The Johnson County Extension Office's 4-H Youth Development personnel in partnership with the 4-H Teen Club and Adult 4-H Council recently conducted a Money Wise Workshop for 4th-6th graders. Students from Highland Elementary and WR Castle

schools attended the financial planning workshop and 4-H Teen club members served in Leadership roles. Each student was given an allowance based on their grades. The higher the GPA the better the allowance. In addition each student was responsible for a pet. The

purpose of the workshop was to familiarize youth with: calculating GPA's, realizing the difference between "necessary" expenses and "wanted" items, prioritizing the expenses of a budget and understanding the value of staying in school.

# THE ART OF VERBAL COMMUNICATION

### Preparation for Speaking

The following basic steps are most practical in developing your speech:

- 1. Select a subject that interests you. If you are interested in what you are talking about, your speech will be much more effective.
- 2. Investigate and gather necessary materials on your topic. This will help you write your speech.
- 3. Organize the material into an outline with an introduction, body and conclusion.
- 4. After you have prepared the outline, you can begin writing the speech. It is best to write your speech wordfor-word so that you know what you are going to say.
- 5. Be sure your speech has the following parts:

**Introduction**- This part of your speech is of great importance because it determines whether the audience decides to listen or not. In-

troductions have these purposes: to establish contact, to arouse interest and state the subject.

**Body**- This section is the speech that contains the main part of your topic. Your basic message is found here, developed to fit the specific statement given in your introduction.

Conclusion- Performs two functions in your speech: It gives a summary of content and it brings your speech to a close. In preparing your conclusion, make a summary of the major points in the body of your speech, and then give an appropriate closing statement.

### **Delivering your Speech**

How you deliver your speech to the audience is very important. Here are a few helpful hints:

Fluency – Talk smoothly. Know what you are going to say next. Avoid "Uh and Umm". Practice, practice! Movement – Move only when it helps you talk. Do not pace the room when giving your speech. This will distract the audience. A step forward or a step backward may be used effectively.

Voice Expression – Use expression in your voice. You can say the words "beautiful" and "exciting" so that they sound that way. Use your voice to give extra meaning to key words.

Rate – Be aware of how fast or slow you talk. Be sure that the audience can follow you, but don't speak so slowly that the audience will lose interest.

Intensity – Listen to how loud or soft you speak. Your voice should be loud enough to be heard easily by everyone. At the same time, be careful not to shout. Remember the size of the room and how many people are in the room.

# <u>Fabulous Food Recipe</u> <u>Peanut Butter and Jelly Muffins</u>

(Recipe courtesy of Captain Fit's Guide to Good Health—Matthew Alleyne, 2005)

# **Ingredients:**

3 tablespoons sugar 1 large egg

1 tablespoon baking powder 1 cup low-fat milk

3/4 cup peanut butter your favorite jam/jelly

- 1. Ask adult for permission to preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. Break egg into a bowl and use a fork to beat.
- 3. Add peanut butter to the beaten egg and mix with spoon until smooth.
- 4. Add milk to the peanut butter/egg mixture and stir.
- 5. Mix flour, sugar and baking powder in a large bowl.
- 6. Pour peanut butter mixture over dry ingredients and mix.
- 7. Spoon 2 tablespoons of batter into each hole of the muffin tin.
- 8. Cover that layer of batter with 1 teaspoon of jelly or jam.
- 9. Spoon 2 more tablespoons of batter over jelly/jam.
- 10. Have an adult place muffin tin into oven and bake for 20 minutes
- 11. When muffins are done, ask adult to remove them from oven and allow muffins to cool.

We are offering an <u>EARLY BIRD SPECIAL</u> which is a \$10 <u>discount if your registration and partial payment are received by April 10, 2015</u>. In addition, we are offering a <u>MULTIPLE CHILD SPECIAL</u> of \$10 off each <u>additional</u> child in multiple children families.

\*\*\*\*\*\*(For example, (in a 2 child family) if you register with a partial payment by April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2015, the first child would receive a total of \$10 off for early bird special, the second child would receive \$10 off for early bird special and another \$10 for multiple child special making the second child's total \$20 off).
