





Two Safety Final Rules, Different but Related

- Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)
 Revises existing regulation (23 CFR 924)
- Safety Performance Measures
 - Establishes new regulation (23 CFR 490) to implement MAP-21 Performance Management Requirements
 - Defines safety performance management requirements



Major Provisions in the HSIP Final Rule

- Items Removed (no longer exist under MAP-21)
 - Transparency Report
 - 10% flexibility provision for States to use safety funding per 23 U.S.C. 148(e)
- Items Added
 - State Strategic Highway Safety Plan update requirements
 - Performance based with emphasis areas and action plans
 - Subset of model inventory of roadway elements
 - To enable advanced safety analysis on all public roadways



Major Provisions in the Safety Performance Measures Final Rule

- 5 performance Measures
- Institutes the process for State DOTs and MPOs to establish & report on their targets
- Institutes the process for FHWA to assess whether a State has met or made significant Progress
- A common national definition for serious injuries
- Alignment of measures between FHWA, NHTSA, DOTs, SHSPs, and MPOs.
