JUNE 1/2: "BLESSINGS" MATTHEW 5:1-12

"Blessed are those..." The world we live in has its own idea of what it means to be blessed. Does this idea match up with God's? As we look at the Beatitudes, Jesus shares with us what God's idea of what being blessed looks like.

JUNE 8/9: "HOPE AND PERSEVERANCE" GENESIS 8:6-12

Noah and the Ark is one of the most well-known stories of the Bible today, but how well do we really know the story? There is much more to this story than Noah gathering the animals two by two and God setting a rainbow in the sky. This Biblical story is really not the happy, joyful, heartfelt story we choose to remember.

June 15/16: "God Provides" Mark 6:35-44

The feeding of the 5,000 is the only miracle Jesus performed before the resurrection that is included in all the gospels, so it must be very important. Jesus is teaching us that, through him, we as God's children will never go hungry spiritually. On this Father's Day we look at this perfect example of a father showing unconditional love.

JUNE 22/23: "BE BOLD" 1 SAMUEL 17:41-49

So often we trust in our own strength. Or, just as bad, feel powerless and defeated because we don't have any strength. On this occasion, David articulates a basic principle of faith -- God will act on our behalf when we trust in him and are obedient to his voice. David shows us what happens when we are bold in our faith.

June 29/30: "Stepping out in Faith" Matthew 14:22-32

Jesus will give us water-walking faith and asks us to step out in our faith. No matter what the circumstances are around us, our Lord who created the winds and the seas is right there with us every step of the way.

JULY 6/7: "FREEDOM OF FAITH" DANIEL 6:16-23

Daniel was a great man of faith and prayer. When he had to choose between praying to God or facing death for his beliefs, he was faithful to God. Here in America, we are blessed to have great religious freedom. We are free to pray privately to God at any time and any place. We can thank Jesus that we have this privilege. We can look to Daniel as an example to stand up for our religious freedom, and to be faithful to Jesus at all costs.

July 13/14: "How to Serve" Luke 10:30-37

The Good Samaritan is one of the most well-known parables of Jesus. In this story Jesus gives the word "neighbor" a new meaning: anyone in need. Jesus is telling us when we help others; we are being Christ to them and serving God.



our community.







Volunteer Profile: Dannielle Oestreich

Reaching Out and Giving Back

Dannielle Oestreich joined Sheridan in 2005 because of the wonderful welcome she received. She was a single mother at the time and hadn't felt accepted in her former church. "Everyone was just so friendly, so welcoming. I loved the upbeat services, the way people were laid back...that everybody was doing stuff." After her grandfather's death last summer, Dannielle felt called to serve as he



had. She became a Babies in Christ Mentor last fall, then a Story Reader at the Barnabas Community, accompanied by her 12-year-old daughter McKenzie . "That was only once every three months and we wanted to do more," Dannielle explains, so they began volunteering in the Barnabas Store. In April, Dannielle taught the first "Nutritious Cooking on a Budget" class at the Barnabas Community Center.

Her family now includes husband John, a managing principal with Waddell & Reed, and their son, Tucker, 3. Dannielle works part-time as marketing director for Cornhusker Billiards and also has a personal ministry, Cards for Seniors, leading family and others in crafting handmade Christmas cards for lonely and isolated seniors. Volunteering has helped her to feel more appreciative of what she has, she says: "I like helping people and I think it's important to model service to my children."

Haiti Vacation Bible School – Fet Bondye – Party by the Sea!

Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere where the average life expectancy is only 48 years old. Diseases like malaria, cholera, HIV/ AIDS ravage the population. Children in Haiti live in a culture that still practices child slavery, called 'restavek' in Creole. Many children at the age of 5 or 6 are sold for an average of \$50 US dollars because their family cannot afford to care for them. They are held captive and made to do domestic work without having the chance to attend school. Children are very vulnerable in Haiti, rarely do they get to do something special to

develop faith and a sense of hope. Sheridan, in partnership with The Haitian Timoun Foundation, is working to foster that sense of hope.

Six youth and adults from Sheridan will help lead Fet Bondye, which means "Party by the Sea." Fet Bondye is very similar to our version of Vacation Bible School. Please pray for Alex Bouvier, Raeann Bronder, Alex Henning, Pastor Rhonda Bostrom, Julie Hestermann and Cameron McDaniel as they go to work alongside 35 other Lutheran youth and adults from Georgia and Colorado, as well as Haitian college students. 
