Additional Prekindergarten Programs Non VPK

ESE Partial and Full Day Programs

- 3 & 4 year old identified ESE students
- 1 teacher, 1 paraprofessional
- speech and language / OT & PT services
- 8-10 students

Head Start /ESE Blended Programs

- 3 & 4 year old Head Start and VCS / ESE students
- 1 Volusia teacher, 1 paraprofessional
- 1 Head Start teacher, 1 Head Start assistant
- 18 students dually enrolled

Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) Models

Summer VPK State Mandated- F.S. 1002.53

- 4 or 5 year old community students beginning kindergarten in the fall
- 1 certified teacher per 12 students / 1 TOA for compliance regulations and mandated assessments
- 300 hours of instruction during the summer prior to kindergarten 8 weeks
- typically 9 ½ hr days M TH to meet the required 300 hrs of instruction
- summer sites vary to meet the needs of our program feeder patterns

Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) Models

Employee VPK/ESE Blended

- 10 typically developing / 8 identified ESE
- 3 & 4 year old students (4 year old typically developing VPK)
- 1 Certified ESE Pre-K teacher (VPK) / 1 CDA (VPK) / 1 paraprofessional
- Typical school day with extended hours for employees' children

New To Our District... VPK-Title I Early Learning Initiative

- 18 -20 four year old typically developing students eligible for Title I
- 1 certified prekindergarten teacher
- 1 highly qualified paraprofessional IV

- 540 hrs Title I Early Learning instruction 3 hrs a day and PLUS I



Standards for 4-year-olds

Kindergarten Standards

Domain: Language, Communication & Literacy - Reading Benchmark a:

Child can distinguish individual words within spoken phrases or sentences.

LAFS.K.RF.1.1

Understand that words are separated by spaces in print.

Domain: Language, Communication & Literacy - Reading Benchmark b:

Child names most letters correctly when shown upper or lowercase letters.

LAFS.K.RF.1.1

Recognize and name all uppercase and lowercase letters of the alphabet.

FLDOE/Office of Early Learning Provider Accountability

VPK Readiness Rate is calculated using FLKRS (Florida Kindergarten Readiness Screener)
Includes FAIR – FS and WSS

Passing scores:

- 70% of students at each VPK site must pass both sections of FLKRS.
- less than 70% of students passing FLKRS determines a low performing status- Provider on Probation

Provider on Probation must:


- use an approved curriculum
- submit improvement plan to FLDOE/Office of Early Learning
- provide additional professional development for instructors
- submit "Good Cause Exemption" if probation continues beyond 2 years
- · if exemptions are not granted, providers are closed

2015-2016 will include VPK assessment growth AP1 – AP3



Changes for Summer VPK

Community & District Concerns

Instructional days are too long 32 days: 7:37am - 5:30 pm

No time for a "Meet the Teacher"

Post Planning not within regular work hours extending the day even longer

VPK assessments mandated and take time to individually administer

Programs are placed on "probation" for low performing FLKRS scores

Solutions

Extend the number of days to 35 days: 7:50 am - 5:00 pm

Preplanning day will offer a "Meet the Teacher"


Last day early release with Completion Ceremony and Parent Literacy Workshop

TOA's will cover teacher lunch breaks, assist with curriculum needs and administer VPK assessments

Decrease the summer program need by expanding – School Year Programs






VPK End of Year Assessments



The Curriculum Connection To Kindergarten

VPK Summer & Phase I Early Learning Initiative focus:


- Social/emotional readiness implemented into curriculum
- Letter /sound fluency skills instructionally targeted everyday with developmentally appropriate practices.

Goal:

VPK/Title I and Summer VPK students will enter kindergarten ready to receive instruction with district SIPPS (Systematic Instruction in Phonological Awareness, Phonics, and Sight Word) curriculum program.

SIPPS Kindergarten Baseline needs: 20/26 letter fluency (77% mastery) to enter early emergent reading instruction.




