Approval of Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to Minutes approve the minutes of the regular board meeting on April 28, 2021. (E:27:21) Moss Adams Ms. Wright and Mr. Stopa from Moss Adams presented a report 2020 Financial of the 2020 Audit Results. Mr. Stopa thanked staff for all the help and commented on how smoothly the audit went with Statement Audit changes in management and no issues of note were found. Presentation (E:28:21) Community Ms. Budd gave a presentation and overview of her involvement Presentation in South Snohomish County community outreach committees and groups who are working to raise awareness and coordinate health services for vulnerable adults experiencing homelessness. Ms. Budd also reported on case management workload and upcoming provider trainings. Ms. Budd and Commissioners discussed the lack of behavioral health services available in the area. (E:29:21)

Superintendent Report	Commissioner Langer thanked Ms. Budd for the work that she is doing. Dr. Edwards reported that the agreement with Swedish Edmonds has been finalized for Ms. Budd to be on site on Fridays starting May 28 to begin supporting the transition of some discharged patients to Ms. Budd's case management program. The goal is to improve the health outcomes of these individuals after discharge from the hospital.
	The Verdant Community Wellness Center continues to welcome community back into the building while working through the ever-changing guidance about mask wearing. Currently the Prescription Drug Assistance Program and Veterans Services are using the building and two more organizations will be starting in June.
	Dr. Edwards announced that starting July 1 <sup>st</sup> Coast Property Management Group will be providing property management for the Kruger Clinic, Value Village, and the Verdant Community Wellness Center. Staff are also developing an RFP that will include a bid to remodel the check in area and restorative work at the VCWC and updates for the Kruger Clinic.
	Dr. Edwards reported that Verdant staff are working on a survey to assess community interest in the summer walking program and activities that are scheduled to begin in July.
Executive Committee Report	President Knowles reported that the Executive Committee met on Thursday, May 13, 2021 to review the agenda for the May 26, 2021 board meeting. No action was taken.
	President Knowles asked Commissioners to confirm their attendance for the June 23 regular board meeting to make sure there is a quorum. Commissioners Distelhorst, Knutsen and President Knowles will be in attendance. Commissioner Langer's attendance is tentative, and Commissioner Wilson will not be attending.

Expiring Contracts	Ms. Reese reviewed grantees with expiring contracts in the next three months. All grantees have been contacted and have been encouraged to apply for renewal.
Q2 Grant Process Update	Ms. Reese reported that the Q2 grantmaking process is underway and has already held a Q&A session for potential grantees. The proposal scoring process for staff will begin next week followed by commissioner scoring. Commissioner Distelhorst will be scoring proposals for the Program Committee in the absence of Commissioner Wilson next month.

	they are not familiar with the grants and grant opportunities. Ms. Reese has created a process to follow up with the Edmonds School District on all opportunities that the district is included in, so they have the opportunity to decide if it is a value add or not.
	Commissioner Wilson commented that there is community interest in the underdeveloped field at the Woodway Campus and asked if there is any plan to move forward with development. Dr. Edwards replied she is in regular contact with the Superintendent of Edmonds School District and she is aware of litigation related to the field project lighting. She will find out more about the school district's plans with this space.





## IV. Fluxx Implementation Update

- Development of our "instance" of the program is underway! Thea and Zoe attended the (virtual) annual Fluxx conference and are meeting with our implementation team weekly.
- b. Recorded demonstrations of progress will start next week, and development is broken into 4 cycles:
  - i. Cycle 1: Registration, User, and Organization Forms and profiles
  - ii. Cycle 2: Pre-Award (application- traditional grants and superintendents discretionary)
  - iii. Cycle 3: Post Award (contracts, reports, payments)
  - iv. Cycle 4: End to End testing (final polishing, no significant changes to be made).
- c. Our goal is that applications will submit their proposals via Fluxx during our planned November application cycle. Current grantees that aren't due to apply in November will be asked to create their organization profile and we will need to manually transfer contract and payment schedules.
- d. Thea, Jennifer, and Zoe will be creating training videos and written materials for staff, commissioner, and community partner use starting in August that will be available online. 1:1 training will also be available to all.
- e. Zoe will serve as the ongoing system administrator and first line support for all questions.

## V. COVID Vaccination Update

- a. Mass vaccination sites planned to close by end of month and focus will move to community-based efforts
- b. Verdant will fund Medical Teams International and Helping Hands Project Organization to do robust community outreach and support for six community-based vaccine clinics, including Verdant's Meet Me at The Park event.
- c. Conversations with Seattle Visiting Nurse Association and community partners already underway for fall flu/COVID vaccine events.

## Addressing Food Insecurity

- Have distributed 2,475 Verdant-funded Fruit and Vegetable vouchers since April 2020 to food insecure residents through 12 South Snohomish County partners
- Verdant's DOH Fruit and Vegetable Project (July-Dec) will serve 20 food insecure seniors through a partnership program with the Edmonds Waterfront Center.

#### Prevention and Support Resources for the Community Virtually

 6-week Virtual Series on "Weight Loss that Works for You" based on research of Dr. Robert Kushner, a well-known expert in the field of weight management. Program is full and starts 6/23/21. (Co-sponsored with PHD#3 / lifestyle modification program developed by Verdant - taught by a RDN)

#### **Virtual Programming**

- **Getting to Goal Weight Reduction Class**, 5/24/21, 10 participants, (RDN sharing weight loss strategies & opportunity for 1:1 health coaching for PHD#2 residents)

#### **Verdant Community Social Worker Highlights**

Nancy Budd, Community Social Worker

- Case Management continuing support for 11 clients. CHART continuing support for 7 clients during this period. Several clients were very active this month, with multiple crises, involuntary commitments and suicidal behaviors. Several have improved their health through accessing treatment for substance use and mental health.
- This past month included weekly team check ins and marketing meetings, monthly staff meeting, covid and grant update meetings, monthly County Outreach Coalition, and County and Human Services Providers meeting. Monthly Snohomish County Community Behavioral Health Committee and Vulnerable Adult Taskforce. Quarterly Lynnwood Cops and Clergy Group.
- Quarterly provider training on June 11. The topic was LGBTQ Risk Prevention Strategies. 35 people of the 39 who registered attended and provided excellent ratings overall.
- This month I began working one day per week at Swedish Edmonds. I coordinate work between the psychiatric unit, the emergency departments behavioral health assessment team, and the hospital case management team. I have obtained 4 new clients between the units and are seeing improved patient results already. The goal is to begin to build rapport with clients before their discharges, in hopes of obtaining better health and wellness outcomes outside of the hospital setting.

## **Marketing Report**

#### Website Redesign

Staff and Aukema & Associates are continuing to explore the technical needs of our site as we work toward site mapping and wire frames. We have spent time exploring ways to display grant information and events, as those are two important functionalities that may require the most development work to fit our needs.

#### **Social Media**

Our social media presence has increased considerably in the past month in both areas of reach and engagement. In May, we posted 15 times and our page and/or content reached an estimated 4,460 people, an increase of 105% from the month of April.

#### Communication for Hybrid, In-person & Virtual Programming

We are creating a communication strategy to provide clear information about our plans for in-person, hybrid, and virtual classes as we will incorporate in-person and hybrid programming at Verdant in late summer. With classes offered through different means for the first time, it is important we are clear and thoughtful regarding this approach, and we will roll out the information next month.
