

We Prepare

Lent is the pentitential season of the church year. During this time we look inward at our spiritual lives and take inventory. What have we left undone? What can we do to go deeper in our relationship with the Divine?

We begin our worship services this season by confessing our sin and receiving our forgiveness before we even exchange the peace of God with our sisters and brothers.

We Worship

This text from Psalm 118 was made popular with another tune written in 1967. This version gives the old tune a little bit of a lift and opens our worship with joy and celebration.

We Hear the Word

The devil tests Jesus' commitment to God's commission. The central issue in the three temptations concerns who will determine Jesus' actions. Does God or does Satan? Will Jesus remain faithful to God's will? The temptations recall Israel's struggle to be faithful in the wilderness. Jesus authoritatively dismisses the devil. He receives God's care through angels.



Opening Essay

Unmeasurable Results

As you read this, chances are there is one deadline or another hanging over you. Maybe you have some bills that are due by a certain date. Perhaps a work project must be completed by tomorrow morning at 9:00 am. Or has your partner strategically placed a "honey do" list on your pillow, right next to the chocolate?

Deadlines are measurable. You either meet the deadline or you don't. We can also measure our bank accounts, how much gas is in our tank, how many hours we spend watching television, or whether or not we walked the three mile loop at Memorial Park.

We live with much focus and pressure around measurable results. Many people check on the stock market several times a day. Much of our life is about being goal-driven and purpose-driven.

This is also true at Resurrection MCC. What's the first place some people look when they receive the weekly bulletin upon entering worship? The General Fund Financial Report. My monthly report to the Board of Directors is a status report on my goals as Senior Pastor.

Results, goals and purpose are a good thing. Yet they are not the only thing. When Jesus prevailed against the temptations that faced him in the wilderness, he drew on inner spiritual character that came from a deeper place than checklists, charts, calendars, files or goal-tracking software.

How does one measure wisdom? How do you chart maturity? How can spirit, truth, or soul be quantified?

Yes, Lent is a forty day countdown. Yet our greatest calling is not to count the days, which can be measured, but to open ourselves to the character of Christ which is beyond measure.

Lenten Season

This is the Church's most serious penitential season. During this time of year we look inward to our struggles and work outward to help those in need. In many traditions congregants 'give up' something during the season of Lent. At Resurrection and other MCC congregations we ask people to **take up** something. For example:

Take up fasting one meal or snack everyday and spend that time in prayer for peace in our world; growth in our church; and/ or the feeding of the homeless.

Take up volunteering for a new ministry as a trail for the season of Lent (46 days). We have many ministries here at Resurrection that could use more volunteers. Contact Jason Wood for moreinformation.jwood@resurrectionmcc.org

Take up tithing 10% of your income to the church for just these 6weeks of Lent. This will unleash the gift of generosity in your own life as well as the life of Resurrection. It is interesting to note that if just two hundred people took up tithing during this 6 week period, we would take up approximately \$100,000. That would mean the ministry goals we have for 2008 would be well on their way to fruition and we would not have any deficit

way to fruition and we would not have any deficit. **Take up participation** in the "Grow-up" portion of each week's bulletin, reading all the scriptures in a daily devotional time.
