# From Father Rodney

If you happened to have a chance to read the bulletin last weekend, you will have seen the notice about the "special Mass" we are celebrating this weekend. Pope Francis announced a Synod – (from the Greek synodos, assembly), in the Christian Church, a local or provincial assembly of bishops, church officials and laity during which they meet to discuss the life of the Church. The title of the particular 3 year period that will soon begin with the bishops of the entire Church meeting in communion with Pope Francis is: For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission. Now, if you are reading these words, you understand the importance of these three elements so vital to the life of the ecclesial body of the Church. We need to be in communion with one another and when we do we receive Communion and build up the Body of the Church. We participate in the mission of the Church by reaching out to those who have fallen away from the practice of the faith. The Holy Father has asked all Diocesan Bishop's and for them to ask local parishes to celebrate the Votive Mass of the Holy Spirit. You will note that I will be wearing red vestments and the readings have been selected by the bishop (they will not be in the missals – if you have one – but Monica will print them in the bulletin which you can access on your smart phone – yes – even during Mass! We will hear about the Spirit vivifies the Church but we need to be open to seeing how the Lord is working in our midst hence the Gospel story of the road to Emmaus. We all know that over the years people have fallen away from the practice of the faith. Younger families worship the god of sports as practices and games are held on Sunday mornings. I am always so edified when I hear young families who regularly attend weekend Mass that they will be changing their normal Mass time to accommodate their children's sports schedule but always making time to worship. As we enter into this time of a refocusing our attention on what it means to be a member of the Catholic Church let us pray that the Spirit will guide us into greater communion with our God and with one another. We are all called to share our faith with one another. Not in a "showy" sort of pious way but rather helping to shape and be reshaped into the likeness of the living God. Communion, Participation and Mission. May these principles help to reshape the Catholic Church in North Attleborough so that, like those who settled here many, many years ago and gave their all to spread the faith, be rebuilt into a stronger community who desire to have our eyes opened by Jesus who journeys with us even today.

# A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Glory to you, O Lord. †

That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. He asked them, What are you discussing as you walk along?" They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?" And he replied to them, "What sort of things?" They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him. But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this, it is now the third day since this took place. Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive. Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described, but him they did not see." And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?"

Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures. As they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going on farther. But they urged him, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the eleven and those with them who were saving, "The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!" Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of
