We Worship

This hymn is known as the African American National Anthem. It places emphasis on the history of people of African descent, inclusive of their many triumphs and struggles. This great song is known across the world, but the history behind the song's creation and first performance is often unknown.

Publicly performed first as a poem as part of a celebration of Lincoln's Birthday on February 12, 1900 by 500 schoolchildren at the segregated Stanton School in Jacksonville, Florida. Principal James Weldon Johnson wrote the words to introduce its honored guest, Booker T. Washington. The poem was later set to music by Mr. Johnson's brother, John, in 1905. Singing this song quickly became a way for African Americans to demonstrate their patriotism and hope for the future.

Spiritual Deepening Practice: Reflecting on Sacred Stories

Then those who reverenced God talked with each other, telling stories of their spiritual journeys and God listened and heard. A scroll of remembrance was written in God's presence concerning these who spoke of their walk with God and how they honor God's life with their own. "They will be mine," says the Holy One, "in the day when I make up my treasured possession. I will uplift them, just as in compassion a parent holds fast to beloved children. And you will again see the distinction between the lives of those who turn to God and the lives of those who turn away, between those who serve God and those who do not.

-- Malachi 3:16-18, adapted

Reflecting upon the witness of Malachi in the Hebrew Scriptures, devout practitioners of the Jewish faith say that when pious people sit and tell holy stories, God comes and listens. Generations of people of African descent have marked the "way out of no way," from despair into faith and from bondage into freedom, with words lifted in song and story. LGBTQIA peoples have for years braved violences of all kinds to bring story from silence, to speak our truth into life. Faith ... freedom ... life ... God-with-us is proclaimed in the Sacred Stories we share and in the death-defying, lifeaffirming, community/ies we form, rooted in stories of faith. Bill Moyers writes: "Once in East Africa, on the shores of an ancient lake. I sat alone and suddenly it struck me what community is. It is gathering around a fire and listening to someone tell us a story." The meditative practice of Sacred Storytelling involves receiving a faith-story in such a way that when listening, even if others are present, a person should assume that on a spiritual level the story is being told "just for me," and should ask, "Why would God intend for me to hear this particular story at this particular time?" Listen - what is God intending for you to hear through it's telling at this time? Read the story aloud. Listen to the words.

Her son had always been a lovely child: inquisitive, sensitive, compassionate. In the past year, however, a change had risen in him: agitated, selfish and even angry – she was beside herself with concern. It is the sugar, it doesn't agree with him! her mother would tell her. It's the sugar, it is like poison in the boy! her grandmother agreed. So she tried to keep the sugar from him, but he would be a young man soon and he challenged her: That is stupid! he would proclaim, What do you know about such things? She determined to make the days journey with him, have him see the Wise One; her son would listen to him ... And so, rising early in the morning they set out from the village: she, resolute; the soon-to-be-young-man who was her son, surly and shuffling at her side. The day of walking was dusty and tedious, the line to see the Wise One long. At last, in the late afternoon, the woman brought her son before the Wise One. She explained that he was a lovely child - inquisitive, sensitive, compassionate - but that the sugar was poisoning him, changing him into someone untrue to his own spirit. Tell him to stop eating sugar! she begged. The Wise One looked upon them both quietly. Please – I ask of you: tell him to stop eating sugar! she repeated. Again, the Wise One considered them both silently. Eventually he spoke, saying only Return in 3 weeks. The woman was beside herself, but the Wise One turned to the next person in line. She took her son and began the long walk home. Three weeks later the woman and her son again made the journey. Arriving at their second meeting with the Wise One, he welcomed the woman and her son and he spoke to the soon-to-be-young-man solemnly, with both compassion and conviction: My son, the sugar is poison to your spirit; you cannot be truly free or deeply happy until you let it go. This is an important time in your life – and it is time for you to stop eating sugar. The woman wept as she saw understanding and acceptance dawn within her son's eyes. Thank you, beloved teacher, thank you! she whispered. As they turned to go, the woman paused. Can you tell me, Wise One: why could you not have spoken these valuable words to my son when we made the journey three weeks ago? The Wise One bowed once before her, and answered: Three weeks ago I was still eating sugar ...

Relax. Listen inside yourself for God's word within you. After 3-5 minutes of spiritually receptive listening note anything you may have received for your journey...



Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor replaces Share Card

The new Neighbor to Neighbor program (which is replacing the Share Card) launched on May 1, 2008 and allows Resurrection MCC the opportunity to earn a portion of \$1 million that will be donated annually. The program earning period is May 1, 2008 through April 30, 2009.

To participate in the program, simply take this printed page on your next shopping trip and have the cashier scan it at the beginning of the order.

Below are a few frequently asked questions of the program:

Can a household "link" their Kroger Plus Card to more than one organization at a time?

No, the system allows for one organization per household. To change organizations, you must present your KrogerPlus Card and the new organization's barcode to the cashier.

Do I have to enroll each program year? Yes, all organization's and participants must reenroll for each new enrollment period. The current *Neighbor to Neighbor* Program is effective May 1, 2008 to April 30, 2009.

Do I have to scan the organization letter each time I shop?

No, once the barcode is scanned with your plus card, you are enrolled for the remainder of the program year, ending on April 30, 2009.

How much can my organization earn?

The Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Donation Program will donate \$1 million annually. Each organization will earn a percentage of the \$1 million equal to the percentage of total earned contributions attributable to that organization.
