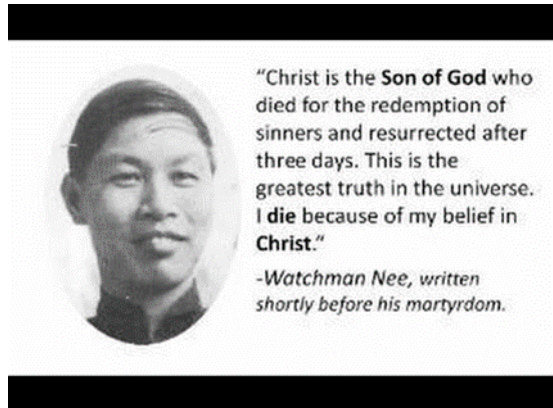

Watchman Nee was born in 1903 in Swatow, China as an answer to his mother's prayer. Having already borne two daughters, she prayed that if God should give her a son, she would give him back to God. As the boy grew up, he showed every sign of promise except he had no interest in things spiritual. It was not till he was seventeen years of age that he was met by the Lord. He knew at that time that he must accept Christ Jesus as his Savior, yet he struggled over the necessity of surrendering his life to the Lord. The love of Christ finally overwhelmed him and he capitulated to Christ. This was on April 29, 1920. He had such a love for the Word of God that he studied it almost incessantly, so within a very short period he had read the whole Bible several times. He began to witness for Christ to his school mates and soon earned the nickname of "the preacher". In searching the Scripture, he (with a few other believers) discovered 'the simplicity and purity that is towards Christ.' He determined to follow the Word of God explicitly and nothing but the Word.

In 1927 he began his life work in Shanghai, where he was able to practice the vision which the Lord had shown him in the Word. He understood that the eternal purpose of God is Christ and His Church. Through the mighty working of the Holy Spirit and the faithful ministry of this servant of God, this testimony spread over the vast land of China.

In 1949 the Communists took over China. Knowing what would be waiting for him back home, he nonetheless felt strongly his responsibility toward God and His Church. So he returned to China from Hong Kong in 1950. In April of 1952 he was seized and put in prison. He was later falsely accused as a master spy and was sentenced to twenty years of imprisonment. In prison he was not allowed to do anything but what was assigned him by prison authority. At the expiration of his sentence term, he was not released, and the news arrived quickly that he died faithful to the Lord.

I am serving a two-year term as president of the UMC Council of Bishops. But my primary work is as bishop as the Florida Conference. Some of what is happening lately:

1. We have our largest **ordination** class in many years, 17 persons to be ordained deacons and elders at Annual Conference. Of these, 10 are women and 7 are men. God is sending laborers into the harvest.

2. Two years ago one-half of the Bishop's Offering at Annual Conference went to **ZOE** (zoeempowers.org) That amount, \$37,000 was multiplied with the addition of 12 challenge gifts of \$3000 each, for a total of \$73,000. Over 1000 new youth are in the ZOE program thanks to these gifts.

3. We now have 235 **Fresh Expressions of Church**. And we are in the beginning phase of our Dinner Church movement, so this number will increase in the months to come. This is a five-year old movement in our conference. Thanks to Dan Jackson, Heather McKelvey Evans, Caitlin White, and Michael Beck.

4. Our **apportionment giving** in 2018 to the denomination was 89%, the highest in years, and Florida's apportionment is the second largest in the denomination.

5. We have not avoided the **complex and essential conversations about LGBTQ identity and the unity of the church**. Over 200 of our churches have participated in the POV process, which was designed by progressives, centrists and traditionalists. The next POV conversation, now in design, will be about race.

6. Over 120 churches will offer an **On Mission Together weekend** this spring, which is an opportunity to offer an invitation to receive the saving grace of God, to have deep conversation and authentic fellowship, to be in service with our neighbors and to design a small group follow-up for those who accept the gospel for the first time or renew their faith commitments.

7. Esther Rodríguez, Jose Nieves, Clarke Campbell-Evans and Rini Hernandez offered a new vision for **Latino/a Ministry** for the Florida Conference in our recent cabinet meeting. This will focus on reaching multiple generations who are coming to live in Florida, and being more open to their gifts.



GOOD NEWS!

New Church Start Update from Bishop Carter: The Florida Conference has launched eleven churches over the past four years. On Easter Sunday these new congregations had a combined worship attendance of 4614, with over 400 of these being children.

I'm grateful to those who have stepped out in faith to lead these new churches, reaching new people, and to Dan Jackson, who has guided our work in new church development. This is alongside the 235 new Fresh Expressions of Church, which is a different form of outreach.

Taken together, this is a movement of God that takes risks, imagines the unseen, and is led day to day by cloud and fire (Exodus 13).

Rini Hernandez will take on the leadership of new church development (Dan will continue to guide the Fresh Expressions), and Rini will also shepherd a new initiative in Latino/a ministries, which will have a focus on multi-generational congregations.

I share this for two reasons: To give all praise and thanks to God; and to counter the relentlessly negative narrative about the United Methodist Church.

God is good. God is using us. God is writing a better story. And God is blessing us.

I love our annual conference. These are just some of the God sightings!

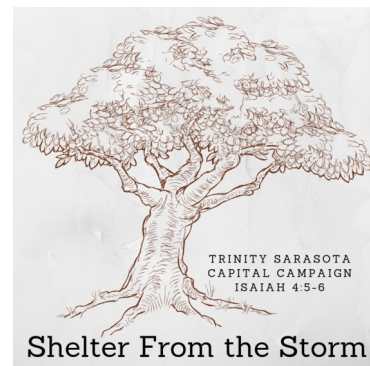
The Church Parking Lot will be closed for asphalt repairs on Thursday, June 6, Friday, June 7, and Saturday, June 8.

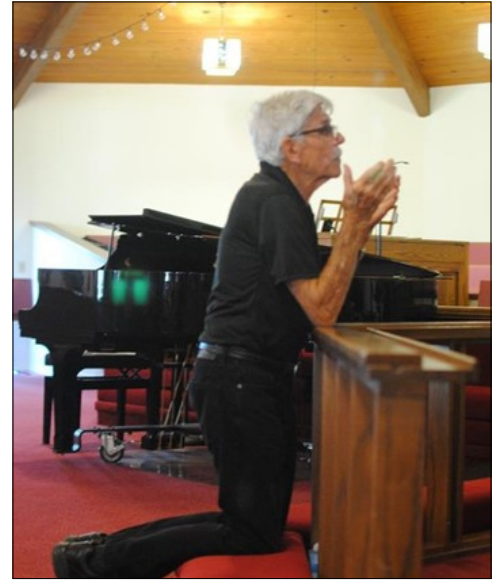
