HOLIDAY SEAFOOD SALAD

2 lbs. fresh Florida lobster tails lb. fresh Florida deveined, shelled raw shrimp

fresh Kingfish steak, weighing about 8 oz.

1 1/2 lbs. steamed clams in shell I envelope Italian salad dressing mix

1/4 cup cider vinegar

1/ cup olive oil or vegetable oil 1/3 cup chili sauce

Chicory or curly endive

1 medium size green pepper, halved, seeded, and cut in halved, seeded. strips

Cook lobster tails in boiling salted water, drain, cool until easy to handle. With scissors, cut through the thick membrane on underside of shell and remove. Take out lobster meat by peeling hard shell back with fingers of one hand and pulling meat towards you with the other. Leave small tails whole; split large ones in half. Place in a large shallow dish.

Cook shrimp, drain. Place in dish with lobster.

Simmer kingfish, covered, in boiling salted water in a large frying pan 10 minutes, or until fish flakes easily; remove from water. Place in dish with other seafoods, Chill.

Drain juice from clams into a cup; rinse clams in cold water to remove any sand grains; chill

Combine salad dressing mix with vinegar and 2 tablespoons of the clam juice in a jar with a tight lid; shake well to mix. Add olive oil and chili sauce; shake again; chill.

When ready to serve, line 4 scallop shells or individual salad bowls with chicory or curly endive. Remove skin and bones from kingfish; cut in 1-inch squares. Arrange kingfish, lobster, shrimps, and clams in shells or bowls, dividing evenly. Garnish each with green pepper strips. Serve dressing separately to spoon over all.
