#### Notes

Short Term Employment Projections are produced annually, using industry employment data from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) and estimates of occupational employment from the Occupational Employment and Wage Statistics (OEWS). The focus is on how employment can be expected to change in the near term. The results are typically helpful to those looking for immediate employment, whether temporary, part-time or full-time.

This year, the base quarter for projections is Jan-Mar 2020, just before the pandemic began to have widespread effects on the economy (data are collected as of the twelfth of the month). Employment in Vermont dropped by nearly 50,000 in the second quarter of 2020, then rebounded by about 20,000 through third quarter. Certain sectors were affected more severely than others but as conditions begin to return to a more normal state through the rest of 2021, employment is projected to have regained substantial ground. From the present time in 2021, many, if not most, industries and occupations can be expected to show growth. The Short Term results, in contrast, show a drop of 1.5% in total employment from the first quarter of 2020 to the first quarter of 2022, mostly hopping over the substantial swings in 2020. The Short Term Projections, which show change from the pre-pandemic peak of employment (a sharp decline in the first months), do not match expectations for what the experience is likely to be going forward to the first quarter of next year (continued, and in some cases, rapid growth).

In contrast, Vermont's Long Term (ten-year) Employment Projections are designed to assist the educational community, workforce development specialists and individuals planning for the future. The Long Term Occupational Employment Projections can be used to identify occupations that will show stability, growth and good incomes over the long run. The methods used to produce Long Term Projections ignore the peaks and valleys of business cycles and focus on the fundamental elements

that affect the demand for a particular occupation. Ironically, next year's Long Term Projections will begin from the low point in the cycle, capturing the strongest effects of the pandemic. Long term growth can be expected to be strong, measured from a deep low to a long run, assumed full employment level in the future. In contrast, this year's Short Term Projections, which do take into account short term shocks, happen to skim over the deepest trough of the COVID-19 recession and do not catch the movement into and out of the trough, only an endpoint where things are projected to be close to pre-pandemic levels and expected to continue in an upward direction.
