VANDERBILT-MSU NOTES

After stopping a five-game Commodore winning streak last year in Starkville, Mississippi State owns a 11-7-2 overall advantage in the series. The Bulldogs have captured nine of the last 11 games played.

The series has been contested on an infrequent basis. The teams have played just 20 times, making Mississippi State the second least played SEC foe for the Commodores. Only South Carolina, added to the SEC in 1992, has been played with less frequency.

The Commodores are 6-4-2 all-time vs. the Bulldogs in games played on the Vanderbilt campus.

VANDERBILT-MSU TIES

- ★ MSU defensive coach **David Turner** spent four years on the Vanderbilt staff mentoring Commodore defensive linemen. Turner served with Bobby Johnson from 2002-2005. He also held recruiting coordinator responsibilities while a member of Johnson's staff.
- ★ Vanderbilt assistant head coach/offensive line mentor **Robbie Caldwell** and defensive coordinator/secondary coach **Jamie Bryant**both worked one year at North Carolina with Mississippi State defensive coordinator **Carl Torbush**. Caldwell and Bryant were on Torbush's staff when he was the Tar Heel head coach in 2000.
- ★ Vanderbilt freshman defensive end **Walker May** and Bulldog sophomore linebacker **Bo Walters** were prep teammates at Briarwood Christian H.S. near Birmingham, Ala.
- ★ Vanderbilt redshirt senior linebacker **Chris Johnson** will face a pair of former prep teammates at Oak Mountain H.S. south of Birmingham: junior OL Mark **Milichar** and sophomore OL **D.J. Looney**.

NATE CAMPBELL OFF VANDERBILT TEAM

Redshirt junior **Nate Campbell**, a two-year letterwinner at linebacker, has been dismissed from the squad for violating university rules. He is no longer enrolled at Vanderbilt.

Campbell, who left preseason camp as a second team linebacker, did not play in either of the first two games.

Campbell played 25 career games, contributing 16 total tackles.

Mississippi State handed Vanderbilt its first loss of the season, derailing the Commodores 17-14 with a pair of second-half interceptions and a smothering defense.

Vanderbilt, the fourth ranked team to fall to the Bulldogs under Head Coach Sylvester Croom, was looking to go 6-0.

Before the game, the 'Dores led the nation in turnover margin, were second in interceptions and had outscored opponents 58-10 in the second half.

This time, though, it was the Bulldogs who held all the advantages. They rallied from a

7-3 halftime deficit, and held Vanderbilt to 107 yards of total offense.

The Commodore offense directed by Chris Nickson struggled for virtually the entire game. Held to less than 50 total yards through three quarters, Vanderbilt produced its only scoring drive of length early in the fourth quarter after Mackenzi Adams relieved Nickson. The game was sealed by a late MSU interception.

COMMODORE DEFENSE CONTINUES TO IMPRESS

Through two games, the Vanderbilt defense has picked up where it left off last year, posting impressive statistics in the Commodores' 1-1 start.

The unit has limited Western Carolina and LSU to less points, total yards and first downs as in 2008, when it ranked high in several NCAA defensive categories.

The Commodores rank fourth in the SEC in scoring defense, fifth in total defense, sixth in pass efficiency, seventh in rushing defense, fourth in quarterback sacks and fifth in first down allowed.

A comparison of current 2009 stats and the 2008 season figures follows:

At LSU, the defense played extremely well in the second half, allowing the Tigers just 94 total yards after intermission.

In the season opener, the Commodores notched their first shutout of the Bobby Johnson Era, defeating Western Carolina 45-0, holding the Catamounts to just four first downs and 0-13 in third-down attempts.

The defense has been successful limiting points. Only one of the Commodores' last 15 opponents has scored more than LSU's 24-point total – that being eventual national champion Florida (42) in 2008.

TRIO OF DEFENDERS SHINE VS. LSU

Three sophomores – cornerback **Casey Hayward**, linebacker **Chris Marve** and safety **Sean Richardson** – paced the Commodore defensive effort in Baton Rouge.

Hayward, replacing All-America D.J. Moore in the Commodore secondary, and Richardson, a first-year starter at safety, established several individual single-game highs against LSU.

Hayward was nominated for Southeastern Conference Defensive Player of the Week honors after posting 13 total tackles, including eight unassisted stops. It marks the highest tackle total by a Commodore cornerback since Moore contributed 13 tackles against Alabama in 2007.

Hayward's remarkable performance also included four tackles for loss. He entered the game without a tackle for loss.

Marve's 11-tackle performance represented the second highest single-game effort. Marve also forced his third fumble of the season, giving him seven in a 15-game career. Marve tops the SEC and shares the NCAA lead in forced fumbles.

Richardson, hero of the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl hero for recovering a Boston College fumble for a touchdown, finished with 10 total tackles, easily surpassing his previous best of four tackles set in the season-opening win over Western Carolina.

VANDERBILT - WINNING IN SEPTEMBER

Since the 2005 opener, the Commodores are 14-5 in the month of September after the season-opening victory over Western Carolina.

Twice in that span – in 2005 and 2008 – the Commodores have notched a 4-0 September mark.

The loss at LSU last Saturday also snapped the Commodores' seven-game winning streak in the month of September dating back to a 24-10 loss to Alabama on Sept. 8, 2007.

From 2000-04, Vanderbilt was 4-16 in September games.

TWELVE STRAIGHT WEEKS OF FOOTBALL

For the second time in four years, Vanderbilt will play 12 straight Saturdays.

Vanderbilt is the only team in the SEC – and one of nine nationally – without an off week. The last time Vanderbilt played 12 straight weeks came in 2006, when an inexperienced Commodore squad finished 4-8.

COMMODORE NOTES FROM LSU LOSS

★ Uncharacteristic Penalties One of the NCAA's most disciplined teams, Vanderbilt was flagged for more infractions (7-5) and more penalty yards (52-38) than LSU. It was the most penalty yards by the Commodores since the squad was flagged for 80 yards in a 42-14 loss to Florida in Nov. 8, 2008.

The infractions were key factors in LSU's first scoring drive. Two face mask penalties gave the Tigers important first downs on a 9-play, 69-yard drive that gave LSU an early 7-0 lead.

★ **Opportunity Knocks** The Commodore offense could not take advantage of two second half drives into LSU territory that failed to materialize in points.

Vanderbilt drove to the LSU 36 early in the third quarter but missed on a third-down pass attempt deep over the middle. On its next possession, the Commodores drove to the LSU 23, but had a third-down pass deflected by a receiver into the hands of a Tiger defender.

★ Broderick Stewart The fifth-year senior defensive end edged closer to Alan Young's team record for career quarterback sacks with a second quarter stop of LSU's Jordan Jefferson.

Stewart's first sack of the season gives him 17 for his career, 4.5 shy of matching Young's record.

★ **Zac Stacy** Impressive for the second consecutive game, the true freshman back rushed for 89 yards on 20 carries, and caught two passes for 14 yards. He totalled 103 all-purpose yards.

Through two games, Stacy is the SEC's fourth leading rusher with a 111-yard average.

- ★ Patrick Benoist The senior linebacker gave a courageous effort, contributing nine tackles, including two tackles for loss, a QB sack and a fumble recovery. It was his second recovery of the early season.
- ★ **Kennard Reeves** The redshirt junior ran effectively subbing with Stacy, gaining 35 yards on five carries. He also had a 18-yard rush.
- ★ Brent Trice The senior enjoyed his second career start at linebacker by posting a career-high 10 total tackles. Trice's previous high tackle total was four, achieved in two previous games.



COMMODORES HIT WITH INJURIES

Two Commodore starters could be lost for the year after suffering injuries in Vanderbilt's hard-fought loss at LSU last Saturday.

Redshirt sophomore tackle **James Williams**, the only new starter on the Commodore offensive line, is out for the year after suffering a broken left ankle at Baton Rouge. Williams started both early season games at right tackle, allowing Thomas Welch to move to left tackle in his final season.

Senior co-captain **Ryan Hamilton**, who started his 34th consecutive game at safety against LSU, also was injured with a possible chest muscle pull.

The Commodores entered the year without the services of 27-game starter **Steven Stone** (R-Sr., DE), who is not expected back before early October due to a foot injury. Two other players, **Michael Garcia** (R-Jr., LB) and **Jay Fullam** (Fr., safety) are out indefinitely with a pectoral tear and broken hand, respectively.

Prior injuries also ended the careers of two other fifth-year seniors: LB **Brandon Bryant** (leg) and WR **Justin Wheeler** (knee).

TWENTY-SIX 'Dores Enjoy Initial Action

Twenty-six players participated in their first collegiate games in a Commodore uniform during Vanderbilt's victory over Western Carolina and visit to LSU.

Tailback **Zac Stacy** and placekicker **Ryan Fowler** were the only Commodores to receive a starting assignment in their first career appearance.

Besides Stacy and Fowler, other first-time participants were quarterback Jared Funk (R-So.), tailbacks Warren Norman (Fr.) and Jermaine Doster (R-So.), receivers Akeem Dunham (R-Fr.), Collin Ashley (Fr.), Brady Brown (Fr.), Tray Herndon (R-So.) and Jameson Sackey (R-Fr.), offensive linemen Richard Cagle (R-Fr.), Ryan Seymour (R-Fr.) and Caleb Welchans (R-Fr.), defensive tackles Rob Lohr (R-Fr.) and Colt Nichter (R-Fr.), defensive ends Josh Jelesky (R-Fr.) and Johnell Thomas (R-Fr.), linebackers Bo Baggerly (R-Sr.), Archibald Barnes (R-Fr.), Dexter Daniels (R-Fr.), DeAndre Jones (R-Fr.) and Tristan Strong (R-Fr.), defensive backs Eddie Foster (Fr.), Eric Samuels (Fr.) and Trey Wilson (Fr.), and safeties Al Owens (R-Fr.) and Micah Powell (R-Fr.).

NEW RESPONSIBILITIES FOR FOUR COACHES

Four Commodores coaches have new responsibilities this season. Coach Johnson announced the changes last winter.

- ★ Long-time defensive coordinator **Bruce Fowler** has been promoted to assistant head coach in charge of defense.
- ★ Former secondary coach **Jamie Bryant** becomes the new Commodore defensive coordinator.

Fowler and Bryant have been with Johnson at Vanderbilt since he accepted the job prior to the 2002 season.

★ Defensive line coach **Rick Logo** and running backs coach **Des Kitchings** have added duties of co-special teams coordinators.

NINE FIRST-TIME COMMODORE STARTERS

Two Commodore defenders – defensive back **Jamie Graham** and defensive tackle **T.J. Greenstone** – earned their first starting assignments of the season at LSU.

Both started in 2008. though Graham's nine starting assignments last year came on offense.

Nine Commodores also earned their first collegiate starts against Western Carolina, including four on both offense and defense.

The first-time starters against WCU on defense were sophomore cornerback **Casey Hayward**, redshirt sophomore defensive end **Tim Fugger**, sophomore safety **Sean Richardson** and senior linebacker **Brent Trice**.

Tailback **Zac Stacy**, wide receiver **John Cole**, offensive tackle **James Williams** and wide receiver **Udom Umoh** earned their first offensive starts.

Placekicker **Ryan Fowler** also earned a start in his first career appearance.

For Trice, a former safety, the starting assignment came in his 38th career appearance.

SEVEN TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

After playing just three true freshmen in each of the last two years, Bobby Johnson has watched seven first-year Commodores participate against Western Carolina and LSU.

Tailback **Zac Stacy** has been the only true freshman to start. He finished with 133 rushing yards against Western Carolina, the highest single-game total ever by a Vanderbilt freshman running back

Other true freshmen playing against Western Carolina were tailback Warren Norman, receivers Collin Ashley and Brady Brown, and defensive backs Eddie Foster, Eric Samuels and Trey Wilson.

Last year, the only first-year Commodores seeing action were receiver **John Cole**, safety **Sean Richardson** and cornerback **Casey Hayward**. Cole was injured in the 2008 opener at Miami (Ohio) and did not return to action, eventually receiving a redshirt.

SEEKING CONSECUTIVE BOWL APPEARANCES

The Commodores are trying to achieve a first in Vanderbilt gridiron history: making postseason appearances in consecutive years.

In three previous opportunities, the Commodores were unable to return to a bowl. The 1975 squad finished with a winning record (7-4) but did not receive a postseason bid.

The Commodores are also seeking consecutive seasons with winning records for the first time since 1974-75.

In 2008, Vanderbilt registered three victories over ranked foes, accomplishing the feat for the first time in team history. The Commodores beat No. 24 Boston College in the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl, No. 13 Auburn before a College GameDay audience and No. 24 South Carolina before an early-season Thursday night crowd.

STEWART WEARS 'KD1' JERSEY PATCH

Defensive end Broderick Stewart (R-Sr.) became the third Vanderbilt player to wear the "KD1" jersey patch during the opener. The honor is one of the most significant awarded by fellow players.

The patch honors the memory of Kwane Doster, the only Commodore ever to receive the SEC Freshman of the Year Award. Doster was shot and killed in his hometown of Tampa, Fla., on Dec. 26, 2004. It will be displayed on the front of Stewart's No. 90 jersey.

Stewart, from Newnan, Ga., also becomes the first player to earn the patch that did not play with Doster.

The team's Leadership Council votes on the player to wear the "KD1" patch. They recognized Stewart's effort and desire to return from a serious lower leg injury suffered late in the 2008 season.

"They recognize that Broderick has worked extremely hard to get back on the field. They know how productive Broderick is as a player and what he has gone through to return," Coach Johnson said.

Stewart, just five QB sacks shy of the Vanderbilt all-time career record, suffered a season-ending ankle and foot injury early in the 2008 Tennessee game, yet travelled to the finale at Wake Forest and to the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl to support his teammates.

Stewart becomes the third Commodore player to wear the patch. Former All-SEC linebacker Jonathan Goff wore it in the 2006-07 seasons. Tailback Jeff Jennings wore the patch for his senior season.

FIRST COMMODORE SHUTOUT IN A DECADE

Vanderbilt's 45-0 victory over Western Carolina marked the Commodores' first shutout in nearly a decade. The last Vanderbilt shutout was a 58-0 win over The Citadel on Oct. 9, 1999.

It also was Vanderbilt's first shutout win in a season opener since 1985 when the Commodores edged Chattanooga 7-0.

The 45-point margin of victory was the highest by the Commodores in an season opener since Vanderbilt defeated Middle Tennessee 47-0 in 1950.

Bobby Johnson is the first head coach since the mid-1950s to reach an eighth year of service at Vanderbilt.

Only two other coaches in Vanderbilt gridiron history, Dan McGugin and Art Guepe, have served at least eight years as the Commodore head coach. McGugin, a College Football Hall of Famer, served 30 years in a distinguished tenure from 1904-1934. Guepe, who guided Vanderbilt to its first bowl appearance in the 1955 Gator Bowl, served nine years from 1953-1962.

JOHNSON FIFTH IN ALL-TIME WINS

Bobby Johnson ranks fifth all-time in wins among Vanderbilt coaches. Johnson's 28th Commodore victory came in the 2009 opener against Western Carolina. Johnson will tie Ray Morrison (1918, 1935-39) for fourth all-time with his next victory.

Dan McGugin holds the record for wins by a head coach with 197. He ranks among the nation's all-time Top 25 winningest coaches.

Three of the four coaches ahead of Johnson – McGugin, Morrison and Red Sanders – are College Football Hall of Fame members.

Vanderbilt lost its first game this year on the network, dropping a 23-9 decision at LSU on ESPNU.

The loss gives Vanderbilt a 2-2 all-time mark on ESPNU.

Vanderbilt enjoyed its most games on ESPN stations in 2008, going 5-2 on the network: 3-0 on ESPN, 1-1 on ESPN2, and 2-1 on ESPNU.

The Commodores are 3-7 all-time on ESPN and 1-7 all-time on ESPN2.

RECORD-SETTING FRESHMEN RUSHING DUO

True freshmen tailbacks **Zac Stacy** and **Warren Norman** ran their way into Vanderbilt record books in the opener vs. Western Carolina.

Stacy and Norman became the first Commodore duo to rush for more than 100 yards in the same game since Kwane Doster and Norval McKenzie each gained 101 yards at Ole Miss on Sept. 21, 2002. The feat has been accomplished by Vanderbilt running backs just four times in the last 15 years.

Stacy's 133-yard rushing total is the second highest single-game rushing total ever by a Vanderbilt true freshman, behind only Frank Mordica's 148-yard total vs. Air Force in 1986.

Norman added 105 rushing yards and a pair of touchdowns.

The Commodores have had 100-yard rushing duos in the same game on eight occasions since World War II.

Only once have three Commodore rusher gained at least 100 yards in a game: Ronnie Gordon (114), Cliff Deese (110) and Jermaine Johnson (100) vs. Wake Forest on Sept. 4, 1993.

JOHNSON'S COMMODORES: WORKING TO END HISTORICAL TRENDS

Vanderbilt Coaching Staff Stays Intact

Stability among the Vanderbilt coaching staff remains a strong trait of the Bobby Johnson Era.

Vanderbilt is one of two teams in the Southeastern Conference, joining Kentucky, that did not experience turnover in its coaching staff in the last year.

Since Johnson accepted the Vanderbilt position prior to the 2002 season, only three coaching changes have been made. The newest Commodore mentor, running backs coach and co-special teams coordinator **Des Kitchings**, joined the staff before the 2008 season.

Only six BCS teams have more longevity among their coaches than the Commodores. The staffs at East Carolina, Michigan State, North Carolina State, Penn State, UAB and Virginia Tech have been together for at least three years.

Vanderbilt and Kentucky are two of 32 schools that return the same staff from last year.

COMMODORES EARN 77th WIN IN OPENER

In its 120th year of organized football, Vanderbilt earned its 77th victory in season openers with a 45-0 win over Western Carolina on Sept. 5. The Commodores move to 77-39-4 all-time in openers.

Commodores Coming Off Stellar 2008

The 2009 Commodores look to improve off one of the program's most memorable campaigns. The 2008 accomplishments included:

- ★ The program's first postseason victory in 53 years, by way of a 16-14 decision over Boston College in the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl. Previously, the only other Vanderbilt bowl win came in the 1955 Gator Bowl vs. Auburn.
- \bigstar A 7-6 overall record, Vanderbilt's first winning season since an 8-4 mark in 1982. It was also the most victories since 1982.
 - ★ Four victories in SEC play, the team's most since SEC went to divisional play in 1992.
- ★ Three victories over ranked opponents South Carolina, Auburn and Boston College for the first time in program history.
 - ★ Ranked for a four-week stretch in the AP Top 25 for the first time in team history.
- ★ National leaders in player graduation rates, earning the AFCA's 2008 Academic Achievement Award.
 - ★ The first 5-0 start at Vanderbilt since World War II.
- ★ Seven national TV games, including the first on-campus appearance of ESPN's popular *College Football GameDay* show.

LINEBACKERS BENOIST AND STOKES: ACADEMIC STANDOUTS

Linebackers **Patrick Benoist** and **John Stokes** return to the 2009 season after receiving District IV Academic All-American honors last year by the College Sports Information Directors.

Benoist (Sr., Southlake, Texas) and Stokes (Jr., Memphis, Tenn.) were honored for outstanding achievement in the classroom and on the field. The Academic All-District IV team is comprised of players from the states of Michigan, Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee and Alabama.

Benoist is majoring in Economics. Stokes is working toward a major in Medicine, Health and Society. Stokes also was granted early acceptance into Vanderbilt Medical School after just his second year on campus. He is scheduled to start medical school classes in 2011.

Selected players also are available for interviews to reporters by phone on Wednesday or Thursday following practice.


Beat reporters can interview players upon request either Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday at the conclusion of practice.

Fans Benefit from Phase II Improvements at Vanderbilt Stadium



Commodore fans attending home games this season will enjoy the second phase of enhancements to Vanderbilt Stadium.

Construction crews completed Phase II work on Vanderbilt Stadium in late August. The result is a clean, refurbished look for the stadium, stylish entrances and plazas at Gates 2 & 3, expansion of the south end-zone concourse, and remodel of the westside concourse.

The current stadium, built in 1981, did not receive major improvements until 2008 when Phase I of an expansive athletic facility enhancement plan was completed. Phase I work included:

 New brick exterior renovation to south end of stadium facing McGugin Athletic Center and Jess Neely Drive.

- Exterior stadium painting and signage.
- Addition of Bookstore and Grill on south concourse.
- New eastside concourse artwork featuring Vanderbilt Athletics "It's Good To Be Gold" theme.

Phase I construction completed last year also aimed at enhancing both Memorial Gym and Hawkins Field.

Bobby Johnson's football team also benefited from the addition of FieldTurf artificial surface at its practice facility in 2008.

More improvements are in the planning stage, including upgrades to the football operation in McGugin Center, construction on the long-anticipated Vanderbilt Athletic Hall of Fame and expansion into the stadium's open, north end-zone section.

The 2009 Vanderbilt Athletic Hall of Fame class was introduced at halftime of the WCU-Vanderbilt game. The recipients were also honored during a Sept. 4 banquet.

The distinguished class was determined by a panel of Student Athletics administrators with input from various outside sources.

Each recipient was nominated for consideration through a process open to the entire Vanderbilt Athletics constituency, including followers and administrators.

Jim Arnold

Football, 1979-82

Arnold set the standard high for Commodore kicking specialists, becoming the first one to be named an All-American in 1982. His booming punts pinned opponents time and time again and were instrumental in evolving into an 8-3 season and 1982 Hall of Fame Bowl appearance his senior year. A SEC record setter, Arnold is the only player in team history named All-Southeastern Conference four straight years. He averaged 45.8 yards as a senior All-America in 1982.

Charles Davis

Men's Basketball, 1977-1981

Davis made the long journey from the projects of Nashville to Vanderbilt's West End campus. He didn't stop there, moving on to a successful career in the NBA. He never forgot a promise to himself to return and help young people find their own pathways to success. His Charles Davis Foundation has been a source of inspiration and achievement for thousands of children and his accomplishments on and off the basketball court are constant beacons of pride for Vanderbilt University. A first time All-SEC pick in 1979, Davis was a rebounding force. He also ranks eighth all-time with 1,675 points

Julie Ditty

Women's Tennis, 1998-2001

An elite player for one of Vanderbilt's most consistently successful programs, the left-handed Ditty starred for four years with the Vanderbilt women's tennis team and led the squad to the school's first-ever national championship appearance in 2001. Her professional career has been a success as well, and she was recently honored with an appointment to the U.S. Fed Cup Team. Her 114-win total at Vanderbilt ranks second all-time.

Charles Hawkins

Baseball-Football, 1952-1954

Hawkins was a two-sport athlete with the Commodores, following in the footsteps of his father, but what made him even more special to the school and the Nashville community was his passion and leadership abilities. Hawkins was simultaneously a successful real estate businessman and active volunteer who donated much of his time and efforts to many organizations around the city. He was instrumental in the creation of Hawkins Field, a state-of-the-art baseball complex and the current home of the Commodores. He was the Commodores' first All-SEC baseball player.

Herb Rich

Football, 1946-49

Those who witnessed this Miami, Florida native gracefully dominate the gridiron still regard Herb Rich as perhaps the finest all-around athlete in their memory. Indeed, the 180-pound speedster-turned-attorney left tangible signs of his football prowess that have survived after more than a half-century. Rich was a distinguished gentleman, lawyer and community activist but he also happened to be a dandy right halfback in college and set a National Football League record that is still on the books. President of his sophomore class at Vanderbilt, Rich topped the Commodores in rushing in 1948 and 1949.

Ming Hsu Robinson

Women's Swimming, 1980-84

Robinson was all about excellence as a swimmer and scholar as she shined in the pool and in the classroom with equal success. By doing so, she helped blaze a trail that female student-athletes continue to follow today. Considered at the time as unquestionably the greatest swimmer in the school's history, Ming arrived on the campus from California during an era when women's varsity athletics were in their infancy. She helped the Commodores to an NCAA Division II championship. She was a two-time All-America.

Wendy Scholtens Wood

Women's Basketball, 1987-1991

Scholtens was the first of Vanderbilt's great women's basketball stars. A double-double machine, she was the best scorer and rebounder not just at Vanderbilt, but in the entire SEC, leading the Commodores to two Sweet 16 appearances during her college career. The elite center played for the United States national team, was Vanderbilt's first women's Kodak All-America and set holds numerous team records.

Roy Skinner

Head Men's Basketball Coach, 1959, 1962-76

Skinner brought the men's basketball program to unparalleled heights after taking the job at the age of 28. He has the most successful tenure of any Commodore coach to date, and Vanderbilt basketball became immensely popular under his watch, as Memorial Gym expanded from 6,200 to over 15,000 seats in his 16 years. He is also remembered for his progressive ways, recruiting the SEC's first African-American basketball player, Perry Wallace, and agreeing to play Tennessee State during an era when such scheduling was not the norm. He was a four-time Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year.

Brandt Snedeker

Men's Golf, 1999-2003

Snedeker is Vanderbilt's most decorated golfer and has been a great ambassador for the university since his ascension into the professional ranks. The 2007 PGA Rookie of the Year was the Southeastern Conference Player of the Year and a first team All-American in 2003.
