


Smoking Or No Smoking? <u>Its Been Decided!</u> NON-SMOKING



On June 27th, 2016 at 7:55 PM the votes were counted for the motion to <u>ban the use of</u> <u>all tobacco products including vaping</u> in the Fredericksburg Elks Lodge facilities. Exactly 134 votes were counted with 73 ballots for non-tobacco use including vaping, 47 voted against the motion and 14 did not vote which is counted as a vote against the motion. Total tally was 73 – 61 in favor of eliminating the use of tobacco products and vaping in the Lodge facilities. So there you have it. The membership has voted. The smoking ban will take effect once the amendment to the bylaws is approved by the Grand Lodge which on average is about 30 days. The Trustees have been and will continue to be busy working on a plan to build a very nice area for the tobacco users to enjoy their tobacco products. In the meantime, I will work with the Trustees to provide a covered area for the tobacco users to use as a temporary measure.


