I am excited to be nominated as the Club's Arts Chair. I have been in contact with April who has graciously agreed to help as our Assistant.



Hacienda Happenings



So many exciting things related to the 2016-2018 President's Project are happening at Women's Clubs around our State!

Many clubs have already visited, (or soon will be) the

Hacienda Girls Ranch in person. Some are planning projects directly with the girls. And most are actively involved in fundraising to help establish the GFWC Florida Hacienda Girls Ranch Foundation so that there is future financial support for the "extras".

Although our tri-fold outlines the areas targeted, funding a Foundation or Endowment can seem vague and difficult to visualize. Since one of the first goals of the Foundation will be to fund a safety fence and gate at the Ranch, we are providing a tangible way to track that goal.

Every \$50 donated will provide one foot of fencing security (and the related peace of mind for the girls and staff). That includes security features (cameras, call boxes, key fob entrance pads, fire code security doors) at the gates of the fence and buildings where appropriate, an electric gate, turnstile walking entrance and a third manual driving thru gate (for construction and delivery vehicles).

Fruit of the Month



American Indians enjoyed cranberries cooked and sweetened with honey or maple syrup - a cranberry sauce recipe that was likely a treat at early New England Thanksgiving feasts.

By the beginning of the 18th century, the tart red berries were already being exported to England by the colonists.

Cranberries were also used by the Indians decoratively, as a source of red dye. medicinally, as a poultice for wounds since not only do their astringent tannins contract tissues and help stop bleeding, but we now also know that compounds in cranberries have antibiotic effects.
