In this month's magazine, you'll be reading a lot about Sigbot "Bodo" Winterhelt. Bodo-along with John Ke-L gel and Ed Bailey—was one of the "founding fathers" of NAVHDA. Bodo passed away in May after having lived a long and fruitful life. He was a native of Germany and emigrated to Canada, bringing with him the "German system" of testing hunting dogs. Once here, he adapted it the North American way of life, forming the NAVHDA we know today.

I met Bodo back in 1994 when I first became a member. His knowledge about dogs was a true testament to himself. I have fond memories of walking next to him and listening to him talk about what the dog was doing and what we should be looking for. His passing makes me cherish those memories even more. As a member of our NAVHDA "family," I had several opportunities to meet him. Truly, he was a great man. (Note to members: Plan to attend annual meetings and special NAVHDA events. You never know what great personalities you will meet!)

When one thinks of Pudelpointers, the name Bodo Winterhelt comes to mind. In 1956, Bodo introduced to North America its first Pudelpointer, Cati V. Waldof. Previously, during WWII, the Third Reich had made the German Wirehaired Pointer the "official" dog of Germany. Under Hermann Goering's "stewardship," Pudelpointers and other breeds were either neglected or suppressed. Since the late '50s, Bodo's efforts to bring the breed to North America and develop good foundation stock were instrumental in helping stabilize Pudelpointers and help alleviate the breed's post-war struggle. Today the Pudelpointer is a recognized performer in the NAVHDA program-happily taking its place with the many GSPs and other breeds.

To mention only a few of his other accomplishments; Bodo was instrumental in writing the well-known "Green Book" which became the "bible" of NAVHDA. He was an avid promoter of respect for game and taught hunters the value of using a trained dog to conserve game in the field. He served as president of NAVHDA for about 16 years-from 1969 until 1985. (Whew!) In 1977 he was instrumental in starting the first Pudelpointer Club of North America (PCNA) in Canada. Later, in 2011, he created the "Bodo Winterhelt Pudelpointer Organization" seeking to preserve what Bodo felt were time-honored breeding practices. As I said, these are only a few of his accomplishments!

Just a few weeks before he passed away, I had the privilege of speaking with him. He told me that we were doing a great job. It was both pleasing and encouraging to hear a founding father of NAVHDA say such a thing... and a great reflection on the membership.

Our thoughts and prayers are with the family at this difficult time. I am sure that Bodo is up there in heaven with his dogs, coursing flowered meadows.

## In memory of Sigbot "Bodo" Winterhelt 1926-2018

rigbot Winterhelt was born in Mainz, Germany in 1926 into a prosperous family. The nickname Bodo came From his mother. Bodo's father, an architect and avid antique collector, specializing in pewter, was not a hunter or fond of dogs. When asked by his young son for a pet dog, the answer was that dogs were too expensive to own because of the onerous "dog tax" imposed by the German government. Nine-year-old Bodo's attempt to override that argument was to write a letter to Adolf Hitler requesting an end to the tax. Bodo never received a response. Apparently Hitler had other things on his mind.

Bodo did finally get his first dog four years later. He learned what kind of poems his father liked, memorized them, impressed his parent with his recitations and was granted his request. This first dog was a hunting terrier, a Jagdterrier. However, Bodo's history with dogs was nearly short-lived after this young dog destroyed one of his father's favorite antiques, a chair which once belonged to Napoleon Bonaparte.

Although Bodo's father was not a hunter, his uncle and grandfather were. In fact, his uncle was president of a German hunting dog association. It is worth noting here that the Winterhelt family physician was Dr. Paul Kleeman who was instrumental in developing the prestigious Kleeman Seiger test. The Kleeman Title is one of the most sought after awards for versatile dogs in Germany. Without the knowledge of his father Bodo worked as a helper at hunting dog tests from the age of fourteen. He put signs on trees, carried food and shells, laid tracks, and was a general "go-fer."

Bodo's family lost everything during World War II, including his father's priceless antique collection and their home, which was bombed and burned to the ground, leaving a deep layer of molten pewter in the basement. His older brother, Volkmar, was a lieutenant in the German military. At the end

was the first German to eventually be given permission to own a shotgun, which he used in his work as a guide and dog trainer.

Bodo's brother was a dedicated horseman, competing in dressage events after his return from the P.O.W. camp. The two brothers found that post war Europe, with its overpopulation and lack of open space, was not conducive to their passions for dog and horse activities, so they applied for emigration to Canada, finally arriving in 1954. Unfortunately Volkmar later died of cancer, competing in horse events as long as possible.

After his arrival in Canada, Bodo worked picking tobacco leaves in southern Ontario and then cutting trees in the depth of winter farther north. On the advice of his brother he relocated to Toronto where he chanced upon a newspaper photo of a veterinarian, Dr. Allen Seecord, pictured with an English Pointer at a hunt trial. Bodo walked miles through ice and snow to locate Dr. Seecord and to ask for a job. The doctor replied, "I have



position. Two years later the law had changed and Bodo became a Canadian citizen. He lived there for twenty-two years before moving to the United States. He now has dual citizenship.

Meanwhile Bodo had come to realize there were no hunting dog organizations or tests in North America similar to those he had left behind in Germany. He decided to see if he could change that situation.

After observing North American field trials extensively, he decided to compete. In Germany he had grown up with and worked with Munsterlanders since Herr Löns had been active in improving that breed. However, distemper had decimated the Munsterlander population in the early 1950's, and the Pudelpointer replaced them in his activities. In Canada he decided to stick with Pudelpointers and was the first to get permission from the German Pudelpointer Club to bring the breed to North America. He imported Cati v. Waldhof in 1956 and began to win prizes and gain respect from the other competitors. People started to listen to his ideas.

While managing the Nicholson Island Club, Bodo became friends with Douglas Hume, an intelligent, experi-

enced hunter who loved hunting dogs. The two men worked together to adapt the written rules of the German tests into the English language. Bodo would talk to Doug, telling him what he wanted to say and Doug would put it into perfect English. In this way the Pudelpointer Breed Club was established, and the basic ideas of NAVHDA achieved written form. Bodo states emphatically that without Doug Hume he could not have started NAVHDA.

It took longer than he had anticipated to get a small group together with the enthusiasm and understanding to go along with his plans. The first versatile rules were established in 1960 with an organization named the All Purpose Gun Dog Association. In 1961 this group held its first and only trial. It was advertised as an "All Purpose Gun Dog Competition" and attracted fourteen entries. Bodo's dog, Winterhelle's Komet, off-spring of Cati, impressed observers with his performance. He won the event (see cover) and was acclaimed by the press. Bodo believes Komet did more to promote versatile principles than any other dog, laying the ground work for NAVHDA.

Although the All Purpose Gun Dog Association did not continue as a viable club, the trial was a demonstration of what dogs were capable of doing. Bodo and Doug finally were able to convince the dog world that these dogs should be considered not all purpose dogs but versatile hunting dogs. Also the idea of tests versus competitive trials was introduced. It was a pivotal point in the conceptual development of NAVHDA.

When Ed Bailey arrived in Ontario in 1964 with his Griffons, he was familiar with the history of the German tests




and obtained a copy of the rules which had been translated from German to English by Bodo and Doug Hume. By this time Bodo had established himself as a professional dog trainer and handler. He was also manager of the exclusive private hunting preserve on Nicholson Island on Ontario Lake. In 1965 Ed contacted Bodo, and soon after, an initial hunting dog test was set up on the grounds of the Goodwood Hunt Club where the two men judged along with Jerry Knap. They found they could work well together. This demonstration test attracted a good number of people and kindled interest.

A small group got together and set out a purpose and long term direction. Early efforts were slow, emphasizing quality of results and strong membership, not wanting to push too hard and grow too fast. The goal was not to establish a large competitive organization like the American Kennel Club. While the American culture tends to be competitive, Bodo and Ed felt there could be a place for the non-competitive hunter, an association that emphasized education, co-operative training and conservation. This new organization would have the responsibility of promoting hunting as an ethical and humane activity that respects all life. Its purpose would be to foster, improve, promote and protect the versatile hunting breeds in North America.

They began to have tests in both Canada and the United States, primarily organized by chapters of the various breed clubs. The early tests were not NAVHDA sanctioned, since it was not yet firmly organized and did not even have a name. Tests were held in California, Virginia, Ontario and Maine.

# A HUNTER'S THANK YOU

n 1956, Bodo, at 30 years old, with help of his good friend, Doug Hume, translated the testing regulations of the Deutshes Jagdgebrauchshund Prufung, the German versatile hunting dog test, into English. I fell into a copy of the translation six years later, a gift from the secretary of the Wirehaired Pointing Griffon Club of America. It had been sent it to every versatile dog club they could find. Mostly it fell on blind eyes and deaf ears because the concept of testing dogs was, for the first time ever, being introduced to North America. I had only seen this text in German. The only North American testing was the highly competitive American Field pointer/setter trials and the retriever trials-high level competition games for professional trainers. There was no way for the on foot hunter to evaluate his dogs.

Bodo and Doug Hume arranged a test and, though several people entered dogs, only Bodo's dog, Komet could complete it. The testing movement was still-born. Dogs just



couldn't do all that stuff. I met Bodo in 1965, having just moved to Ontario with Griffons and a knowledge of the German tests, as well as a copy of the translated rules. Bodo had recently moved to North Orono, on a game farm owned by a Mr. Parker. Bodo had imported several Pudelpointers and had gathered a few of the owners of his pups, helping them train for the tests. Most were like Bodo, recent German immigrants. He was creating the nucleus of what was to become NAVHDA. A test, the second in North America, was set up and, typical of Bodo, we started with what later became the Utility Test. Bodo was to be senior judge. He asked me to be one of the other two judges.

Most of the dogs entered were Bodo trained, but there was a reasonable turnout of local hunters with their not-so-wellschooled dogs as well. In one portion of the test, each dog was told to search tall, emergent vegetation for five minutes without a duck, then called back, and hidden from view while a dead duck was tossed into the reeds and the dog told to again search, find the duck and retrieve it. The first of the non-Bodo trained dogs splashed around in the reeds a bit and came out, refusing to search anymore. Bodo said, "Zero. Handler pick up your dog and go home. A Zero means your dog is disqualified." And he called for the next dog. I quickly took Bodo aside and said, "I know what you did is the way it is done in Germany, but we are trying to get people interested in this form of testing, so can we bend the rules a little and let him finish the test so he doesn't go away mad and never come back?" Bodo rubbed his chin a moment and said, "Ja, Ja. You are right," went to the man, apologized for being too strict and let the man and his dog complete the test. I greatly admired this man who could bend his principles for what he saw was a greater good. This also became the over-riding philosophy of the whole NAVHDA movement, to teach the handler how to help his dog become everything he was bred to be. It is Bodo's legacy, improve the training, improve the handling, and so improve the dog. It was always about the dogs, for the dogs.



e first met Bodo Winterhelt in the mid 1970's when we participated in events organized by the newly formed Northeast Chapter of NAVHDA. Novices in training dogs, we (and our GSP Spike) benefited from Bodo's vast experience and expertise with canines. His confidence, wit and charisma-in addition to his knowledge and skill in developing the potential of the dogs and their handlers-were clear. Spike went on to achieve maximum scores in Natural Ability and Utility tests and eventually was the first dog to qualify and pass the newly sanctioned Advanced Utility Test (predecessor to today's Invitational test). It is important to note that the Advanced Utility Test was initially called the Master Dog test, but Bodo vehemently opposed that terminology; thus it became simply the Advanced Utility Test.

Later we got to know Bodo more intimately when we interviewed him extensively while writing the an article about the Green Book and then an article about his early years in Germany. Monthly phone calls continued to his last days, and you never knew what you might find in your mail, which could open another chapter in his life. And what a life he lived! Growing up in a family of wealth and privilege, he then endured the horrors of WW II and eventually emigrated to Canada and the United States and mourned the untimely death of his older brother Volkmar. Bodo introduced the Pudelpointer to North America in 1956, initiated the concept of versatile hunting dogs to North America by winning a 1961 All Purpose Gun Dog Competition with his dog Komet, and with Dr. Ed Bailey, co-founded the formation of NAVHDA.

Sigbot (Bodo) Winterhelt started his life in a family of wealth and prestige. He ended it with a wealth of friends from all walks of life, respected by the dog world for his accomplishments, and loved by those who knew him best. A life well lived. We will miss him. Me

met Bodo in New England several times. The first time was in 1981 when he led a Judges' training clinic at Al Rapp's place in Upstate New York and in 1983 when Bodo stayed at my house at a Judges' meeting while I was the President for the Northeast Chapter of NAVHDA. At that visit, Bodo presented me with an old map of Denmark (my birth country) from an atlas of his father's (more later). In January, 1984 I participated in the NAVHDA annual meeting in Chicago, where Bodo was presented with a small oak chest with a bronze relief of the three dogs' heads made by Sue Helser from Michigan, a Pudelpointer, a Jagdterrier, and a Small Munsterlander (my Peto's Alpha was the model for the SM). In the mid-80's I was a judge at a NAVHDA test in California where I had another opportunity to spend significant time with Bodo. Since I am the founder of the Small Munsterlander breed in North America, my contacts and interactions with Bodo have had special meaning over many years.



EDMUND LOENS AND FLORA

Bodo's father-in-law was Edmund Loens, a games-keeper in Mettingen (near Muenster) in Germany. Bodo grew up in Berlin, but spent most of his summers with the Loenses and helped Edmund with the dogs. Edmund is considered to be the modern-day pioneer of the Small Munsterlander. I have included a photo from July, 1943 of Bodo as a 17-year-old with a Small Munsterlander pup Cit vom Falkenhof.

During the latter part of the World War II Bodo had been conscripted and he was wounded in Romania just about when the war ended. Normally wounded soldiers would be sent home to their families if they could be found. That wasn't possible for Bodo. His parents, who had lived in Berlin, had, for several months, been placed with some of their valuables in a rail car that was pulled around Germany behind a Red Cross train (what kind of pull-no pun intended-with the German high command must Bodo's father have had?). Because of this circumstance, Bodo was repatriated to Edmund Loens' household. While there he helped train Loens' dogs. Bodo was also present when a British officer (who had heard about Loens' dogs) and his driver from the occupational forces came up to the Loens' home and wanted to buy a Small Munsterlander.

Edmund was a very proud man, and since the British officer had not held out his hand for a handshake as is normal in Germany, Edmund wouldn't sell him a dog. Bodo took Edmund aside and pleaded with him and suggested that if they could get their hunting guns back maybe it would be a way to overcome his displeasure with the officer. Bodo brought the dog-for-guns deal to the officer who had to decline since "the enemy" could not be allowed to have weapons. Bodo then took the officer aside and told him that there was no way that Edmund would sell any of his dogs unless he got his hunting guns back.

The following week the officer drove himself to Edmund's home. With guns covered up in the jeep, the deal went through. By this Bodo believes that he and Loens were the first Germans to obtain firearms after the end of the war. Bodo stayed with the Loenses, and he also got Small Munsterlanders of his own and bred as well. Bodo was in October 1946 elected as the registrar of the Deutscher Heidewachtel Club and Loens (Loens called the SM Heidewachtel) was its President (page 49, Der Kleine Munsterlander Vorstehhund

by Hans Eggerts). The first field tests were conducted on 10 and 11 September 1949, and Bodo ran and qualified Lilo Loens V. (page 51).

Bodo later learned that his parents were near the Austrian border when the war ended. Having spent months on end and having had all their meals in the train car, Bodo's father asked his wife out for a meal at a local restaurant. Bodo's mother asked her husband what dress he would like for her to wear. # my time with By Bob Farris Boise, Idaho Bodo Winterhelt

s I began writing this passage, I acquired my first pudelpointer, and I realized many of the current membership never had the opportunity to meet one of NAVHDA's founders, Bodo Winterhelt.

Somewhere in the early 1970s I heard of the organization NAVH-DA from a friend who was planning to travel to Iowa to meet with a new group of versatile dog enthusiasts. I was field trailing retrievers in AKC field trials throughout the North West at this time. I had also just taken on a gun dog training adventure where I began taking in retrievers, pointers, and spaniels from other hunters in the Boise area. One of the first dogs to come into my training camp was a pudelpointer that had been imported from Germany and successfully trained and NAVHDA tested by another trainer named Bodo Winterhelt. I had been hired by the pudelpointer's owner to hunt his dog on wild birds for a three month period during the Fall bird season. This exposure saw me hunting with the most reliable hunting dog I had ever experienced, and a personal crusade to acquire a pudelpointer for myself led me to the man who had helped create the dog organization NAVHDA and also who was responsible for bringing this breed to North America. Bodo introduced me to John Kagel from Toronto, Canada where

my passion for the breed has taken me on a journey that I am still pursuing today. I am still thankful to Bodo and John for their help and inspiration.

About 1975, Bodo moved his training facility to Washington just south of Spokane, and I took a week of vacation to train with him and to experience the new versatile dog movement that was buzzing about North America. I stayed with my sister in Spokane and spent long days for a week learning Bodo's training techniques, most being very new to me. My sister was a single parent of two children, and I learned later that after I returned home, Bodo began a short courtship with her. That was very typical of Bodo as I later learned. He loved his dogs and admired the ladies.

As years followed, Bodo helped me acquire top breeding stock for my Cedarwood breeding program. He also assisted in helping me select stud dogs for my breedings. I then took on the NAVHDA apprentice judging program to become a NAVHDA judge as my interest in versatile dogs began to grow. During this time I apprenticed under Bodo's guidance many times while he was the Senior Judge. He continually demonstrated his ability to read a dog, which was far superior to anyone I had previously come

#### across, regardless of AKC, American field, or NAVHDA judging.

Bodo came to Idaho and hunted chukar with me on several occasions, and when he moved to Grangeville, Idaho, I would travel several times each Fall to hunt with him. I would find him spending more time admiring the habitat these birds lived in and the abundance of wildflowers growing on the north slopes than he actually spent hunting. He had shot many chukar in training and tests, but never wild ones. He marveled at this difference.

In 1997, on our way to New Zealand, LaFaye and I attended the NAVHDA annual meeting in Los Angeles. Following this meeting, my friendship with Bodo softened. He was requesting NAVHDA discontinue both their registry and also their Invitational. His argument had merit as he felt that the registry would open the door to many rogue breeders not demonstrating concern to testing their breeding stock before breeding their dogs. He also felt the breed clubs were the grass roots for NAVHDA and they would soon be out-




numbered by these rogue breeders and eventually disappear. His argument to discontinue the Invitational was that the organization's membership would begin focusing on Versatile Champions for their breeding selections rather than Natural Ability and Utility testing where NAVHDA's best footprint for this purpose should be used. Bodo was so adamant of these two requests, which were so paramount to him, that he left the organization following the Los Angeles meeting, requesting his name and membership be withdrawn completely. This was the organization that he, John Kegal, and Ed Bailey had orchestrated some 30 years previously. Being a man of strict conviction, he followed his word and left the organization to only focus on his own dogs and the breed club he had chosen.

I stayed aligned to NAVHDA and didn't follow Bodo's lead as I had just become a NAVHDA judge and wasn't willing to walk away from this venue. Also, traveling to Southern California just wasn't feasible for my future testing plans. I was personally testing

5 to 10 dogs annually, and with chapters in Idaho, Oregon, Washington, and Utah, my testing needs would be accomplished much closer to home. NAVHDA's pudelpointer membership residing in California (including several NAVHDA judges) dropped out also to follow Bodo's lead. The rest of the pudelpointer enthusiasts stayed with NAVHDA, and most of the serious breeders joined forces and created North American Pudelpointer Alliance (NAPPA) to support the breed.

Years later, LaFaye and I visited Bodo when he was still active with his dogs and lived in Bandon, Oregon. He complemented me on taking my Cedarwood breeding program to such a favorable level, but followed the compliment with "but I'll never forgive you Bob for staying with NAVHDA and not coming with me following that meeting in Los Angeles."

These are the dog politics none of us wish to see or be involved in, but the man I knew had a strong constitution for what he believed, and this was what separated him from so many others.

ver his career, it's hard to know how many pups Bodo placed into the hands of eager clients, but here is a photo of one female pup from the last litter he ever was involved in. It was July 5th, 2014. Both sides of the breeding were Winterhelle pedigrees... end of an era, really.

I was researching to decide on what would be my current dog's replacement and happened upon Bodo's name history with NAVHDA and the Pudelpointer, so I called him and actually got him on my first try. He was very apologetic about his halting speech, explaining that he was recovering from a stroke and was very happy to talk dogs and such. It wasn't long before I realized he was actually interviewing me and my hunting style and history. When I told him I currently hunted over a wonderful Tiger Mountain Lab, he exclaimed, "Oh, so you have one of those FAT DOGS!" Well, now, I have never, ever been accused of being thinskinned, but you are better off insulting me rather than my faithful feather finder. However, knowing that he was quite old, AND recovering from a stroke, AND actually kind of charming in a disarming sort of way, I decided to let it slide. Besides, he was an icon in the dog world and I was, and still am, a nobody! (at least in the dog credibility world ). He knew I hunted every type of wild game bird in every type of habitat and season and told me his conclusion was, "I think you might be ready for a Pudelpointer." I told him I wasn't shopping dogs yet, just info-gathering. Besides, my FAT DOG was still in her prime. He ended by saying, "You might want think about it." I said I would. That was how it ended... pleasantries exchanged and we hung up.

Well, I never went to college, but I was smart enough to realize this was one of those times in life that had 'special opportunity' written all over it. Only a fool with kennel blindness would say no. Long story short, I said YES, I'll take your biggest, boldest female available.

In the weeks that followed, I called and chatted with Bodo about Pudelpointers, training and his life. I even saved the last call I received from him the day I picked her up. We spent the day at his home in Bandon, Oregon listening to stories and training tips. He also did his best to charm my dear wife—as the photo shows.

Looking back, I am so happy to have been there experiencing Bodo's world as the Bodo Winterhelt era was coming to its inevitable end. There would be no more litters, no more pups, no more hunt tests or training days... the end to an era that will never be repeated, by anyone. I am so happy he thought enough of our conversations to bring me into his orbit and the Pudelpointer world. We love our female, Whiskey. She's everything he advertised and more. In fact, she had a singleton pup this year that resides along with her now in our home with my other dog, a Braque du Bourbonnais. I am now a member of NAVHDA and the Pacific Northwest Chapter. Bodo is a reminder of simpler times when being absorbed in a singular pursuit of excellence was enough. To sustain that level of uncompromising devotion and commitment has gone the way of rotary phones and points, plugs and condensers. Bodo did not have a price and could not be bought. The time will eventually come when the Winterhelle name will drop off the pedigree chart, but his legacy will never be forgotten-at least not by this former owner of a FAT DOG!



The Utility Blind Sequence – Training and Testing Tips.



What I refer to here as the "Blind Sequence" is actually composed of four separate segments, each of which is scored independently. These are, in order, Heeling, Remaining by the Blind, Steadiness at the Blind, and Retrieve of Duck. Before you start the sequence, the judges will sometimes ask whether you want your instructions all at once or rather have them described individually at the beginning of each separate segment of the sequence. Under these conditions, my own preference is to take them all at once so that I can execute the entire sequence without stopping, but during training you should always practice stopping between each segment and mimic receiving instructions so that, if that happens in a test, it won't be the first time! One additional training tip: *you should always train for the Blind Sequence* 

with plenty of other people around to mimic the conditions of the test (three judges, possibly two apprentices, and usually a small gallery) and to provide distractions for your dog. Finally, many people wait to train for the Blind Sequence until after they have a rock-solid duck search. Training for them simultaneously can cause confusion for some dogs and negatively impact duck search training.

The heeling course is composed of 10 pairs of gates, which will form a heeling course roughly three feet wide and approximately 50 yards long, with a curve or bend in the course, and ending at a blind at the water's edge. Of course, there are sometimes limitations on the heeling course imposed by the landscape, so the suggested 50-yard length of the course is more of a guideline than an absolute requirement. You will be given a break-open 12g shotgun which you will to determine whether it is tugging on the lead or lurching carry with you through the heeling course. *The scoring for* ahead of the handler. Corrections by the handler, ranging heeling begins when the handler gives his/her first comfrom jerking on the lead, obvious scuffing of the feet, or a *mand*, whether that is a verbal "heel", a tug on the leash, a verbal command can lower the heeling score. Judges will be watching the dog closely have your dog sit, stand, or lie down, and you can leave your





lead or some other item with, but not touching, the dog. The judges will then ask you to take your shotgun and two blank "popper" loads and position yourself in a location they indicate that will be out of sight of your dog. When properly positioned, you will shoot two rounds approximately 10 seconds apart, then return to your dog. A training tip Mark mentioned last month is absolutely key – although in the test itself you will be asked to fire twice, *during training you should always mix this up, sometimes firing once, sometimes five times, sometimes not at all.* If you only fire two shots every time you train, your dog will learn pretty quickly that it's over at two shots, which can lead to problems with breaking. *You should also vary where you go to fire your shots during training* – sometimes to the left, sometimes to the right, sometimes behind the dog. Just because you


go to a particular place during training on your home grounds doesn't necessarily mean that's where the judges will ask you to go on test day, and you and your dog need to be ready for anything. It's important to note too that whining (I'm referring to the dog here, but I imagine it would apply to the handler as well!) or barking during this phase will almost certainly lower your score; the logic here is that if the dog is vocalizing in a duck hunting situation, that would likely result in your ducks flaring on you. After firing your two shots, return to your dog calmly. Throughout this sequence, your dog is expected to remain in the position you left him - sitting, standing, or lying down in or next to the blind – for a maximum score of 4. If the dog takes a step or two in any direction, the dog can receive a Prize I score (3) but not a 4. Abandoning the blind, for example entering the water or taking a number of steps toward the handler, is not a good thing and if severe enough could cost you a prize completely. You should always train with someone you trust and who knows your dog; ask him/her to stand about 15 feet behind your dog and give them your e-collar transmitter or make verbal corrections should the dog misbehave while you can't see him.

The "Steadiness by Blind" segment immediately follows Remain by Blind. If you left your dog in the blind during Remain by Blind you will need to reposition your dog so that it is standing or sitting next to the blind facing the water; you can also reposition him if you left him outside the blind if you choose. Once your dog is positioned next to the blind and you are in the blind, load a popper into your gun and indicate to the judges that you are ready. At this point a distraction gunner positioned well to the left or right of the blind will fire a shot, and you

will fire soon thereafter. After you are reloaded, the distraction gunner will fire yet another shot, and just after this the judges will indicate that a dead duck be launched so that it lands approximately 50 yards away, preferably in open water. You fire your final shot while the duck is in the air to mimic actually shooting a duck. Your dog is expected to remain steady without commands until released for the retrieve; there should be a noticeable pause between when the duck lands and when you send the dog. As with the Remain by Blind component, during training you should always vary the number and sequence of shots fired during the Steadiness by Blind segment. You should also plan on launching two or three ducks once in a while during training. Keep it interesting. This is perhaps even more important than during training for Remain by Blind because if you always fire a total of four shots while training, your dog will very quickly learn that the duck always appears after the third shot, which dramatically increases the chances that it will break after the third shot in anticipation of the duck. As an extreme example of the "mix it up" philosophy, I know one very well-respected trainer whose dogs never hear the four shots used during testing until the day of the test itself.

Judgment for the "Retrieve of Duck" component begins when you give your fetch command. Your dog is expected to swim directly to the duck, pick it up, and return to you by land or water and complete the finished retrieve. More specifically, upon return your dog "should sit or stand quietly close to the handler until commanded to release the duck to hand. Anticipating this command or dropping the game must be penalized." I've copied this directly from the NAVHDA Aims manual because it's the best, most succinct description of a finished retrieve as I've seen. "Fly-by" retrieves where the dog is trotting past the handler, requiring to handler to reach out and snatch the duck as the dogs passes by will be penalized, as will dropping the duck on the way, playing with the duck, etc. Here's a testing tip -if your dog meets the conditions for a finished retrieve, that is, standing or sitting quietly, don't hesitate to give your "out" command and get that duck. All too often I've seen handlers waiting and waiting for... What? I don't know.

Assuming you've read this far, it almost certainly took you longer than actually executing the Blind Sequence itself (although during the test it can sometimes seem like a very long time). The bottom line here is that this sequence is actually composed of four independent segments scored individually. Train with people around and mix it up. Over-training this segment of the Utility test can get boring for both you and the dog, particularly if it's the same every time. Keep it fun and interesting, and don't overdo it. # Never Again By Anna Noble Logan, Ohio

grew up in the country a few miles outside a small town in northern Ohio. Shotguns had always been in our home, so I was comfortable around guns. I couldn't wait to get a BB gun when I was 9 or 10 years old. My prey started as tin cans, then one day I shot at a bird, and hit it, and then I cried. Never again did I want to shoot anything that was living. So it was a surprise when I started upland bird hunting seven years ago when I turned 50.

It all started with our friend's dog, a German Shorthaired Pointer named Mildew. Mildew was the sweetest girl, a great hiker, and nothing stuck to her. Our previous dogs were Old English Sheepdogs, and they need just a "little" clean up after a hike. OK, they need a lot of clean up. So a low maintenance dog sounded great. We were excited for our next dog to be a GSP—this would be easy.

We found a breeder and wanted to learn more about this whole "pointing" thing. OMG! Which is, "Oh my goodness we had no clue a dog could do that!" As you can tell from earlier, we love to hike—but we were getting a hunting dog. Love at first sight, we were the proud owners of Dream Point Kennels, Baby Girl, we call her Darby and never again would our life be the same. Ron Behnke is the kennel owner and breeder and has become a dear friend and mentor. Ron told us about NAVHDA and invited us to attend a training day. He also invited us to go on a hunt with him to see how it all comes together. We knew we wanted to encourage our pup's natural abilities and jumped at the opportunity to see a finished dog work. What a thing of beauty, we had no idea how much the dogs love hunting and how they work with you. I'm sure I don't need to tell your readers, but in case someone new is reading this article, please tag along with someone to see a finished bird dog hunt. You will be in awe, and most likely get hooked and want to bird hunt with your own dog, which is exactly what happened to Judy and me. This brings me to why I'm writing this article. Now we would need to learn to hunt with our dog—and that meant buying shotguns.

My spouse Judy likes to hunt with an over/under shotgun. She likes the idea of keeping in accordance with tradition, and also the fact of having a very low chance of any malfunction. She has a nice Browning Citori. I on the other hand, for several reasons, prefer to hunt with a semi-automatic shotgun. First, I believe you really do feel quite a bit less recoil after fir-



ing, especially since I like to use 3 inch shells when hunting. Second, I think in general the semi-auto's weigh less. It may not sound like much, but a half pound can make a big difference when carrying it for six or seven hours. Third, I like having more than two shots without reloading, even though I rarely use it. And last, I personally really like the feel and handling of the single barrel and the auto ejection of spent shells. I decided on a Beretta AL391. Buying the semi automatic shotgun was a little intimidating since, with so many parts, a lot could go wrong. But

it's personal preference on what you like and choose to hunt with. Proper cleaning was a big concern for me. I always had the concern I should be cleaning my semi-automatic better than I was. But several people, who knew a lot about firearms and even sold firearms, told me, "Just pull a snake through the barrel a few times after use," that's all you need to do to clean it. This not an excuse, but something to know about me—I don't push buttons unless I know what they will do. So, when advised to only run a snake through the barrel to clean it, that's what I did. I did that for years, my gun always worked fine, for six-and-a-half years never had a single issue. Until, one day while hunting, it jammed.

It was the middle of November, 2016, and we were in South Dakota. Our group consisted of six, all of us Mid-Ohio NAVHDA members. We also met up and hunted with another small group of friends from Ohio and one gentleman from Montana. It was very hot, and I'd been in and out of thick cattails all week. The fields were tall, and the corn strips dry and dusty. Through it all I held my shotgun at the ready position in front of me. We were working a field, and the dogs were birdy in my area; as I pulled up to take the shot, my gun jammed. After further inspection, I found it was filled with fuzz, seeds, dust, grains, tiny sticks and more fuzz. I had never seen anything like that before, and I had no clue what to do. It was so bad I couldn't even pull the cocking handle back. This was not my first hunting trip. We had been on plenty of other trips, and my gun had never filled up with any debris.

It was really embarrassing having to ask if anyone knew how to clean my gun. I only knew how to run a snake down the barrel, which was no help in this situation. The one gentleman from Montana, Dana, was willing to take a look at my gun. Dana, a retired Army Ranger, started tearing it down as I watched. He was very polite, but also tried to explain that parts like the gas cylinder and piston are suppose to be shiny, not black and grimy. He didn't want to take it apart too much, but said he could get it cleaned enough to get me through the remaining days of hunting.



## Why Should We Care About Thyroid?

ne of the most important, yet overlooked glands in the body is the thyroid. When not functioning properly, it can be responsible for a wide range of symptoms or behavior changes in vour dog. It can even affect hunting performance. as low levels lead to exercise intolerance and weakness. The purpose of this article is to provide a general overview of hypothyroidism in the dog, including it's diagnosis and treatment as well as considerations for breeding animals.

The thyroid gland is a bi-lobed gland that sits on either side of the windpipe, known as the trachea. Most of the gland is made up of follicular cells which store and secrete thyroxine (T4) and tri-iodothronine (T3), both of which regulate the body's metabolism. The thyroid gland requires iodine to make T4 and T3. The other type of cells in the thyroid gland are called parafollicular cells which secrete calcitonin. Calcitonin is responsible for calcium metabolism and when secreted it will lower the blood's calcium levels. The thyroid gland is also associated with the parathyroid glands which are much smaller and regulate both calcium and phosphorus levels in the body.

The body regulates the amount of thyroid hormone secreted due to signals from the brain (hypothalamus) that are received by the pituitary gland. The pituitary gland releases thyroid stimulating hormone (TSH) which in turn tells the thyroid gland to release T3 and T4. Most dogs with thyroid disease are "hypothyroid," meaning they do not produce enough T4. In very rare circumstances, a dog may be hyperthyroid and produce too much T4. If the body does not produce enough T4, metabolism is slow and if too much is produced, the body's metabolism is revved up.

There are two types of thyroid disease in dogs, lymphocytic thyroiditis or idiopathic thyroid gland atrophy. - Weight gain without increasing food intake or decreasing exercise
- Lethargy, slow when running or hunting
- Dry haircoat, excessive shedding, areas of baldness or thin coat
- Dark appearance to skin where previously pink
- Recurrent skin and ear infections
- Hair that does not grow back after clipping/cutting
- Slow heart rate
- Facial skin becomes thicker
- Dragging of feet, head tilt, poor coordination
- Intact male dogs show reduced interest in females or are not fertile
- Infertility/abortion in females
- Reduced tear production in the eyes or changes to the appearance of the corneas.

Low thyroid function can also lead to abnormal contractions at 6 -12 month intervals to ensure the dose is still effective is of the heart muscle. Approximately 25% of hypothyroid dogs strongly recommended. have abnormal heart rhythms or a slower heart rate. a more sensitive indicator of thyroid function. This test, however, must be done with a special procedure and is more expensive than a routine T4 screening. TSH levels in humans is one way of diagnosing hypothyroidism. In contrast, 25% of dogs have normal TSH levels when hypothyroid. It still may be a helpful test when looked at in conjunction with an examination and other lab values.

The final test, Antithyrogloblin Antibodies (TGAA) tests for the immune mediated cause of hypothyroidism. This is the form that is believed to be inherited. Dogs that are positive for TGAA yet have normal thyroid hormone tests have a 20% chance of becoming hypothyroid later on. If you have a dog that is positive or equivocal, regular testing of T4 is recommended as a dog can develop hypothyroidism at any point in the future.

The good news is that treatment of hypothyroid animals regardless of the underlying cause is the same - Thyroid hormone supplementation, usually taken twice daily for life. Dogs are started on a specific dose for 3-4 weeks and then their levels are rechecked to ensure the dose is correct. Testing

By doing your homework and plan-**CUSTOMIZE YOUR PACKING LIST** ning ahead, you can help ensure your dog's safety and comfort while on the road. Follow these tips to help simplify your journey, regardless of the time and distance.



#### MEAL PREP FOR YOUR DOG

If you're on a weeklong trip in remote areas, the odds of finding a quality performance dog food, such as Purina Pro Plan SPORT Performance 30/20 Formula, may be challenging. Preportion your dog's food so you have an ample supply. You'll likely feed your dog slightly more than usual during a multiday event, so be sure to pack extra. A good rule of thumb to gauge a dog's food consumption is one pound of food per dog per day.

#### **BRING YOUR OWN WATER**

A change in water source, especially going from hard to soft water, can upset your dog's GI system, increasing his or her risk of diarrhea and potentially causing dehydration and overheating. Bring several gallons of water from home as a consistent source, or use bottled water while traveling.

#### **STOCK UP ON FIRST-AID ESSENTIALS**

Canine first aid is crucial when you're far from a veterinarian. Brush up on your basic knowledge of performing first aid and replenish your kit with these BONUS: THE ONE THING TO NEVER supplies: absorbent gauze pads, elastic bandages, tape, tweezers, antiseptic, antibiotic ointment, antihistamine, saline solution, and any veterinarian-prescribed or recommended medications.

#### **BUILD AN INSURANCE POLICY**

Research veterinarians who can treat hardworking dogs that are located every couple of hundred miles along your planned route and near your final destination. You should also look for 24/7 emergency veterinary clinics if you'll be traveling at night. Jot

on the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA) website, www.ofa.org. If you wish to obtain a thyroid clearance from the OFA, you must have your veterinarian submit a special blood sample to a lab recognized by OFA. There are only seven labs recognized in the United States. A list of the recognized labs and their sample submission requirements can be seen at: https://www.ofa.org/diseases/otherdiseases/ hypothyroidism/thyroid-labs.

So, why should we care about thyroid? There are several NAVHDA breeds reported in the database from the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA) that have a statistically significant occurrence of hypothyroidism. If a breed is not recognized by the AKC, there may not be statistics in this database. Since this is a heritable condition, careful testing and breeding of dogs prior to breeding at annual or semi annual intervals to ensure dogs remain thyroid disease free is needed.

In reviewing the above table, for those breeds with more than 50 dogs tested, there is anywhere from 78.6% - 89.7% of the population with a normal thyroid result. Occurrences of autoimmune thyroiditis are 2.2 - 9.3% of the population. The remaining 6 - 16.7% of dogs with equivocal results may develop hypothyroidism in the future.

Hypothyroidism, if not detected early, can effect your dog's quality of life, health and ability to hunt. Although treatable with relatively inexpensive lifelong medication, annual or semiannual blood testing can cost an owner an average of \$200-300 per blood panel, several thousand dollars over a dog's lifetime.



## **YEAR-ROUND TRAVEL TIPS** FOR SPORTING DOGS

Every destination has unique packing requirements. For example, if you're headed to Montana, you may want to bring a quill removable jig and needle-nosed pliers in case your dog comes across a porcupine, or if you're crossing into Canada, you'll need a veterinarian-signed copy of your dog's rabies vaccination, as well as a health certificate for puppies 8 months of age and younger, to get through customs hassle-free.

#### **BRAKE FOR REST AREAS**

Map out rest areas along your route that are situated away from traffic and suitable for dog airing. Some Cabela's locations even have a reserved area for dogs. Plan to stop every couple of hours to air and exercise your dog on a leash, and know that puppies may need more frequent breaks.

#### DON'T SKIMP ON STAKE OUTS

Bring enough tie-out cables and stakes for as many dogs as you're traveling with so that in case of emergency, such as a vehicle breakdown, your dogs are secure while you tend to the situation at hand.

#### MIND YOUR P'S & Q'S

Basic obedience is important at all times, but especially during travel. Avoid accidents, such as your dog being hit by a car or getting into diesel fuel or antifreeze, by training your dog to "stay" when you open the vehicle door or dog box. It's also a good idea to keep your dog on lead in busy areas. If you find a safe, remote area to air your dog off lead, make sure you can stay in control of your dog and clean up any mess.

### A LEAVE HOME WITHOUT

You should always pack a thermometer in your first-aid kit, especially during summer travel. If you're worried about your dog overheating, stop and take his or her temperature. If it's as high as 107 degrees Fahrenheit, get your dog into the shade and cool him or her down, making sure the temperature comes down. If it doesn't, take your dog to a veterinarian right away.

# NAVHDA INTERNATIONAL MEMBERSHIP IS, AND HAS BEEN, By Tim Otto Flemington, New Jersey REQUIRED FOR ALL LOCAL CHAPTER MEMBERS

n our March Issue, Marilyn Vetter wrote a beautiful and touching piece reflecting on the contributions of our past President Joe Dolejsi, and in the same issue she wrote a separate article regarding the importance of being a member of the NAVHDA parent organization, commonly referred to as NAVHDA International. In that short article, Marilyn quoted from one of the many President's Messages Joe had published in the VHD, a small portion of which I'll repeat here:

"In the past, I have written on the importance of every chapter member being an International member. Not only is it mandated in our bylaws, but it is only reasonable that all who benefit should also pay their fair share in the cost of providing the benefits. "~ Joe Dolejsi, VHD, June 2004.

Perhaps not surprisingly, many people are unaware of this policy – (confession here: I've been a member for 18 years and was unaware of it until I joined the board last year) and there was little emphasis on enforcing it. So, for those of you who, like me, don't always read the fine print, here is a copy of the relevant section of the NAVHDA International Bylaws.

NAVHDA Bylaws, Article VI, Section 6.02. ORGANIZA-**TION.** A local chapter may organize in any form suited to its function and in conformity with local laws and regulations governing non-profit organizations, and may elect chapter officers and assess chapter dues. Every member of a chapter must be a member of the corporation (i.e. the NAVHDA parent organization, aka NAVHDA International).

As I mentioned above, the issue of International membership for all local chapter members was not a primary emphasis for NAVHDA until recently, around the time that we made two new policies regarding membership. In case vou've forgotten, they were: 1) that nonmembers must sign a "Release Agreement" to participate in any meaningful way in NAVHDA events (see April VHD and announcements on our Facebook page March 4th for details), and 2) beginning

July 1, 2018, all handlers and owners must be members of NAVHDA International in order to run a dog in any NAVH-DA-sanctioned test (announced in the March issue of the VHD and on our Facebook page March 25th). Since those announcements have been made we have received a surprising number of emails, phone calls, and Facebook messages questioning not only the policies themselves, but whether nonmembers can sign a Release Agreement for a year so that they can train regularly at their local chapter without joining International. This is NOT what the Release Agreement is for – I will again refer you to the April issue of the VHD for that discussion. If you are training regularly at your local chapter and (presumably) are a chapter member, you need to also join NAVHDA International. Not just because it's in the bylaws, but because it's the right thing to do. Chapters wouldn't exist without International, and the dues that members pay to International support many programs and expenses that, in turn, support local chapters and their members. For example, your dues pay the salaries for our tremendous office staff and the computer equipment/software required to run the day-to-day operations of NAVHDA, and to keep our testing and registry databases up to date and available to anyone interested (in addition to countless other thousands of tasks the office staff do that go unheralded). Through your dues, International also pays part of the cost for all Handlers Clinics and for printing and dissemination of the Aims, Programs, and Test Rules booklet. Finally, your dues are an important source of funding for several of our youth programs. This is obviously only a small portion of the expenses that NAVHDA International incurs to support local chapters.

From a practical perspective, ensuring that all chapter members are also members of NAVHDA International is impossible except at the Local Chapter level. Chapter officers, we're looking to you to ensure that all of your chapter members are also members of NAVHDA International. This might be incorporated into your membership form. And on a purely practical level, think about all the Release Agreements you won't have to file!

Also, when attaching documents to the International office email for registrations, please attach a pdf file. 


