# COUNCIL MEETING REPORT

The first General Meeting of FMLCGC, Inc. was fun, informative and productive! The Board hopes to increase attendance by providing Programs of interest to all our members, emphasizing *gardening*—and all it entails in this part of the world. Our plant society clubs (i.e. Hibiscus, Tropical Fruit, Bonsai, Bromeliad, Native Plants, Herbs, Rose, Orchid) have over 600 members in total, and most never attend our Council General Meetings. Some do of course, and are also members of other garden clubs within our Council. But, in order to attract participation, we are offering educational, horticultural, serious and scientific information to our members. Yes—Designs are very important to many of us, but we hope to appeal to everyone with a meeting format which allows time for every member to partake of whichever part of the Agenda they choose. Refreshments and Socializing—YES! A bit of Business—YES! (We know it is required of any organization—please be patient). Programs which should appeal to most of us, as they are about the environment we live in here in SW Florida, have been planned. No politics, please! Just the facts, coming from recognized experts. Designs will have their time later in the morning, so anyone who is not interested may leave. But, we hope to make the idea of designing more appealing to everyone by showing examples and ideas that might be enjoyed or copied by all, in their own homes. This isn't just about Flower Shows and those very specific requirements for winning blue ribbons! This is to encourage and share ideas for just plain having fun with the stuff that grows all around us here in Florida! Yes, we do buy flowers sometimes, but we do encourage learning more about the art world's Elements & Principles of Design.

The September meeting featured Recycling. Our Program was presented by Denise Houghtaling of MW Horticulture Recycling. She showed us how all that yard waste produced constantly is turned into rich compost, and how we all benefit from a recycling/composting operation vs. Land Fills. Samples of compost and a special soil mix for growing in containers/raised beds were on each table. All are invited to visit their 2 facilities, and clubs encouraged to plan specific outings. Designs were on display, featuring the Recycling idea. Some were specific to NGC and Flower Show rules, and others were just fun approaches to whatever is growing or discarded or appreciated for it's own peculiar natural beauty. Thanks to our members who created these "works of art" from "whatever"! More fun ideas planned....

David Southall gave a 5 minute "Timely Tidbit" presentation on what we need to be doing or paying attention in our gardens at this time. Summer rains and high humidity encourage disease and nutrient deficiency. Tips on fertilizers, pruning, fungicides and general care of container plants and in ground plantings were given. Specific questions, preferably with photos, may be sent to him at d.southall@att.net. David is a true scientist, and member of Gulf Coast Garden Club. We appreciate his cooperation—and look forward to his Program in March on Mangroves.

Upcoming Program in November will be about BEES—The Buzz. Keith Councell is the speaker, and he does know his topic. Not all the bad news we hear about bees is true---and they really are out there doing their work efficiently. As one of their main jobs is to pollinate, we'll feature Fruits & Vegetables in the Design part of the meeting. Can't have fruits without flowers first—and something needs to pollinate in order to produce those viable fruits! Designs can be fun—and seasonal—with traditional harvest theme, or just using them for form and color. The taste comes later!
