IAW flushing water system in Charlestown through April 8



Construction for new treatment facility to start mid 2021

Indiana American Water (IAW) will be flushing the Charlestown water system through April 5. Since purchasing the Charlestown water system in March 2019, IAW has invested more than \$4 million on upgrades. They have also announced they will be building a new treatment facility to filter iron and manganese from its ground water source. Construction on the facility is planned to get started mid 2021 with a projected completion planned for next summer. A portable filtration unit will also be placed in April 2021 to provide improvements in water quality until the new facility is in service.

In addition to the investments above, IAW proactively flushes water mains to enhance water quality by removing sediments and minerals from the distribution system. IAW plans to flush water mains in Charlestown at least twice a year and more in specific areas

flushing took place in Fall of 2020.

The flushing will be taking place between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. over the next month. During this time, motorist may see crews flushing hydrants when driving; they are asked to drive carefully through the area where they are working. To help provide clean water they will install a tanker of water at the Greenway Park parking lot off of Market Streetso that residents can fill empty water containers..

Residents may wish to delay running their dishwasher and doing laundry until the crews are finished water could be discolored. If laundry is discolored due to accidentally running laundry during flushing:

*Do not put the clothing in dryer *Do not use bleach as it will intensify stains

as needed. The most recent system *Do rewash clothing immediately using more detergent or a heavy duty detergent

> *Do add a rust remover to the load Although, discolored water is safe to drink, individuals may wish to draw water and store in the refrigerator for drinking and

> cooking ahead of time.
>
> IAW recommends if residents encounter discolored water, letting a cold water faucet run for a few minutes to see if water runs clear. (Always do this with cold water to ensure sediment is not introduced into the hot water tank.) If possible, also use the cold water faucet on the bathtub or an outside faucet to flush discolored water from your plumbing systems.

Barn fire extinguished after trash fire spreads

Monroe Township Fire Department was dispatched to a barn fire on the afternoon of March 8 on Henryville-Otisco Rd. Michael L. Glover

An Elizabethtown, Kentucky man was arrested for attempted rape on Thursday, March 11 after Indiana State Police stopped to investigate a truck stopped in the roadway.

Just before seven o'clock Thursday evening, Sgt. Matt Marshall from the Indiana State Police post in Sellersburg responded to the 21.9 milemarker on I-65 northbound after a 911 caller reported a truck stopped partially in the roadway just south of the northbound rest park. The caller said they had almost collided with the pickup truck, which was hard to see because it had no headlights or taillights activated.

Sgt. Marshall approached the truck, which at first glance appeared to be abandoned. However, inside the truck, Sgt Marshall observed a male lying on top of an unconscious female. The female was unclothed from the waist down, and it appeared the man was attempting to sexually assault her.

Sgt. Marshall knocked on the window, and the man, identified as Michael L. Glover,38, of Elizabethtown, Kentucky, attempted to re-secure his pants

as he stepped from the vehicle. Sgt. Marshall observed open alcoholic containers in the pickup and believed Glover to be intoxicated. Medical personnel were called to the scene for the female who remained unconscious.

As a result of the investigation, Sgt. Marshall learned Glover could not identify the woman correctly. Sgt. Marshall also learned that Glover and the victim were new acquaintances, and Glover had possibly given the victim a drink after asking her to ride to a local grocery store in Elizabethtown, Kentucky. The investigation also revealed the victim was unable to recall how or why she was found in Indiana.



Clark County Obituaries

Sellersburg Indiana died peacefully on Monday, March 8 in the company of his children

Cecil was born in Highland Park Dale Michigan on February 23, 1920, the son of Nora Emerson Thurman and William Rufus Thurman, and lived his early childhood in Chapeze, Kentucky, and near Georgetown, and Greenville, Indiana. The family later Brennan Usowski, Charlotte Dabney, relocated to Johnson County Indiana, where he graduated as one of six (6) from Clark High School.

Cecil was emblematic of the greatest generation, having lived both during the depression, and then serving his country in WWII. His military service began with induction into the U.S. Army in October 1941, followed by basic training at Army camps in Indiana and Georgia. Then as part of the 34th. Infantry Division, 168th. Infantry Regiment he shipped out to Northern Ireland and Scotland for combat training. In November 1942, Operation Torch, the first major amphibious landing of WWII was launched in North Africa. As part of the Eastern landing force in Algeria, Cecil was seriously holds numerous awards including the Purple Heart, two (2) bronze Combat Infantryman's Badge. After a lengthy recovery in North African and North Carolina, he was discharged in December 1944.

to his wife of 74 years, Bertha IN, "Lucky" Luckett Thurman who predeceased him in December 2018. Characteristically of this loving father and husband, he drove each day to the nursing home to visit her for over five (5) years.

His life was characterized by hard work, including as a young adult, working on the family farm and in tobacco fields, and helping pick tomatoes on a one hundred acre plot. Later Cecil enjoyed a successful Boger; grandson, Jacob Boger. career in the wholesale hardware business working for Belknap Hardware as a sales representative and buyer for over 25 years. Never content to be idle, he continued to work in the "hardware' business he knew and loved, most recently with Sellersburg Hardware and Lumber, Boger Ministries, 4222 Highland finally retiring at age 85. Cecil also Oakes Drive, New Albany, IN 47150 enjoyed gardening, home projects, University basketball, Indiana watching NASCAR, and all things Hoosier.

Revered by his family, Cecil was the patriarch of five generations including his four children, daughter Catharine Thurman Gillespie, and sons Donald Wayne, Cecil Daniel, and David Martin. He was also loving "Papa" to, four grandchildren, three enjoyed hunting, fishing, Westerns great grandchildren, and three great great grandchildren.

He was proceeded in death by his parents, three sisters, one brother and one great granddaughter.




