

The Rev. H. Jeffrey Clements elected bishop of ELCA Northern Illinois Synod

Augustana College, Rock Island, IL – The Rev. H. Jeffrey Clements of Rockford, IL, was elected June 18 to a six-year term as bishop of the Northern Illinois Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election was held during the annual Synod Assembly, June 16-18 on the campus of Augustana College in Rock Island, IL. The Rev. Clements was elected on the 5th ballot with 278 votes to 181 votes for the Rev. Stacie Fidlar, pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church in Rock Island, IL.



"Thank you," said Clements. "I am overwhelmed.... In my term, I promise to utilize the amazing talents of our lay and rostered leaders across this synod, and they *are* amazing. I also want to say that I am honored, humbled, and quite joyful in your confidence, but also fearful of what God has in store. I am acutely aware that I am male, white, and approaching old. It is important to know that you, young and old, male and female, person of color, member of the LGBT community, theologically liberal or theologically conservative, you have a voice in this synod and it will be respected."

Clements has served as Assistant to the Bishop of the Northern Illinois Synod, since 2002. Clements has previously served at First Lutheran Church, Prophetstown, 1990-2002; Immanuel Lutheran Church, Dixon, 1987-1990; St. John's Lutheran Church, rural Elizabeth, 1983-1987; and Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, LaCrescent, MN. 1981-1982.

The bishop-elect earned a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from the University of Illinois at Chicago, and a Master of Divinity from Luther Northwestern Theological Seminary.

The Rev. Dr. Gary M. Wollersheim, current bishop of the ELCA Northern Illinois Synod, has faithfully served three six-year terms and will retire this summer.

Rev. Clements will be installed as bishop Saturday, September 24, at 10am at First Lutheran Church, 225 S 3rd St., Rockford, IL with a reception to follow at Our Savior's Lutheran Church, 3300 Rural St, Rockford, IL.

A Note From Pastor Janet Wold

Dear Friends,

Change.

As you can see by our article on the front page of our newsletter, we have elected a new bishop for our Northern Illinois Synod, The Rev. Jeffrey Clements. Our yearly synod assembly is always an incredible time of worship, meeting old

friends, making new ones and doing the "business" of our synod. This one was even more exciting with the election of new bishop, following Bishop Wollersheim's retirement.

No matter what the change is -good or bad - change can be challenging because it, well, CHANGES us! We are a people who like things to stay the same. I'm not an exception to that rule by any means. I love to travel, for example, but nothing beats getting back to our home, our bed, and our routines.

On Sunday, June 19, the gospel text for the day spoke of a man tormented by a legion of demons – so many, in fact, that when asked his name, he said "Legion." Ultimately, the demons were removed from this man and his life was changed in a remarkable way. He was in his right mind; he was able to return to his home, he was able to be in community again. Following that sermon, one of our members, Rev. Bill Wittig, told me the story of a man in one of his previous congregations. This man owned a gas station and would use that opportunity to share his faith with his customers. One day a member of their congregation came in who hadn't been in worship in quite some time. The gas station owner invited him back – "It'd be great to see you there!" The inactive member said "I can't come back to church – if I do, I know I'll be changed, and I don't WANT to change."

The truth is that we WILL be changed if we open ourselves up to God's love and purpose for our lives. God calls us to love our enemy, give of ourselves freely, both of our time and our finances, to forgive others (and ourselves), and to let others know about how much God loves them. God may have something in mind for you that might feel challenging (just ask our new bishop!), but I can guarantee that if God has placed this change in your heart (or in the heart of our congregation), God will give us the ability to carry it out.

Traditions, continuity, routine – they are all good things. However, our challenge is to not get so entrenched in them so as we are not open to what God is calling us to do and be. Let us pray to hear God's will in our lives and in the life of our congregation!

Notification of Congregation Meeting August 14, 2016

Proposed Constitution Change Notification

The following change to Paragraph C12.01 of the All Saints Constitution removes the mandate of a Young Adult age 18 to 30 to serve on the Congregation Council. A special congregation meeting is being called on August 14, 2016 after the conclusion of each service to vote on this recommended change.

CONGREGATION COUNCIL

C12.01. The voting membership of the Congregation Council shall consist of the pastor(s), the officers of the congregation, and up to 7 other members of the congregation, at least one of whom shall be a youth (under the age of 18 at the commencement of their term) and at least one of whom shall should be a young adult congregation may be elected, subject only to the limitation on the length of continuous service permitted in that office. A member's place on the Congregation Council shall be declared vacant if the member a) ceases to be a voting member of this congregation or b) is absent from four successive regular meetings of the Congregation Council without cause. Consistent with the laws of the state in which this congregation is incorporated, the congregation may adopt procedures for the removal of a member of the Congregation Council in other circumstances.

We were proud to have so many of our youth in attendance! We were well represented on stage during the LYO officer installation. It was a fast paced three days with lots of business, prayer, worship, music, information given, and laughter. Of course the highlight of the weekend was electing Pastor Jeff Clements as our new Bishop. Bishop Elect Clements will be installed to office on September 24 at First Lutheran Church in Rockford. ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton will conduct the installation, so it will be a great event to attend. ELCA Churchwide Representative, ELCA Secretary Wm. Chris Boerger, was the Chair of the Election of Bishop. He was very informative in his explanation of the process and made the entire election run smoothly.

400+ Domestic Violence recovery kits were collected. 30 of which came from the generous donations of All Saints members. Thank you for your generosity!

Additionally, resolutions were discussed and acted upon, the 2017 Budget was presented, discussed, voted on, and passed, committee reports were presented, ordained pastor retirements were celebrated, and three new pastors were ordained. 17 new Synod Council and Committee members were elected and announced, including our own Pastor Janet who was elected to a three year term on the Synod Council. Freedom Lutheran Church, Oregon, IL, was received and welcomed as a duly organized and recognized church of the ELCA. Congratulations to that congregation!

If you are interested in attending the 30th Annual Synod Assembly, it will be held June 16-17, 2017. You can offer to be a voting member at our Annual Congregation meeting in January, or go as a non-voting guest. It's an amazing, uplifting, and very spiritual experience.






Adult Sunday School Fall Curriculum

This Fall our Adult Sunday School Class will embark on a 24 segment journey with a new course entitled *How Jesus Became God*. Each segment is 30 minutes in length and we then spend up to 30 minutes discussing the video. A weekly handout with information on each segment will be provided to the class. All are invited to the course that will be held during regular Sunday School hours.

The course is presented by Bart D. Ehrman, Ph.D., the James A. Gray Distinguished Professor at The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where he has taught since 1988. He completed his undergraduate work at Wheaton College and received his M.Div. and Ph.D. from Princeton Theological Seminary. Before taking his position at UNC, Professor Ehrman taught at Rutgers University. Professor Ehrman has published dozens of book reviews and scholarly articles for academic journals. He has written or edited 29 books, including 4 best sellers on The New York Times list. He is a noted scholar of Biblical history and this course is one of the newest additions to the series.

As a preview for the course, we will present two segments of a series we have reviewed before that tie into this course. The two segments will be viewed in the Sanctuary from 9:30 to 10:00 AM on Sunday, August 7th and 14th. We will watch one segment each Sunday. On August 7th we will view "Jesus of Nazareth," where Professor Amy-Jill Levine of the Vanderbilt University Divinity School brings Jesus to life in a talk on how he was perceived by his followers. On August 14th we will view "The Christ of Faith," where Dr. Levine talks about Jesus as God. These segments are part of her 24 segment course *Great Figures of the New Testament*.
