
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

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

- Content-Based Instruction
- Student-Centered Classrooms



### **Communicative Language Teaching**



- Language acquisition results from language use
- Learners must be exposed to rich and comprehensible input
- Learners must be given many opportunities to produce language collaboratively
- Emotions and attitudes affect students' ability to learn a language
- Feedback is important both positive and corrective
- Grammar structures should be introduced and taught in context
- The best materials are authentic and teaching methods are context dependent

#### **Content-Based Instruction**



- Language-focused vs Content-focused instruction
- A high quality Citizenship ESL classroom teaches English through naturalization content –Civics, Geography, History, N400, and the Naturalization Process
- 1. Begin with a standard that is necessary for successful naturalization
- 2. Determine what language features or communicative tasks are required to meet that standard
- 3. Create lessons and activities that focus on that particular language

#### **Student-Centered Classrooms**



- Student-centered classrooms put students' needs first
- Students are the focus, not the teacher
- Teachers facilitate student communication
- Learners should do most of the talking
- Teachers employ strategies to allow students to practice in a safe environment

### **Key Principles of Adult Learning**



- Adults are internally motivated and self-directed
- Adults bring life experiences and knowledge to learning experiences
- Adults are goal orientated
- Adults are practical
- Adult learners like to be respected


#### **Brain-Based Learning**



 Brain-based learning utilizes our knowledge of how the brain works to support the organization of information in a way which creates meaningful learning (Gozuyesil & Dikici, 2014).





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

# **Student Onboarding**



#### Why manage enrollment and what to do with waitlists

Managed enrollment provides consistency and additional structure to a curriculum-based course.

Stay engaged with learners on your waitlist. It will improve retention and help learners get a head start.

Engaging learners on your waitlist keeps them motivated . Volunteers and self-study materials can be deployed effectively to sustain interest.

A well planned orientation goes a long way towards setting expectations and easing students into a program.


