Ask a Refugee



In conjunction with the annual Welcoming Week initiative, the September Issues That Matter Series highlighted a local refugee. The "Ask a Refugee" program featured an amazing speaker, Felicien. Felicien is originally from the Democratic Republic of the Congo, but he left at age 11 due to war and persecution, and traveled to Angola, and then on to Zambia, where he was in a refugee camp from 1997-2015. He shared with us his inspiring story of the life-threatening experiences in the Congo, challenges of life in a refugee camp, and the five-year vetting process to emigrate. Among his many skills, Felicien speaks seven languages including Swahili and English, and served as an interpreter while in the camp. Now residing in Largo with his family, Felicien holds down two jobs, actively gives back to the community, and helps to serve and support others. We were honored to have Felicien here to share his story.

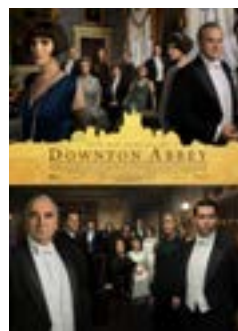

Welcoming Week is a national celebration where communities bring together immigrants and local residents in a spirit of unity to build strong connections and affirm the benefits of welcoming everyone. We believe our communities are stronger when everyone feels welcome, and we work together for the common good. In 2018, there were over 2,000 events in 400 cities around the country.

Largo Public Library participated in this national celebration for the first time two years ago, and we did it again this year! From household items and monetary donations to raffles and more, there were plenty of ways for you to join us in the Welcoming movement.

In 2019, we joined over 50,000 people across the United States and the world to promote inclusiveness, unity, and diversity. Largo Public Library's award-winning Welcoming Week Basket Drive collected 171 baskets and \$531 in monetary donations. The donations were distributed to Pinellas County refugee families on October 5, 2019. The families come from Cuba, Haiti, Venezuela, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Afghanistan, Colombia, Egypt, Ethiopia, and Ukraine. We celebrate diversity and acknowledge the invaluable contributions these immigrant families make to their communities and the country as a whole.

A big thank you to our partners, Barbara S. Ponce Public Library and UMC Suncoast. Without them, the basket drive wouldn't have been possible.

Teen Volunteer Spotlight

I am a part of the TLC at the library which stands for Teen Library Council. In this organization we, as a group, have our roles and work together to invent projects and ideas to help with anything that may need attention in our community.
