Working Together to Achieve a Dream



Elizabeth Koranek has grown up in the Virginia 4-H program being an active member in the Madison 4-H program for nine years. This summer she achieved the honor of being tapped as a 4-H All-Star. While at Virginia 4-H Congress at Virginia Tech for the All-Star tapping ceremony during State 4-H Congress, Elizabeth met Bineta Guisse, Gender and 4-H Coordinator and Outreach Officer – USAID-ERA in Senegal, Africa. Bineta shared her story about coming to Virginia a few years earlier, learning about the 4-H program, and helping organize 4-H in her country with Elizabeth. The Senegalese youth planted gardens and sold the produce to build a community center for their 4-H club and their village. Hearing Bineta's enthusiasm for her work with the Senegalese youth touched Elizabeth. As a newly tapped All-Star, she wanted to be of service to the Senegal 4-H project. Service is one of the core principles of the Virginia 4-H All-Star organization. She asked her 4-H Agent, Kelly Mallory, if she could donate the proceeds from the sale of her 4-H lamb project to the 4-H

Senegal project. She wanted to help the Senegalese youth achieve their goal of completing the community center for 4-H Youth Development programming. In July, at the Madison County Fair Livestock Auction, the local community supported Elizabeth's effort. Her lamb was bought by Weaver Works of Madison for \$2, 331.00 and the money went to the Virginia 4-H Foundation to benefit the Senegal 4-H project.

It all started with Ozzie Abaye, *Professor*, Crop Soil Environmental Science and a USAID/ERA grant project working with Senegal agriculture, family farms and communities. When Ozzie and Bineta visited the villages to work with farmers, many children would come to see and listen, thus, a need for youth involvement, agriculture and life skill development was recognized. Ozzie introduced Bineta to 4-H Specialists at Virginia Tech who shared about Virginia's 4-H positive youth development program.

You will visit the Fighter Factory where the repair, upkeep, and restoration of the magnificent warbirds are performed. Virginia Aquarium and Marine Science Center

The Virginia Aquarium & Marine Science Center is Virginia's largest aquarium, displays the state's various aquatic and marine environments throughout time, and features more than 800,000 gallons of aquarium and live animal exhibits. With more than 300 hands-on exhibits, visitors experience the wonders of harbor seals, river otters, sea turtles, sharks, seahorses, an aviary and more. Must sees" include the Harbor Seal Pool, an IMAX® 3D Theatre and a one-third mile-long nature trail that connects to an outdoor aviary offering an up-close glimpse of the marsh birds. Enjoy scenery on the 10-minute walk on the Owls Creek Path that meanders through salt marsh and woodland preserve between the Aquarium's main building and Marsh Pavilion (additional building with exhibits). Climb the 30-foot observation tower to get a view of Owls Creek from tree-top level. On the other hand, you may wish to drive to the Marsh Pavilion if the weather is uncomfortable. In 2013 Bineta participated in a 4-H Study tour experiencing first-hand the Virginia 4-H program and its impacts. She participated in 4-H Teen Counselor Training, 4-H Camp, Virginia 4-H Strategic Planning, and State 4-H Congress interacting with 4-H Volunteers, 4-H teens and youth, 4-H Specialists and parents. After her return home, Bineta remarked, "You were remarkable! I have learned so many things from every one of you… I must admit that I owe you and so does my country! Thinking of you makes me feel strong because you made me a new person…and I can feel the difference!"

"I really do not think I will forget this for the rest of my life."



In 2014 Kaitlyn Smith, a College of Agriculture and Life Sciences student, participated in the Senegal study abroad program visiting villages, farms, working with Senegalese youth and learning about their culture while sharing ours. Kaitlyn took 4-H youth development items for Bineta and conducted 4-H activities with youth thus planting the 4-H seed.

Virginia 4-H started working with Bineta Guisse to develop a positive youth development program for Senegalese youth in 2015 under the lead of Dr. Kathleen Jamison, *Professor Emerita Extension Specialist 4-H Youth Development with Dr. Tom Archibald who conducted the first 4-H training to organize 4-H clubs in villages. In 2016, Kathleen and Extension Agents, 4-H Youth Development Ruth Wallace and Reggie Morris conducted additional 4-H training for volunteers from the villages, university and the Peace Corp to organize more youth groups.* Three youth groups planted gardens and sold the produce to build a community center to for meetings. They needed \$2000 - \$3000 of additional funds for doors, windows, tables, chairs, pots and pans, etc. to complete "The 4-H Community Center".

Virginia 4-H made the decision in early 2016 to raise funds to help support the 4-H community center project in Senegal. Virginia 4-H clubs, the 4-H Cabinet, the "Cents for Senegal" fundraiser at 4-H Congress, the silent auction, and business and individual donations generated over \$7,000 for the Senegal 4-H Center. This joint endeavor helped connect Virginia 4-H and the Senegal 4-H youth groups.
