ARCHERY NEWS

Two IKAC shoots have been held in the last month. The first was on 21 March at Aachenfeld training. 14 archers completed this shoot all in open division. The top scorers were Catherine de Arc 129, Nathan Blacktower 118 and Richard of Aachenfeld 106. The second IKAC was held on 3 April at Autumn Gathering in Balingup. 17 archers completed this shoot, all in open division. The finish was quite a close-fought contest between Aneala's current and previous champions of the bow. The current champion prevailed. Richard of Aachenfeld scored 111, Edmund Kerr 104 and Sorcha 88.

Well done to all the participants – your scores have been added to the tournament results pages on the Aneala website - and thanks to the assistant line-marshals, Alianore de Essewell and Richard of Aachenfeld. The scores for all IKAC shoots in the region are being collated. At the end of the season we will be awarding prizes to the best and most improved archers. The best archer prize will be allocated on the basis of the best average of their 3 best scores.

Upcoming shoots:

On Sunday 2nd May, in honour of the Royal Visit by their Majesties Bran and Lilya, there will be a Royal Round at Aachenfeld training, Lake Monger Primary School. The range will be open for practice from 10.00 am. The list will close and the competition start at 10.30am. If there is time and interest we will follow this with a King's Round and/or some other novelty shoot. This shoot will be in the form of a purse shoot, the entry fee being 2 gold. Garb is not required.

On Sunday 16th May, there will be an IKAC shoot at Aachenfeld Training, starting at 10am. All archers must be present and signed into the list by 9.45am for the 10am start.

On Sunday 6th June, there will be an IKAC shoot at Pencampwr gan Abertridwr. The List will open Saturday afternoon, all archers must be present and signed in by 8.45am Sunday morn for the 9am start.

Pencampwr is by far the biggest and best weekend on the western shores of Lochac and endeavors to be bigger yet again this year so don't miss out,....

Pencampwr Arobryn Theme—Pageantry

The reason for choosing this theme is that we as a group have discussed on a regular basis at various meetings that we want to enhance the look and feel of Pencampwr and Abertridwr as a whole. So to this end I thought a set of competitions based around this enhancement would help promote and encourage that desire. Note: the categories I've chosen are not intended to be limited or limiting, each one allows for different techniques, materials and ideas.

Besides the categories, I've also included the rules of the Arobryn to give everyone a heads up as to what is expected in the competition. Note the entries listed with the letters a, b and c are examples only. So if you think something else will fit in that category then by all means do it.

Category:

- 1. List Field banner - This can be either your own personal banner, that of your consort or for someone you admire.*
- 2. Hall or Pavilion decoration*
 - a. Hanging - e.g. made from fabric or decorated wood*
 - b. Chair cover*
 - c. Heraldic Table Runner*
- 3. Subtlety - must be Heraldic and must be able to be placed at one end of the hall and seen from the other*
- 4. Royalty at Pencampwr*
 - a. A Book or Book cover for the Royal Herald*
 - b. A woodwork piece - e.g. decorated bowl, small table*
 - c. Carpet/floor covering - e.g. Printed or painted*
- 5. Helmet crest - for use at demos, either worn by a fighter as part of a parade or as a display piece on a spare helm.*
- 6. Shield or Tabard - The shield should show period decorative techniques (it won't be used for fighting). The tabard can be heraldic or non-heraldic.*
- 7. Open - This can be anything a person deems would enhance the pageantry of an event or demo.*

Kingdom A&S Competitions

Midwinter 2010* (Barony of Ildhafn): A carved item (email entries are encouraged if there is an issue with quarantine), Dance - (reconstruction details tbc), gardening - a treatise on the properties of a perfumed plant (in the style of Culpepper)

November Crown 2010: Lace making, Glass - an item of glassware or stained glass, Aprons for working people (ie, craftspeople, smiths, cooks)

12th Night 2011: Illumination - a bestiary, Textiles - a hand-woven item (excluding narrow wares) Preserves - dried or sugared fruit

May Crown 2011: A cloak (any time period or style), Tudor or Elizabethan jewellery, An item used on a hunt

Midwinter 2011: Linens (table cloths or hand towels), A Seal of your Barony, Shire, Canton or College, Jousting equipment

I would humbly ask that you seek to promote the competitions in your group, by making people aware of them, possibly having a workshop day in relation to an item, helping to point people in the right direction for research, etc. As a reminder, email submissions are fine (ie, if the item is too bulky to transport, or there are quarantine issues). If it is a research paper, it should be sent to the KMOAS two weeks in advance. Dates are to be finalised and they will be advertised in upcoming Pegasus.
