CHASING THE MOON CELEBRATES 50 YEARS SINCE THE MOON LANDING

Monday-Wednesday, July 8-10, 9-11 p.m.


In American Experience's upcoming series, viewers will experience the thrilling era of the space race, from its earliest days to the 1969 moon landing. *Chasing the Moon* features a fascinating mix of scientific innovation, political calculation, media spectacle, and personal drama. This summer, the series brings the Space Age to vivid life.

Chasing the Moon thoroughly reimagines the race to the moon for a new generation, upending much of the conventional mythology surrounding the effort. The three-part series recasts the Space Age as a fascinating stew of scientific innovation and PR savvy; political calculation and media spectacle; and visionary impulses and personal drama. With no narration and using only archival footage—including a visual feast of previously lost or overlooked material—the film features new interviews with a diverse cast of characters who played key roles in these historic events.

Among those included are astronauts Buzz Aldrin, Frank Borman, and Bill Anders; Freeman Dyson, the renowned futurist and theoretical physicist; Sergei Khrushchev, the son of former Soviet premier Nikita Khrushchev, who played a prominent role in the Soviet space program as a rocket engineer; Poppy Northcutt, the 25-year-old “mathematics whiz” who gained worldwide attention as the first woman to serve in the all-male bastion of NASA's Mission Control; and Ed Dwight, the Air Force pilot selected by the Kennedy administration to train as America's first black astronaut.

While other documentaries have largely painted a familiar narrative of goals set, obstacles overcome, disasters averted, and missions accomplished, *Chasing the Moon* tells a vastly more entertaining and surprising story. As the film reveals, the drive to land a man on the moon was fueled as much by politics as it was by technology and was a controversial undertaking during a volatile time.



MOON MUSIC

Jupiter and Saturn have sixty-some moons each. Mars has only two small moons, while Venus and Mercury are moonless. Earth has but one moon, of course, but ours is haunting and magical. Our moon is close and big and bright, and the combination of its distance from Earth and its size allow for the occasional awe-inspiring eclipse of the sun. It's a safe assumption that for as long as there have been humans, we have looked up at the moon in wonder. And probably for just as long, we have made verse and music about the moon.

Moon music abounds in every culture, from American popular song—rhyming “moon,” “June,” and “croon”—to delicate, impressionistic music from the Far East to lush classical compositions. In the latter category are some of the best-known pieces in the repertoire, frequently heard

on our stations. For example, there is Claude Debussy's limpid “Clair de Lune,” which captures the magic of a moonlit night like few other works. In Dvorak's opera *Rusalka*, the title character does Debussy one better by adding her soaring soprano voice to praise the moon. In *The Merry Wives of Windsor*, the entire chorus sings of the beauty of the bright orb. Then there is the so-called “Moonlight Sonata” by Beethoven, which carries a slightly misleading title: while the first movement suggested moonlight on a lake to the critic who named the piece, the last movement dispels that peaceful image. But no matter. It's just another example of the enduring influence of music on our magical moon.

A DEFINING MOMENT

During my 32 years of teaching, I often told my students that there were very few “defining moments” in their lives—those which would forever be etched into history and that they were witness to. I was fortunate to be in the classroom when the Berlin Wall fell and the 2000 disputed presidential election occurred. I told my students, “You will forever recall this moment in your lives.” For so many Americans, July 20, 1969, will always be their defining moment. It was late that evening when people huddled around their televisions to witness the unthinkable—man walking on the moon. It was a crowning achievement coming only eight years after President Kennedy had challenged Congress to commit itself to a moon landing.

I was 9 years old in 1969 and can still feel the excitement of staying up late with my family and seeing those grainy black and white images of Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin descending the steps of the lunar module. We listened intensely as President Nixon offered his congratulations from the Oval Office. There wasn't a car on the street and every neighbor's lights were on. Clearly, for one brief moment, the entire country sat collectively watching and feeling that we, as a nation, succeeded in something extraordinary. I vividly recall my mother saying, “This is history. You will tell your children about it,” and I did. For 32 years, to classrooms full of kids, I discussed that defining moment in my life. And for a generation, it remains an indelible memory. This month, WHRV FM celebrates the fiftieth anniversary of man landing on

the moon with a series of specials that track the space race, the hard work of so many people at NASA, and the incredible moment that occurred late night July 20, 1969.



Space Tech: The Next Frontier of Jobs

On May 8, 2018, NASA Administrator Jim Bridenstine made the announcement, “We are going to the moon.” NASA’s new program, Artemis, looks to return astronauts to the moon by 2024 with the intention of establishing a habitat to continue scientific explorations and test technologies with their eye toward Mars. As new attention is toward the stars, it may be a good time for youth to consider jobs in this industry, many of which do not require a four-year degree and will provide rewarding careers.

Sam James, a mechanical engineering technician at NASA for 32 years, agrees these are great jobs. He started at NASA in an aerospace and model apprenticeship program. However, though Sam has a four-year degree, which gave him a great start in his job, the program only required an associate’s degree.

Sam enjoys working with world-renowned researchers as he supports the creation and testing on new designs, some of

which may fail and lead to a new design, another test, and so on. Then there is the reward and excitement when a design is successful. Sam was recently involved in the development of an inflatable airlock, which will get astronauts from the capsule to the International Space Station without needing a space suit. Pretty cool!

Skilled Career Options

According to the Bureau of Labor and Statistics, one of the top nine highest paying jobs that does not require a four-year degree is aerospace engineering and operations technician.

Aerospace engineering and operations technicians operate and maintain equipment used in developing, testing, producing, and sustaining new aircraft and spacecraft using computer-based modeling and simulation tools and processes in their work. Mean annual wage in Virginia in 2018: \$75,060. (bls.gov).

Other options are:

- Electro-mechanical technicians operate, test, and maintain unmanned, automated, robotic, or electromechanical equipment.
- Mechanical engineering technicians help mechanical engineers design, develop, test, and manufacture mechanical devices, including tools, engines, machines, and aircraft.

As a parent of two children, Sam feels that other parents may underestimate the value of these jobs. He mentions, “A four-year college is not always the right path for everyone. Community colleges are very powerful and can offer kids a great opportunity to start a rewarding career.” His recommendation: start talking to your kids as early as 7th and 8th grade, but it is never really too late.
