

Touch Customize in the Application bar.

- Touch Widgets to display available widgets. Scroll the widgets by sweeping your finger right and left.
- Touch a widget to add it to the selected Home screen

- or -

Touch and hold on a widget, then drag it to any Home screen.

Removing Widgets

► Touch and hold the widget until Remove appears at the upper right corner of the screen, then drag the Widget to the Remove icon.

Widgets

Available widgets include:

- AccuWeather.com: View weather information. Touch the widget to set locations.
- Agenda: Display upcoming events, and create new events for your Calendar, from the Home screen.
- Analog clock: Display an analog clock. Touch the widget to view alarms or add a new alarm. The alarms you set in the widget are also available in the Clock app.
- . Bookmark: Link directly to a bookmarked web page.
- Bookmarks: Display bookmarks to web pages.
- Books: Link to your Google Books.
- Buddies now: Link to a contact from your accounts.
- Calendar: Display a calendar. For more information, see "Calendar" on page 61.
- Contact: Link to a contact, to view information, send a message, or locate them on a map.
- Digital clock: Display the time in digital format.
- Dual clock: Display the time in two time zones.
- Email: Access Email accounts set up on the device. If you have more than one account set up, all inboxes display. For more information, see "Email" on page 35.
- Gmail: Access Gmail, Google's web-based email. For more information, see "Gmail" on page 37.

- Google Search: Display a Google Search bar, for searching on the Home screen.
- Latitude: Locate your friends on a map, and share or hide your location.
- Market: Download and manage applications from the Android Market.
 For more information, see "Market" on page 62.
- . Month: Show a month-view of a calendar.
- Music: Control music playback from the Home screen. For more information about playing music on your device, see "Music Player" on page 43.
- Picture frame: Display a photo from Gallery.
- Social Hub: Manage your online activities in one location, including incoming messages and social networking updates, email, syncing contacts, and managing schedules and events.
- The Daily: Get up-to-date news and information.
- Today: Display today's events and other tasks.
- Traffic: Check the traffic conditions for a set destination.
- YouTube: Search YouTube and watch videos.

App Shortcuts

Use App shortcuts to quickly access applications from the Home screen.

Adding Shortcuts from the Home screen

- Navigate to a Home screen.
- 2. Touch and hold on the screen.
 - or −Touch ← Customize in the Application bar.
- Touch App shortcuts to display available shortcuts. Scroll the shortcuts by sweeping your finger right and left.
- Touch a shortcut to add it to the selected Home screen

 or –

Touch and hold on a shortcut, then drag it to a panel.

Adding shortcuts from Apps

- 1. Touch Apps.
- 2. Touch and hold on an app, then drag it to a Home screen.

Removing Shortcuts

► Touch and hold the Shortcut until Remove appears, then drag the Shortcut to the Remove icon.

Wallpapers

Choose a picture to display in the background of the Home screen and Lock screen. You can choose from pre-loaded wallpaper images, or select a picture you've taken with the Camera or downloaded.

- 1. Touch and hold on the Home screen.
 - or –

Touch - **Customize** in the Application bar.

- Touch Wallpapers, then select a source, from Gallery, Live Wallpapers. or Wallpapers.
- Select a screen, from Home screen wallpaper or Lock screen wallpaper.
- Select a photo or wallpaper, then follow the prompts to update the screen.

More

More includes shortcuts to specific items, such as contacts, Browser bookmarks, and directions to a favorite location.

- Touch and hold on the screen.
 - or –

Touch **Customize** in the Application bar.

- Touch More to display available shortcuts. Scroll the shortcuts by sweeping your finger right and left.
- Touch a shortcut to add it to the selected Home screen
 or –

Touch and hold on a shortcut, then drag it to a panel.

Section 3: Contacts and Accounts

Accounts

Your device provides the ability to synchronize information from a variety of accounts, including Google, a Corporate Exchange server, and Email accounts. With synchronization, you can ensure that information on your device is updated with any information that changes in your accounts.

Tip: For more information on setting up your email, visit the Smartphone Resource Center at https://smartphones.verizonwireless.com, click on the Smartphone Support tab and select your device.

Setting Up Your Accounts

Set up and manage your synchronized accounts with the Accounts and sync setting.

For information about setting up email accounts, see "Configuring Email Accounts" on page 35.

Adding an account

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Settings
 Accounts and sync → Add account.
- Touch an account type, then follow the prompts to enter your credentials and sign in.
- The device communicates with the provider's server to set up your account on the device.

Managing accounts

Configure synchronization of account details, such as calendar events and contacts.

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Settings → Accounts and sync.
- Touch an account, to configure settings. Available settings depend on the type of account.

Contacts

Creating Contacts

- From the Home screen, touch Apps →
 Contacts → —
- At the prompt, select an account for saving the contact (options depend on the accounts you have set up).
- Touch contact fields to enter information. While entering information, touch

 to add fields, or

 to delete a field:
 - Touch the blank **Photo** to choose a picture to identify the contact.
 - Enter the contact's name in the Given name and Family name fields, then touch to enter other name-related fields like Middle name, Family name, and Name suffix.
 - Touch **Phone number** to enter a telephone number, then touch **Label** to choose a label.
 - Touch Internet call to enter a username for an internet calling service.
 - Touch Email to enter an email address, then touch ____ Label to choose a label.
 - Touch Instant messenger to enter a username for an IM service, then touch Label to choose a label.

- Touch Groups to assign the contact to a group, then touch a group to add the contact to the group. For more information about using Groups, see "Groups" on page 27.
- Touch Address to enter a physical address, then touch Label to choose a label.
- Touch Company and Title to enter Organization information.
- Touch Add another field to create new fields for the contact, including Phonetic name, Phone number, Email, Instant messanger, Address, Notes, Website, Event, or Nickname.
- **4.** When you finish entering information, touch **Done**.

Updating Contacts

Make changes to update an existing contact.

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- Touch a contact to display it, then touch Menu → Edit.
- Touch contact fields to modify information.
- Touch Add another field to add a new field to the contact record.
- 5. When you finish entering information, touch **Done**.

Contacts Display Options

Choosing contacts to display

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- Touch a tab to choose contacts to display from Contacts, Favorites, or Groups.

Choosing how contacts display

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch Menu → Settings for these options:
 - Touch Only contact with phones to only display contacts with a stored phone number.
 - Touch List by to sort contacts by first or last name.
 - Touch **Display contacts by** to show contacts by first or last name.
 - Touch beside an account to choose contacts to display by account-specific attributes (such as group or starred status).

Joining Contacts

Your device can synchronize contacts with multiple accounts. When you synchronize contacts with your device, you may have multiple contacts for one person. When you join contacts, all the contact's information displays in one Contact record.

Joining also helps you keep contacts updated, because changes in the respective accounts are made automatically when you synchronize with the account.

Joining contacts

- From the Home screen, touch Apps → Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact to display it.
- 3. Touch Menu → Join contact.
- Touch a contact record to join it to the original contact, then follow the prompts to set the primary record for the contact.
- Touch Join to complete the join.

Removing joined contacts

Note: Not all Bluetooth devices will accept contacts, and not all devices support transfers of multiple contacts. Check the target device's documentation.

Send contacts' namecard(s) as vCards via Bluetooth to a Bluetooth device, via Wi-Fi to a Wi-Fi device, or as attachments via Gmail or Email.

- Select contacts by touching individual contacts, or touch Select all to select all contacts for sending, then touch Send.
- 4. Choose a sending method, then follow the prompts.

Groups

Assign contacts to Groups to make searching for contacts faster. For more information about displaying contacts by group, see "Choosing contacts to display" on page 25.

Creating a New Group

Create a new group when you add or edit a contact.

Renaming or Deleting a Group

Section 4: Entering Text

Text Input Methods

- Swype: Swype is a new text input method that allows you to enter words by gliding your finger over the virtual QWERTY keyboard, lifting your finger between words. You can also enable Word prediction, which matches your key touches to common words.
- Android keyboard: Enter text by touching keys on a virtual QWERTY keyboard. Android keyboard includes predictive text, which matches your key touches to common words so you can select a word to insert it into your text.
- Samsung keypad: Enter text by touching keys on a virtual QWERTY keyboard. Samsung keypad includes optional XT9 predictive text, which matches your key touches to common words so you can select a word to insert it into your text.
- Voice input: Use the Voice Input option of any keyboard to speak your entries.

Virtual QWERTY Keyboard

Your device offers virtual QWERTY keyboards for text entry. Use a keyboard to enter letters, punctuation, numbers, and other characters into text entry fields or applications.

Touch any text entry field to display a keyboard at the bottom of the screen. By default, when you rotate the device, the screen updates to display the keyboard at the bottom of the screen.

Choosing the Text Entry Method

You can choose a default entry method in Settings, and choose a method at any time from the System bar.

For information about choosing the default entry method, see "Current input method" on page 91.

To change the entry method while entering text, touch the System bar, then choose a new keyboard, or voice input.

Entering Text Using Swype

Swype is a new way to enter text on touch screens. Instead of touching each key, use your finger to trace over each letter of a word. For each word, place your finger on the first letter and glide to the subsequent letters, lifting on the last letter. Here are a few tips to get you started:

Swype Help

Configuring Swype

Configure Swype options in the Language and input settings. For more information about Swype settings, see "Configure input methods" on page 91.

Some useful settings include:

- Language: You can use Swype in many languages. In Swype settings, touch Language to select languages to use with Swype. To switch to another language while entering text, touch and hold
 then select a language.
- Choosing keyboard size: On the Swype keyboard, touch to change the keyboard from the full width of the screen to a smaller, movable size (touch and hold on the side of the smaller keyboard to move it from side to side).

Entering Symbols and Numbers

Using the Swype Keyboard:

- Touch and hold on a key to enter the character at the top of the key.
- Touch and hold on a key until a menu of all characters available on that key appears, then touch a character to enter it.
- Touch _____ to switch to Symbol mode, then touch a key.

Using the Numeric Keyboard

Switch to a Numeric Keyboard, to quickly enter numbers and mathematical operators.

Editing Keyboard

The Editing Keyboard provides a quick way to move the cursor and highlight text. If the application in which you are working supports editing, you can cut, copy or paste highlighted text.

Swype from the Swype Key to the Sym Key.

Using Swype Speech Recognition

Enter text by speaking. Swype recognizes your speech and enters text for you.

► Touch the Speech Recognition Key. At the Speak now prompt, speak the text you want to enter.

Entering Text Using the Samsung Keypad

The Samsung keypad is a custom virtual QWERTY keyboard, featuring optional XT9 predictive text. Input characters by tapping the on-screen keys with your finger, or use speech recognition.

You can enable XT9 predictive text, to have the Samsung keypad match your key touches to common words and displays them. Select a word from the display to insert it into your text.

- For more matching words, touch ().

Using Clipboard

Attach to attach an item from the Clipboard. Touch an item to insert it into the current field or application.

Entering Text Using the Android Keyboard

The Android Keyboard is a custom virtual QWERTY keyboard. featuring predictive text. Input characters by tapping the onscreen keys with your finger, or use speech recognition.

As you enter characters, predictive text matches your key touches to common words and displays them. Select a word from the display to insert it into your text.

Configuring Android Keyboard

Configure Android keyboard options in the Language and input settings. For more information about Android keyboard settings. see "Configure input methods" on page 91.

Tip: While entering text, you can access settings by touching Android keyboard settings.



Entering Upper and Lower Case Letters

Types of Messages

- Gmail: Send and receive Gmail from your Google account.
- Google Talk: Chat with other Google Talk users.

Send and receive email using popular email services.

Configuring Email Accounts

You can configure Email for most accounts in just a few steps.

Music Player

Music player plays music and other audio files that you copy from your computer.

- Music player searches your device's internal storage for music and playlists, then displays your music. Browse music by touching songs, albums, and playlists. Touch a song or playlist to begin playback. Use the tabs on the left side of the screen to change the view of your music library.

 - Favorite: Touch the star \checkmark to mark the current song as a favorite
 - Info: Touch to view information about the current song.

- **Volume**: Touch to activate on-screen volume control, then touch and drag on the scale to set volume. You can also press the Volume Key on the side of the device to adjust playback volume.
- 5.1 Channel Mode: Touch to enable stereo sound.
- Progress Bar: Touch and drag the end of the progress bar to scan forward or backward through the current song.
- Shuffle: When enabled, songs play in random order. When disabled, songs play in the order they appear in List view.
- Playback controls:

repeat mode.

- Touch | to advance to the next song. Touch and hold | to scan forward through the current song.
- Touch do to go back to the previous song. Touch and hold do to scan backward through the current song.
- Touch to pause playback. Touch to resume playback.
- Touch to repeat the current song, repeat all songs, or disable
- Touch to set the shuffle mode to random order, or in the order they appear in List view.

Tip: If you switch to another application while playing music, touch in the System bar to display playback controls.

 picture's orientation with Rotate Left or Rotate Right, edit the
 picture using Crop, Set picture as a Contact photo, Lock Screen,
 or Wallpaper, Print or Copy the picture, or adjust Motion settings
 for motion-activated navigation.
 - Touch **Back** to return to the Camera to take more pictures.

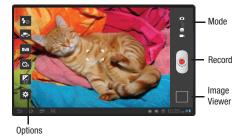

- Timer: Set a timer for how long to wait before taking a photo.
 Options are: Off, 2 sec, 5 sec, and 10 sec.
- Exposure value: Choose a value to set the brightness of the picture.
- Settings
 - Focus mode: Choose a type of automatic focus.
 - Scene mode: Choose a mode to match conditions.
 - White balance: Choose a setting for the light source.
 - Effects: Apply an effect to pictures.
 - Resolution: Choose a size for the image.
 - Metering: Select a method for measuring light.
 - GPS tag: Add GPS location information to photo details.

Camcorder

Use your device's built-in Camcorder to record video.

From the Home screen, touch Apps → Camera, then slide the mode button to Camcorder.

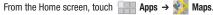

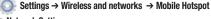

- Touch **Battery Management** to choose a time period to have Mobile Hotspot remain on after you turn it on. If you choose Never Turn-Off, the hotspot remains on until you turn it off.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth profiles

Bluetooth profiles are specifications for services supported by individual devices. Profiles improve the ability of different devices to work together. Your device supports these Bluetooth profiles:

- Serial Port: SPP allows a remote Bluetooth device to act as a virtual serial port.
- Stereo: A2DP, AVRCP, GAVDP, AVCTP and AVDTP support delivery of stereo audio to compatible Bluetooth devices.
- Phonebook Access: PBAP allows sharing of multiple contact name cards with compatible Bluetooth devices.
- Object Exchange: OPP allows sending and receiving of contact name cards (vCard 2.1) and calendar events (vCalendar) between devices.
- Human Interface Devices: HID supports certain interface devices.

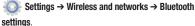

 - Next word prediction: When enabled, the system predicts the next word based on common usage patterns.
 - Auto-substitution: When enabled, XT9 automatically replaces words you enter with words from the XT9 autosubstitution list.
 - Regional correction: When enabled, XT9 automatically changes the spelling of words based on norms for your locale.
 - Recapture: When enabled, XT9 re-displays matching words when you
 make corrections to a word inserted automatically.
 - XT9 my words: Add words to your XT9 predictive text dictionary.
 - XT9 auto-substitution: Manage the list of words XT9 uses for autosubstitution.

- Automatic full stop: Enable for automatic insertion of a "full stop" (period and space to end a sentence) when you tap the space bar twice.

Accessibility

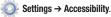

Section 12: Health and Safety Information

This section outlines the safety precautions associated with using your Galaxy Tab. The terms "GALAXY" or "mobile device" are used in this section to refer to your Galaxy Tab. Read this information before using your GALAXY.

Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Signals

Although GALAXY is not a cell phone, it can operate on the same network as cell phones and can use the same Radio Frequency (RF) signals to communicate with the network as a cell phone. Therefore, although the following information refers specifically to RF exposure from wireless phones, it may apply similarly to GALAXY when it is being used on a cell phone network.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has published information for consumers relating to Radio Frequency (RF) exposure from wireless phones. The FDA publication includes the following information:

Do cell phones pose a health hazard?

Many people are concerned that cell phone radiation will cause cancer or other serious health hazards. The weight of scientific evidence has not linked cell phones with any health problems.

Cell phones emit low levels of Radio Frequency (RF) energy. Over the past 15 years, scientists have conducted hundreds of studies looking at the biological effects of the radio frequency energy emitted by cell phones. While some researchers have reported biological changes associated with RF energy, these studies have failed to be replicated. The majority of studies published have failed to show an association between exposure to radio frequency from a cell phone and health problems.

The low levels of RF cell phones emit while in use are in the microwave frequency range. They also emit RF at substantially reduced time intervals when in the stand-by mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects.

The biological effects of radio frequency energy should not be confused with the effects from other types of electromagnetic energy.

Very high levels of electromagnetic energy, such as is found in X-rays and gamma rays, can ionize biological tissues. Ionization is a process where electrons are stripped away from their normal locations in atoms and molecules. It can permanently damage biological tissues including DNA, the genetic material.

The energy levels associated with radio frequency energy, including both radio waves and microwaves, are not great enough to cause ionization of atoms and molecules. Therefore, RF energy is a type of non-ionizing radiation. Other types of non-ionizing radiation include visible light, infrared radiation (heat), and other forms of electromagnetic radiation with relatively low frequencies.

While RF energy does not ionize particles, large amounts can increase body temperatures and cause tissue damage. Two areas of the body, the eyes and the testes, are particularly vulnerable to RF heating because there is relatively little blood flow in them to carry away excess heat.

Research Results to Date: Is there a connection between RF and certain health problems?

The results of most studies conducted to date say no. In addition, attempts to replicate and confirm the few studies that have shown a connection have failed.

The scientific community at large therefore believes that the weight of scientific evidence does not show an association between exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) from cell phones and adverse health outcomes. Still the scientific community has supported additional research to address gaps in knowledge. Some of these studies are described below.

Interphone Study

Interphone is a large international study designed to determine whether cell phones increase the risk of head and neck cancer. A report published in the International Journal of Epidemiology (June, 2010) compared cell phone usage for more than 5,000 people with brain tumors (glioma and meningioma) and a similar number of healthy controls.

Results of this study did NOT show that cell phones caused brain cancer. In this study, most people had no increased risk of brain cancer from using cell phones. For people with the heaviest use of cell phones (an average of more than ½ hour per day, every day, for over 10 years) the study suggested a slight increase in brain cancer. However, the authors determined that biases and errors prevented any conclusions being drawn from this data. Interphone is the largest cell phone study to date, but it did not answer all questions about cell phone safety. Additional research is being conducted around the world, and the FDA continues to monitor developments in this field.

International Cohort Study on Mobile Phone Users (COSMOS)

The COSMOS study aims to conduct long-term health monitoring of a large group of people to determine if there are any health issues linked to long-term exposure to radio frequency energy from cell phone use. The COSMOS study will follow approximately 300,000 adult cell phone users in Europe for 20 to 30 years. Risk of Brain Cancer from Exposure to Radio Frequency Fields in Childhood and Adolescence (MOBI-KIDS)

MOBI-KIDS is an international study investigating the relationship between exposure to radio frequency energy from communication technologies including cell phones and brain cancer in young people. This is an international multi-center study involving 14 European and non-European countries.

Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) Program of the National Cancer Institute

The National Cancer Institute (NCI) actively follows cancer statistics in the United States to detect any change in rates of new cases for brain cancer. If cell phones play a role in risk for brain cancer, rates should go up, because heavy cell phone use has been common for quite some time in the U.S. Between 1987 and 2005, the overall age-adjusted incidence of brain cancer did not increase. Cell Phone Industry Actions

Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, the FDA has urged the cell phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support-needed research on possible biological effects of RF for the type of signal emitted by cell phones;
- Design cell phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user: and
- Cooperate in providing users of cell phones with the current information on cell phone use and human health concerns.

Reducing Exposure: Hands-Free Kits and Other Accessories

Steps to Reduce Exposure to Radio Frequency Energy

If there is a risk from being exposed to Radio Frequency (RF) energy from cell phones — and at this point we do not know that there is — it is probably very small. But, if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your RF exposure.

- · Reduce the amount of time spent using your cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between your head and the cell phone.

Hands-Free Kits

Hands-free kits may include audio or Bluetooth® headsets and various types of body-worn accessories such as belt-clips and holsters. Combinations of these can be used to reduce RF energy absorption from cell phones.

Headsets can substantially reduce exposure because the phone is held away from the head in the user's hand or in approved body-worn accessories. Cell phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet RF exposure compliance requirements when used against the head and against the body.

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that hands-free

kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used for convenience and comfort. They are also required by law in many states if you want to use your phone while driving.

Cell Phone Accessories that Claim to Shield the Head from RF Radiation

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that accessories which claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special phone cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the phone. Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hands-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the phone. The phone may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption.

Children and Cell Phones

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to any users of cell phones from RF exposure, including children and teenagers. The steps adults can take to reduce RF exposure apply to children and teenagers as well.

- Reduce the amount of time spent on the cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between the head and the cell phone.

Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using cell phones at all. For example, The Stewart Report from the United Kingdom made such a recommendation in December 2000. In this report, a group of independent experts noted that no evidence exists that using a cell phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit cell phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) Certification Information

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the exposure limits for Radio Frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government.

These FCC exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations: the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy.

The exposure limit set by the FCC for wireless mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy by the human body expressed in units of watts per kilogram (W/kg). The FCC requires wireless devices to comply with a safety limit of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg).

The FCC SAR limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection to the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the mobile device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile device while operating can be well below the maximum reported value. This is because the mobile device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the mobile device.

Before a new model mobile device is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the SAR limit established by the FCC. Tests for each model mobile device are performed in positions and locations (e.g. at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC.

For typical operations, this mobile device has been tested and meets FCC RF exposure guidelines.

Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines.

You should follow some common sense recommendations when using any portable audio device:

- Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source.
- Set the volume in a quiet environment and select the lowest volume at which you can hear adequately.
- Be aware that you can adapt to higher volume settings over time, not realizing that the higher volume may be harmful to your hearing.
- When using headphones, turn the volume down if you cannot hear the
 people speaking near you or if the person sitting next to you can hear
 what you are listening to.
- Do not turn the volume up to block out noisy surroundings. If you choose to listen to your portable device in a noisy environment, use noise-cancelling headphones to block out background environmental noise. By blocking background environment noise, noise cancelling

headphones should allow you to hear the music at lower volumes than when using earbuds.

- Limit the amount of time you listen. As the volume increases, less time is required before you hearing could be affected.
- Avoid using headphones after exposure to extremely loud noises, such as rock concerts, that might cause temporary hearing loss. Temporary hearing loss might cause unsafe volumes to sound normal.
- Do not listen at any volume that causes you discomfort. If you
 experience ringing in your ears, hear muffled speech, or experience
 any temporary hearing difficulty after listening to your portable audio
 device, discontinue use and consult your doctor.

Operating Environment

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area, and always switch your mobile device off whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger. When connecting the mobile device or any accessory to another device, read its user's guide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products.

Using Your Mobile Device Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from Radio Frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless mobile device. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Implantable Medical Devices

A minimum separation of six (6) inches should be maintained between a handheld wireless mobile device and an implantable medical device, such as a pacemaker or implantable cardioverter defibrillator, to avoid potential interference with the device.

Persons who have such devices:

- Should ALWAYS keep the mobile device more than six (6) inches from their implantable medical device when the mobile device is turned ON;
- . Should not carry the mobile device in a breast pocket;
- Should turn the mobile device OFF immediately if there is any reason to suspect that interference is taking place;

Vehicles

What is the procedure for resolving disputes?
