AT GLOBAL HUNGER CONFERENCE

Congratulations to Scecina sophomore **Amori Curiel**! She was one of 10 Indiana delegates to this year's Global Youth Institute hosted by the World Food Prize Foundation in October in Des Moines, Iowa. Amori presented her research on the effects of poor water and sanitation on hunger for people of Togo, a West African country.

Scecina English teacher **Kathryn Wetzel** accompanied Amori to the conference, which is devoted

to world food and hunger issues. Amori was one of Ms. Wetzel's students who presented research at Purdue University last spring. Based upon her presentation, she was chosen as a state delegate and was among more than 200 other high school and college students from 32 states and 10 other countries at the youth institute. It was like a mini United Nations meeting on an issue of global significance. The other countries represented were Brazil, Canada, China, Dominican Republic, Ghana, Kosovo, Mexico, the Netherlands, and the Philippines.

Among Amori's experiences at the Iowa conference:

- Toured a dairy farm to learn about current agriculture practices.
- Participated in a "Hunger

Banquet," with students playing different socio-economic roles and experiencing the differences in food security between classes.

- Attended the Borlaug Dialogue, where 1,500 international experts and policy leaders from 65 countries addressed cutting-edge challenges in food security and international development.
- Heard from keynote speaker Catherine Bertini, the 2003 World Food Prize laureate who was Executive Director of the United Nations World Food Program from 1992 to 2002.
- Watched as the 2018 World Food Prize was awarded to Dr. Lawrence Haddad and Dr. David Nabarro. The prize is considered the "Nobel Prize for food and agriculture."

"The best thing about the experience was the amount of knowledge I gained and the people I was able to interact with," Amori said. ■

ANOTHER 'A' FOR SCECINA

Scecina once again has earned an "A" rating from the Indiana Department of Education.

Scecina's "A" rating for the 2017-18 school year was based on three criteria: 1) student performance as a percentage who pass English and math assessments, 2) individual student growth based on catching up, keeping up, and moving up in English and math assessments, and 3) the percentage of 12th-graders who graduate from high school and have taken steps to be college- and career-ready.

"Scecina is proud of its 'A' rating from the Indiana Department of Education," said Principal **Joe Brettnacher**, Ph.D. "Our rating is a tribute to how

hard our students worked. The accomplishment is the result of the high expectations our faculty, staff, and administration set for our students and themselves. The 'A' rating was a community effort."

"Scecina has been preparing young people for college and life since 1953," said Scecina President **Joe Therber**.

"We're very proud and grateful this tradition continues with yet another 'A' rating from the State of Indiana. Our community commits every day to the highest possible levels of academic progress to prepare our diverse group of students for future success." ■

GREAT TEACHING AND LEARNING

Scecina teachers make a difference every day in the lives of students.

Scecina's TV production classes, taught by **Chad Tuley**, can lead students in many directions: sports or news broadcaster, YouTube phenom or filmmaker.

For example, senior **Isaac Foley** started off making YouTube videos. "I taught myself how to edit, and once I started producing videos, I fell in love," he said.

He's deepened his love for and expertise in video through three years of media classes and working on the daily student-produced "Red and Gold Show."

This year, he takes TV Production, Yearbook and Advanced TV Production, a dual-credit class that gives students college credit. Isaac plans to get the college credit and pursue a telecommunications degree and a news editing career.

"Isaac is really dedicated to media," said Mr. Tuley, in his 13th year at Scecina. "Some students find a niche in high school. Isaac has made media part of his identity here at Scecina."

The other media classes are Journalism, Speech, Creative Writing, and Etymology. Media classes offer a hands-on, fast-

paced multimedia environment where students can apply their skills in various projects. The classes aren't only for students who want to pursue journalism, broadcasting or film as a career. They're also good for any student wishing to learn how to communicate well and how to tell good stories, said Mr. Tuley, who has a bachelor's degree in English teaching, a minor in journalism and a master's in sports journalism.

Students in the Advanced TV production hear from guest speakers, take field trips to local news stations, and work on creative projects as well as news stories. This year **Rich Nye**, a sportcaster and reporter for WTHR-Channel 13, and former Indianapolis TV reporter **Leslie Olsen**, now with The Children's Museum, have visited.

Under Mr. Tuley, the program has grown each year. "We started the TV production program with one class in 2008. We now have three classes that work in a more advanced multimedia lab," he said. ■

AMY FIX

As chair of Scecina's World Languages Department, **Amy Fix** took on a new challenge this year: teaching English as a New Language.

"Teaching ENL has opened my eyes to something else I really enjoy," said Mrs. Fix, who also teaches Spanish 3. "Teaching kids is more important to me than the course I teach. Spanish and ENL are just avenues!"

"I love the students and our school's diversity," she said. "I also love being able to share my faith and pray with my students and colleagues. I love working with this incredibly gifted and dedicated faculty and staff."

Mrs. Fix has been a teacher for 18 years, including four at Scecina. She majored in journalism and Spanish at Butler University and went into advertising before teaching.

"When I really started examining my life and what I wanted to do, I realized that I wanted to serve and I wanted to work with kids," she said.

"I couldn't imagine teaching anything else besides Spanish. I saw value in learning that language, I loved that culture, and I was good at it. It was the perfect fit for me."

As a college preparatory high school, Scecina requires students to take two years of foreign language. Academic Honors students must take three years of one language or two years of one language and two of another.

Senior **Tavon Middlebrook**, a Spanish 3 student, uses his Spanish to talk to a neighbor who is from Mexico. Taking Spanish has improved his English vocabulary and grammar as well.

"Taking a language makes both sides of the brain work, which actually makes a person higher-functioning and smarter," said Mrs. Fix. "It opens students' eyes to other cultures and ways of thinking, and open minds make for more servant-hearted and compassionate citizens of the world."

Tavon also takes Honors English, Yearbook, Advanced Placement Government and Politics, and two dual-credit business classes, Accounting 1 and Advanced Business Management. He was the football team's Mental Attitude Award recipient this season.

Mrs. Fix, said Tavon, "genuinely tries to help everybody and really cares about students, but if you don't do something right, she's going to tell you!" ■

JEFF GETTY

After graduating from high school, **Jeff Getty** didn't go straight to college but instead enlisted in the Marines. It was 2003, the post-9/11 era.

Now at Scecina for four years, he's found his passion: teaching high school. He finds a connection with teenagers like junior **Ingrid Ruiz**, and he also brings his military experience to his teaching in varied ways.

Mr. Getty, who majored in history at IUPUI, teaches Government, Psychology, Sociology, Advanced Placement (AP) Psychology, AP U.S. History, and Developmental Skills. His favorite is AP Psychology because of his connection through his own combat-related struggles and triumphs.

"I bring in personal stories from my time in the Marines that interest and engage the kids," he said. "I have personal stories about everything from depth perception and night vision goggles to adrenaline rushes during a combat mission to dealing with issues like depression and anxiety. I just hope the kids get something out of hearing my personal stories, which are all connected to the textbook we are using."

Mr. Getty says he watched 9/11 events from his sophomore social studies class. "That experience made me very angry, but very proud that we could pull through something that terrible as a country," said Mr. Getty.

His military experience took him from Indianapolis to California, to Japan and then to combat in Iraq. After Iraq, he became an Urban Warfare instructor for reservist

Marines and military personnel from other countries, teaching them what to expect and how to operate in cities throughout Iraq.

Back in the U.S., Mr. Getty says he dealt with the issues common in combat veterans: post-traumatic stress syndrome, depression, and anxiety. That spurred his interest in psychology, a subject he now teaches.

Mr. Getty now is married to **Aimee** and they have a 1-year-old son, **Solly**. And he loves coming to work each day as a teacher, where he inspires students like Ingrid, a junior who went to St. Philip Neri Catholic School. Ingrid takes four Advanced Placement (AP) classes, including AP Psychology and AP U.S. History from Mr. Getty.

Scecina offers several AP classes. Good AP scores show colleges that a student is ready to succeed at college-level work and can even earn them college credits. Earning college credits in high school can save money on college tuition.

Scecina's counselors suggested Ingrid take the AP classes. "At first, I really didn't know much about it," Ingrid said. "Now I know it was a really good decision." ■



9/11 MASS REFLECTS HEALING AND HOPE

The three numbers 9/11 probably carry huge meaning to you. We remember where and with whom we were on the morning of September 11, 2001. We remember the shock, the sadness, the anger. Historically, hundreds of Scecina alumni and parents of Scecina students have chosen public safety for their line of work. As time marches on, I have grown in understanding and thankfulness for the oath that our public safety professionals and members of the military services take to protect and defend.

9/11. A tragic day. A day that has given rise to community from the ashes. In the inspiring footsteps of Father Thomas Scecina, let us all do everything that we can for one another and then “give that little extra.” ■

LATINO ENROLLMENT INSTITUTE

National data suggest Latinos are both the fastest-growing segment of the U.S. Catholic Church and the most underserved by Catholic schools, according to the University of Notre Dame. At Sccecina, Latino and Hispanic enrollment has increased to 30 percent of the total student population for 2018-19. How do we welcome these Latino students and their families?

To find some answers, three people from Sccecina attended the seventh annual Latino Enrollment Institute conference at Notre

Dame. Notre Dame's Alliance for Catholic Education (ACE) operates the Latino Enrollment Institute.

President **Joe Therber**, Director of Enrollment Management **Miriam Medina**, and Tuition Assistant and Latino Contact **Ivette Clinger** attended the summer session.

The summer conference helped more than 190 school leaders "learn strategies to create culturally-responsive classrooms, events, and policies, to support English language learners, to recruit and retain new students, and to fortify the school's long-term financial stability." During the school year, participants complete online discussion modules and receive support from a mentor principal at another school.

Ms. Medina and Mrs. Clinger, who are native Spanish speakers, regularly assist Sccecina's Spanish-speaking families in navigating school processes. Sccecina is a pilot school for the Latino Outreach Initiative of the Archdiocese of Indianapolis and also has started a Madrinas Model program to reach out to Hispanic and Latino families. ■

MADRINAS AND PADRINOS

A group of parents are at work at Sccecina helping to recruit and retain Latino and Hispanic families. These "madrinas" and "padrinos" are Spanish-speaking parents of current students who will reach out to similar families.

"Madrinas" is Spanish for "godmothers." Sccecina's group also includes some men who are "padrinos," or "godfathers."

The program is based on the "Madrinas Model" from the University of Notre Dame's Alliance for Catholic Education. It's

an outreach program designed to increase Latino enrollment.

Sccecina has eight madrinas and three padrinos who meet monthly: **Ana Curiel**, **Gris** and **Juan Gomez**, **Sonia Torres**, **Erica Patino**, **Jaime Sanchez**, **Yadira**

Rodriguez, **Quenia Rodriguez**, **Elizabeth Gonzalez**, **Marla Rubalcava**, and **Josh Smith**.

With the help of Director of Enrollment Management **Miriam Medina** and **Ivette Clinger**, tuition assistant and Latino contact, some madrinas created the Day of the Dead display in the rotunda. They also helped in October at the 2018 Open House, where they had a display and where padrino **Juan Sanchez**, parent of sophomore **Juan Sanchez**, gave a testimonial to prospective families. Madrinas and padrinos also have been making phone calls to eighth-grade parents who speak Spanish. ■

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



Dear Scecina Community,

A new initiative at Scecina aims to help our students excel spiritually,

intellectually, physically, and socially by giving them personal attention from a staff member. This initiative is called the Staff Student Advocacy (SSA) program.

Faculty and staff often are advocates for students. However, our new initiative will assign students to staff to help support teachers' efforts in the classroom and parents at home.

In this beginning stage, Scecina's Staff Student Advocates are responsible for providing guidance and advocacy to students most in need of assistance based on grades, attendance, and other criteria. We want to help our students live up to their potential by achieving spiritual and academic success, and good attendance and behavioral habits. We also want to prepare each student for the next grade level and make sure they are well-prepared for college and careers when they graduate from Scecina.

Eventually, every student at Scecina will have an advocate.

Each staff member who wants to participate will develop relationships with at least five students. We want every student to know and feel comfortable to discuss his or her needs with at least one member of our staff.

Some of the responsibilities of Staff Student Advocates are:

1. Gather data (grades, attendance, behavior, etc.) and track the progress of each student.
2. Be available to students and provide them with a safe place.
3. Meet with the students weekly.
4. Talk to and listen to each student individually.
5. Discuss with each student his or her progress.
6. When needed, communicate accurately and in a timely manner with a student's teacher and parents.
7. Help students build relationships inside and outside of the classroom.
8. Keep accurate records of their meetings.

Again, our goal is to help each student succeed. You remain in my thoughts and prayers.

BETWEEN A ROCK AND A HARD PLACE

Students from science teacher **Dee Anne Sinclair**'s Advance College Project (ACP) Geology class were immersed in the state's geological formations at Indiana's Turkey Run State Park. Scecina also offers ACP Chemistry. ACP is a partnership between Indiana University and select high schools. IU courses taught through the ACP program provide both high school and college credits and allow students to fulfill high school graduation requirements as well as start building their college careers. IU courses are taught during the regular school day by certified high school teachers who hold adjunct lecturer status through IU. ■



SCECINA SERVES OTHERS

On Sept. 19, Scecina students and staff spent the day performing acts of service together for their community. Groups from Scecina traveled to 13 sites. At A Caring Place, an Archdiocese of Indianapolis day program for older adults, students cleaned, socialized with participants and did some garden work. At the Benedict Inn (Our Lady of Grace Monastery), they mulched around trees, removed invasive plants and transplanted plants. They visited Catholic schools and parishes: Holy Cross, Holy Spirit, Our Lady of Lourdes, St. Lawrence and St. Michael. They also helped at the St. Vincent de Paul distribution center and the food pantry. The other sites were: Christian Park Community Center, Habitat Restore, and Irish Fest cleanup. ■

PREVENTION MATTERS

Scecina and Holy Spirit, Little Flower and Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic grade schools received a \$85,890 grant from the Richard M. Fairbanks Foundation for drug prevention programs. In September, she spoke to students and teachers at Scecina and to grade-school students at Our Lady of Lourdes, Holy Spirit and Little Flower. Scecina and the Catholic grade schools are adopting Ms. Blanco's anti-bullying curriculum, "It's Not Just Joking Around."

"If any place should be intuitive to the human heart, it should be Catholic schools," she said. ■

SEASON RECAP

CROSS COUNTRY

With just five girls and seven boys, the cross country team improved every day. Led by senior captain **Josie DeFreese** and 2017 Semi-State qualifier **Jacob Sitzman '21**, the runners pushed themselves daily throughout 90-plus-degree summer heat.

At the city meet on Sept. 29, Sitzman earned All-City Honors. DeFreese and Sitzman both earned All-Conference honors at the Indiana Crossroads Conference meet.

At the New Palestine Sectional, Sitzman, DeFreese, **Abby Page '20** and **Liam Rolfson '21** qualified for the Regional round. In the Regionals, DeFreese and Sitzman qualified for Semi-State, where Sitzman finished 124th of 178 with a time of 17:41.8 (2:37.4 off the lead). DeFreese finished 152nd with a time of 22:18.8 (4:47.2 off the lead). ■

BOYS SOCCER

The team had lost a number of key contributors from the 2017 Regional qualifying team, but senior **Jonathan Tinoco** was returning with a chance to break the school's all-time goals record.

Tinoco and fellow senior captains **JR Fulmore** and **Nate Bowman** led the Crusaders into the opening game against ICC foe Lutheran. For much of the game, the season opener looked in doubt until Tinoco made a goal from well outside the box. After the scoreless overtime period, the game went to penalty kicks and sophomore goalkeeper **Garrett Nolan** made several tremendous saves as the Crusaders escaped with the win. The boys then won four of their next five games.

During the fifth game, against Monrovia, players from past Crusader teams were celebrated, including all-time scoring leader **Diego Lemus '06**. A week later, in a match against Park Tudor, Tinoco scored his 87th career goal, becoming the new all-time scoring leader. Tinoco finished his Sccecina career with 100 goals.

In the first game of the Hamilton Heights Invite, Sccecina handled Tipton with ease, 5-0. In the championship, Sccecina faced the host Huskies. The Crusaders won 3-1 to bring home the trophy. In the first round of Sectionals, Sccecina faced Indianapolis Washington. After a hard-fought overtime in a 1-1 tie, the game went to penalty kicks. With another great performance by Nolan, the Crusaders outshot Washington. In the Sectional Semi-Final against Christel House Academy, the Crusaders found themselves back in penalty kicks after playing to a 3-3 tie. Unfortunately, the ball bounced the other way, and the Golden Eagles won.

The boys finished the season 11-6 (3-3 ICC). Tinoco earned All-City and All-ICC honors and was named to the NSCA All-District Team. Junior **William Curiel** also earned All-ICC Honors. ■

FOOTBALL

Led by senior captains **Mac Ayres**, **Matthew Funk**, and **Patrick Lyons**, the Crusaders set out to defend their back-to-back Indiana Crossroads Conference Championships and make a run in the state tournament. The Crusaders began the year with wins over Shenandoah, Speedway, Park Tudor, and Beech Grove.

The Crusaders then traveled to the Southside for a showdown with the Roncalli Rebels. On the first series of the game, the Rebels were faced with a 4th-and-1, where they handed the ball off to their running back. The Crusaders' **TyiShaun Woods '20** burst through the Rebel line and dropped their man for a three-yard loss. On the second play after a turnover on downs, City Offensive Player of the Year Mac Ayres hit **Armahn Hillman '21** for a 51-yard touchdown pass. The game continued back and forth until the Rebels took a 38-21 lead with 5:48 left in the game. The Crusaders continued to fight, making the final outcome 38-28.

The Crusaders bounced back from the Roncalli defeat to win their remaining games against Lutheran, Triton Central, Ritter, and Monrovia. The Crusaders finished the regular



season 8-1 and undefeated in the conference for their third straight ICC championship.

The boys won the first Sectional game against the Centerville Bulldogs, coached by **Kyle Padgett '01**. In the second round, the Crusaders handled Heritage Christian with ease 47-26 behind the running attack of **Tavon Middlebrook '19** and two special teams scores. One of the most memorable drives in Scecina football history came out of the Sectional championship rematch with Triton Central. Trailing 27-30, Scecina got the ball back with 2:05 remaining. On 4th and 10 with the Crusaders' season on the line, Ayres found fellow senior **Andrew Payne** for a 26-yard gain and the biggest first down of the season. Ayres then completed back-to-back passes before hitting All-City and All-Conference receiver **David Baker '20** for a 30-yard touchdown with 1:01 to play. The Tigers then marched down the field and were faced with one final play from the Crusader 20. Baker broke on the ball and deflected it, giving the Crusaders another Sectional championship.

The Regional championship against Western Boone was a stalemate until midway through the second quarter, when Ayres found Hillman for a touchdown. On the ensuing Stars possession, senior DB **Jake Rebein** forced a fumble and junior DB **Ahmir Lloyd** recovered. Time ran out on the Crusaders and the score remained 7-0 at the half. In the second half, WeBo jumped out to a 13-7 lead.

Western Boone defeated Scecina for the Regional crown. ■

TENNIS

The 2018 tennis season was a rebuilding year for the Crusaders. Only two players with varsity experience returned, senior captains **Brendan Schreiber** and **James Hentz**. With the lack of experience, the Crusaders dropped their first four matches before beating ICC rival Lutheran. The Crusaders next went 1-2 in in the Speedway-Beech Grove-Ritter Invitational.

The Crusaders drew Decatur Central in the Sectional semi-finals. The Crusaders battled all the way to the end and came up just short, losing 2-3. Crusaders No. 1 player, Schreiber, advanced to the individual Sectional. Schreiber was the first Crusader to advance to the Individual portion of Sectionals in years. ■

GIRLS SOCCER

Scecina math teacher **Mark Manganaro** took over as the head coach of the girls soccer team.

The season got off to a rough start as the Crusaders lost their first six games. Their first win of the season came against Indianapolis Washington, 7-1. The girls then traveled to ICC foe Triton Central. Coach Manganaro made a drastic switch, moving some key offensive players to defense and utilizing freshman phenom **Madelynn Martin** on the offensive attack. The

switch was key in the girls' 3-2 upset of Triton. The Crusaders then won three of their remaining four regular season games to end the regular season 5-8.

In postseason play, the girls took on fellow ICC member Lutheran in the first round. The girls fought their way to a 7-0 Sectional win. In the Sectional semifinals, the girls ran into host school Park Tudor. The Panthers were too much to handle. The girls finished the season 6-9 with a winning record of 4-3 in the Indiana Crossroads Conference. ■

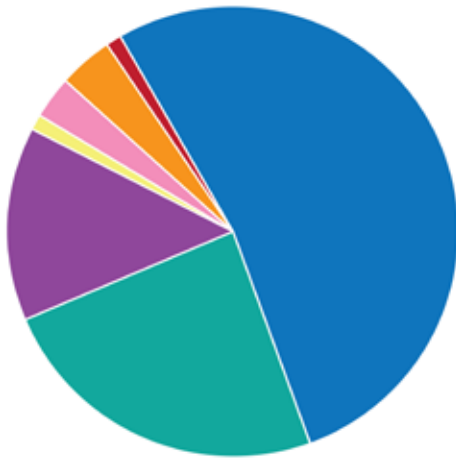

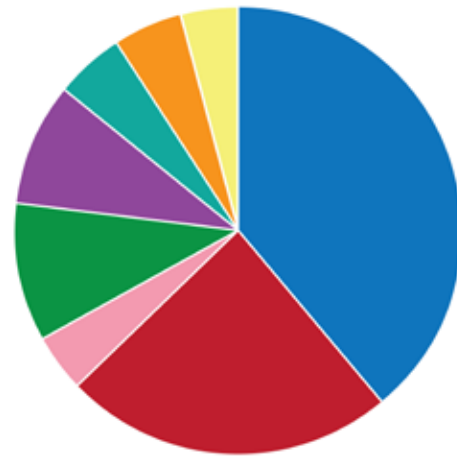

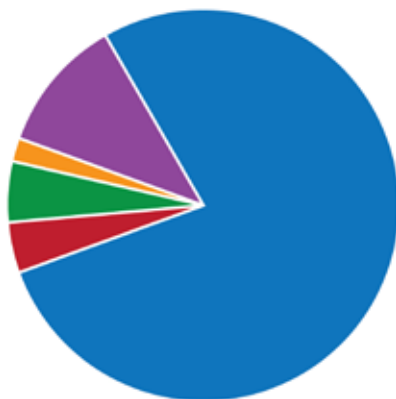

LIVING AS GOOD STEWARDS OF GOD'S GIFTS

If you flew above Scecina and looked down, you would get a glimpse of the latest energy technology.

Situated in the form of a cross atop the Blockhouse are seven solar panels. The panels will provide 3,000 kilowatt hours of power each year for a 100-gallon water heating system. The cross is an obvious sign of the faith that Scecina is built upon.

The Sun Bandit solar system was installed by Johnson-Melloh Mechanical, whose co-founder is 1961 Scecina graduate **Bob Melloh**. The company retrofitted the old system last summer. The system now heats the water for showers and for laundering team uniforms.

"I believe the brightest part of the project was the craftsmanship of the installers," said Scecina Facilities Manager **Dave Smith '76**. "From the solar panels on the roof that are laid out to look like a cross to the plumbing hook-up, the workmanship was first class! Indeed, a very professional install."

Johnson-Melloh has been promoting its Sun Bandit system through videos produced by Beltrame Leffler, the advertising company founded by two Scecina alumni, **Mike Beltrame '67** and **K.C. Leffler '87**.

"Scecina appreciates the commitment to environmental stewardship that Johnson-Melloh and the Melloh family represent," said Scecina President **Joe Therber**. "We are honored to be partners in



this environmental sustainability effort, which also teaches our students to be good stewards of our environment."

Scecina has identified more ways to be good stewards of Earth's resources and of finances.

See the light. The school has been retrofitted with LED lights over the past four years, resulting in a significant reduction in electricity costs, said Smith. The light sensors can sense human movement to turn on or off automatically.

Bins are IN. Goodbye to the old ugly, cardboard barrels for recycling. They were hard to reload for the trip to the outside bin and often mistaken for trash bins. The school now has six green recycling bins in the hallways, with plans to receive 12 more for the end-of-school cleanup. Ray's Trash Service provides the bins for free.

Save the trees. We're reducing paper consumption as a financial and operational component of the 1:1 computer initiative, where students and teachers have their own laptops.

Led by Vice President of Technology and Director of Curriculum **David Dellacca**, this campaign recognizes employees who reduce the amount of paper they are printing. The staff also is alerted as to how many trees it has consumed and how much CO₂ has been produced in printing.

Red and Gold Going Green Club. Scecina's environmental student club aims to promote awareness about recycling. Members created signs for the school recycling bins and are collecting plastic caps to create a recycled plastic bench.

The pope's message. Some science and theology classes have studied **Pope Francis'** second encyclical, *Laudato Si*. The encyclical, subtitled "On care for our common home," addresses good stewardship of the Earth. **Marianne Echelbarger's** students in Advanced Placement Environmental Science (APES) have read parts of the encyclical. "As a Catholic high school, the message from Pope Francis on the environment goes perfectly with the APES curriculum," she said. "He speaks about being good stewards of the Earth and talks about what we are doing to our environment and, in particular, how our actions affect the poor." ■

NEW COACH HEADLINES SBC MEETING

Miller, owner and president of Bowman Construction, has served as president and CEO of the Greater Indianapolis Chamber of Commerce and president and CEO of Develop Indy, a nonprofit economic development organization of the City of Indianapolis and Marion County.

Looking ahead, he noted that central Indiana will continue to focus on life sciences, technology, advanced manufacturing, logistics,

agbiosciences, and energy technology.

Miller hopes to see the SBC grow and become a force on the Eastside and for Scecina. "What you have is unique," said Miller.

Miller landed in a good spot when then-Mayor **Greg Ballard** tapped him for Develop Indy. Miller was just in his 30s and was able to rub elbows with the older guard who had run the city.

Miller knows the ups and downs of business. Just after he started at Develop Indy in 2008, the markets crashed – not a good time to be finding new businesses for the city. He's led two companies to great growth only to be told later, "we're going in a different direction" and having to take his talents elsewhere. But other doors opened for him.

"As bad as things may seem at any given time, God has better plans," he said.

Miller's greatest advice for people who want to succeed in business is to read. "Readers are leaders," said Miller.

Miller's main business at Scecina is basketball.

"These are really good kids," he said. "They work hard, and they respect each other and they're really competitive. . . . I think we've got the structure here to really move the program forward."

HEY HOOSIERS! GET CREDIT FOR GIVING

Do you live in Indiana? Would you like to help a child receive a quality education at Scecina? Would you like to be eligible to take advantage of a 50 percent credit against your individual or corporate state tax liability?

If your answer is YES to all of three questions, you should learn more about the School Scholarship Tax Credit (SSTC).

A tax credit is available for individuals or corporations who donate to a certified scholarship-granting organization (SGO). An SGO is an entity that awards scholarships to eligible students. Last year, 273 students from low-income families attending Scecina received assistance through this program.

Those who have donated to an approved SGO are eligible to take advantage of a 50 percent credit against their individual or corporation state-tax liability.
