President Peter thanked the members for the help provided during the year and said that he wished to acknowledge this by presenting Recognitions and Awards.


The following members received the prestigious Paul Harris Recognitions:

- Lisa Lowcock for work as the past President and the establishment of the Men's Shed


Roger Leask spoke about the Royce Abbey award and said that this award is presented for "enthusiasm and commitment" he gave a short explanation of how this award was started



The speaker for the day was Jake Niall chief AFL reporter and writer for Fox Sports, he is the winner of the Walkley Award.

Jake spoke in great detail about the problems faced by the Essendon Football club, about the drug scandal and the fall from grace of some of the famous football players.

He said that over the years the game of footy has changed to be a very competitive sport and that some clubs have the financial backing and other do not and as such the clubs with the money have to support the poorer clubs.

He said that due to the competitive nature of this sport most coaches now go overseas to study the methods used by other codes to cope with the growing challenges faced in our sport and how it can be applied to improve the quality and strategies to our game, as well as to improve the psychological wellbeing of the players.

Jake gave examples of great players who had gone astray just before and soon after retirement, he highlighted

Wayne Carey who he said was one of the best players in the tournament and was bigger than the club he represented, but could not control his behaviour at the end of his career. He gave another example of Ben Cousins the Brownlow medal winner who came from a good family and had all the required attributes such as talent and strength and even looks but ruined himself with drugs and drink, he also mentioned Brendon Fevola who he said was a great player but was a 10 year old in a 30 year olds body.

Jake said that as the game became more and more competitive clubs tends to use every advantage they can get to be better than the competition and this results in some clubs using unethical means to get ahead, he said this is what happened to the Essendon Footy Club.

Jake also spoke about the problems faced by the aboriginal players most recently Adam Goodes and the reasons as to why he was treated the way he was, Jake said that Adam had opened an old wound when he reminded people of past atrocities by his war dance after scoring a goal, he said that Adam may not have meant it in the way it was perceived but it resulted in a lot of grief to him, his supporters and also the game.

Jake finished by saying that the greatest challenge is how to promote this game as a family friendly sport and to this end all the AFL clubs are taking actions to ensure this happens.

Marcus Veerman - Self-described maker, hacker and designer Marcus Veerman is CEO and Founder of Playgroundideas.org, an organisation that supports communities around the world to build playgrounds from local tools, materials, and skills.

With a background in primary education, outdoor leadership, and design-build learning, he founded Playground Ideas after spearheading the construction of 40 bespoke playgrounds along the Thai/Burma border.

Marcus responded to a wave of interest in international playground building by creating an open source platform to share best practices.

Demand for his services has taken him to Asia, Africa, The Middle East and South America to facilitate playground construction, consult on projects, and train teams of playground builders. Playgroundideas.org has now supported 900 communities in over 72 countries by building play spaces, impacting over 450,000 children around the world. And they're just getting started.




