

This year we are pleased to announce a partnership with the New Germany & Area Lions Club. This will allow us to hold all of our Markets at the Lion's park by the beautiful LaHave River. We say a big thank-you to the Club. They are also acquiring a port-a-pottie for our use at the Market.

In an effort to help our organization grow we have come up with a plan that will make it possible for everyone interested in our Market to join. A once per year Membership fee of \$10.00 will allow you access to all of our meetings, with the right to make motions and vote on the future of your Market. This will also allow you to become a vendor for \$5.00 per week, any week you wish to rent a vendor space. Regular vendor space rental will be \$10.00. This will be done on a first come, first served bases. Reservations can be made by calling 644-2153 and confirmations will be given in a return phone call if a message is left.

A Community Table will be available at a small cost for anyone who has a small amount of produce, etc and do not wish to spend the time/monies to rent a vendor space themselves. Jackie MacDonald will be in charge of this part of the Market and information is available in this newsletter.

I, as a Coordinator, will have to register our Market and you, as a vendor, if you are selling certain food items, prepared or fresh, may need to also get a permit. Please read all info carefully to determine if you need a special permit. You will find all info under the heading of Public Markets. Potable water for hand-washing, will be

available on site, within the port-a-pottie.

Our Market will run every Saturday until, and including October 8th. We plan to run from 9 – 12. Vendors, please be ready to sell by 9 am whenever you come to the Market. Please have any required permits visible for myself/ buyers/ Inspectors who may ask for them.

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me, however, only if the answer is not covered in the Guidelines. If anyone is looking at selling food items, of any kind, I am strongly suggesting that you take a Food Handlers course. Check the website above for ones that are currently scheduled for our area.



The Museum opened for the day of the Maple Syrup Festival on April 23rd. A new exhibit on the Christmas Tree industry was opened that day. It features artifacts, photographs, text, videos and a real, live Balsam Fir tree. The exhibit was prepared by the Christmas Tree Growers Association with setting up help from Museum Staff.

Season opening began on May 2nd. On May 8th the "Welcome Back" invitational pot-luck and chinese auction was held in the Community Hall. After a delicious meal several interesting

items were auctioned by Brenton Wagner assisted by Barbara Rhodenizer. Auction items included "Moyle" a wind-action "scarecrow" made by Paul Smith.

Over the winter the Museum's "Senior Memories Project" has been in full swing. A federal New Horizons Grant was awarded in late fall and "the team" has been busy conducting interviews, taking photographs and video recording "memories" from the most senior folks in the area. Overseen by Museum Curator Barbara Wentzell, Marlean Rhodenizer, Dominique Zwicker, Barb Cullen and Donna Finck formed the "team"



that visited 25 "over-eighty" men and women. Stories collected will be published in book form this fall and a book launch will be held at that time. All involved report a very enjoyable and interesting experience.

This is "school visit" season at the Museum. Almost every week at least one school group visits to take part in our popular "hands-on" program which can include quilting, butter and applesauce making, tinsmithing, old time games, card and candle making and doing the scavenger hunt. Curator Barbara Wentzell is proud of her crew of volunteers who make this program possible.




