General Membership Meeting Minutes – November 2nd, 2011

<u>Chris Peltier/Keith Erdman:</u> Motion to approve the minutes as printed in the Multi-Laker. **Motion Carried Unanimously.** <u>Matt Philippart/ Mick McCanham:</u> Motion to approve the Treasurers report as printed in the Multi-Laker. **Motion Carried Unanimously**.

CHAPLINS REPORT (by Russ)

PRESIDENTS REPORT


At these practices you will use Single Action 45 Colt/38Spl. pistols, lever action rifles & 12/20/410

Wow. I was not nearly as lucky as Paige, but I'm still very happy with this nice little six point. It was right at the end of shooting time November 16th on Bios Blanc Island. I had several doe around me and suddenly they all ran off. I figured that

was it for the day, but just then another doe came trotting in & stopped with its head in front of a birch tree – that's when I could see that "doe" has horns!
