LEARN ABOUT Venerable Mary Angeline Teresa

Old age strikes all classes of people, leaving them alone and frightened. The elderly face health issues, the loss of loved ones and friends, and the loss of being able to live on their own. Mother Angeline wanted homes for them to be the best, where the Sisters would treat the elderly with dignity and loving care in a home-like setting.



When she was seven years old, her family moved from Ireland to Scotland.

At the age of 19, she joined the Little Sisters of the Poor in France to take care of the elderly.

In **1926**, Mother Angeline was sent to the US, and was appointed Superior of a home of the Little Sisters of the Poor in the Bronx, New York.

In **1929**, just at the start of The Great Depression, Mother Angeline and six other Sisters withdrew from the Little Sisters of the Poor. They were given permission to begin a new order of Sisters for the care of the aged based on Mother Angeline's ideals – the Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm.

In **2019**, the 90th Anniversary of the Congregation was observed. They are considered pioneers in the field of geriatrics, introducing 'person-centered care' as the standard for caring for the elderly.

"The Difference is Love" is their trademark.

Mother Angeline's idea of caring for the aged was brand new. The homes would include rehab and


> add interesting activities and recreation. Each home would have a Chapel. A resident's personal, social and spiritual needs would be met. Mother Angeline taught that the mission of the Sisters was to bring Christ to every old person under their care.

Today the Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm take care of residents in twenty-two nursing homes, assisted-living homes or independent living

homes in 8 different states and one in Ireland.

Mother Angeline received awards for her new way of caring for the elderly and promoting respect for life in all its stages. For this important "See Christ in every person entrusted to our care."







Venerable Mary Angeline Teresa MAZE



Venerable Mary Angeline Teresa's life took many twists and turns, and included a good deal of traveling. She was born in Ireland in 1893, moved to Scotland with her family at the age of 7. When she was 19 years old, she joined the Little Sisters of the Poor in France. In 1926, she was appointed to a home in the Bronx, NY. In 1929, Mother Angeline founded The Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm. By 1984, the Sisters had served in 59 different facilities in New York State, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, Florida, Illinois, Ohio, District of Columbia, Maryland, New Hampshire, Kentucky, Rhode Island, New Jersey, Iowa, Connecticut, West Virginia, Michigan, Ireland and Scotland.

Venerable Mary Angeline Teresa made an annual trip to each facility every year, until her failing health made it impossible. She would meet with each Sister, visit with the residents, and always thank the staff. Her visits ended with a special Mass of Thanksgiving to God in the Home's chapel for past blessings and to ask for His help for the future. She lived up to her motto: *Res Non Verba* meaning *Deeds not Words*.




FIDELITY TO GOD'S WILL

Venerable Mary Angeline Teresa was ever ready and eager to do God's will. She always encouraged the Sisters to be "faithfully faithful" and said if they were faithful in little things, God would take care of the big things.



Venerable Mary Angeline Teresa taught her Sisters to give the elderly tender and affectionate care. "If you must fail, fail on the side of kindness. Be kinder than kindness itself to the old people." She would say. "I entreat you be kind, be patient, and be always understanding. Begin with yourself."

The Mother Angeline Heritage Center is dedicated to the history of **Venerable Mary Angeline Teresa** and her six companions in founding Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm in 1929.

Works of art in stained glass, sculptures, portrait, archival images and artifacts illustrate the foundation, growth of the Congregation, and their mission and philosophy.

In the Mother Angeline Heritage Center, there is a large stained glass window, which shows the expansiveness of Mother Angeline's accomplishments. The picture of this window is shown to the right. Our Lady of Mt. Carmel is in the center watching over Mother Angeline and her six companions who established The Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm. Mother Angeline entrusted the new Congregation to the protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother and Queen of Mount Carmel and relied on her intercession.

The mountains in the background are a reminder of the setting of the Motherhouse in Germantown NY, where nearby mountains can be seen all year long. The buildings represent both old and new nursing homes the Sisters established in the US and Ireland. The river crossing the top of a grassy plain is a mighty river that started out small and gained size and strength with the passage of time. 


Stained glass window depicting Mother Angeline and the founding Sisters
