5. Make the days 25 hours long

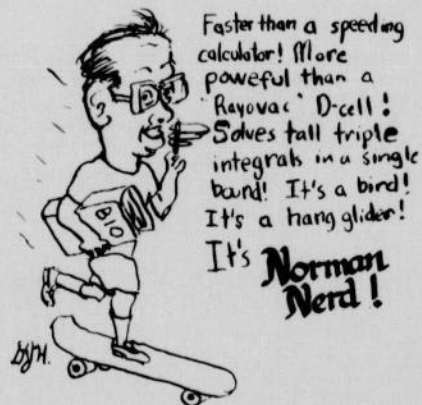
These are our demands. We will be in touch."
