

Storybook Sculpture Project Downtown Abilene

The Abilene Cultural Affairs Council commissioned the first storybook sculpture in 1996. "Childhood's Great Adventure" is based on the William Joyce book "Santa Calls," which was set in Abilene, Texas. Joyce was the inspiration behind the National Center for Children's Illustrated Literature. More sculptures followed over the years. Today, Abilene is home to the largest public collection of storybook sculptures in the U.S. New sculptures are added each year during the Children's Art & Literacy Festival. The mission of the Storybook Sculpture Project is to create 3D art that brings children's literature to life.

E. Aster Bunnymund






Follow the Art Adventure Trail!

For more than 20 years, the National Center for Children's Illustrated Literature (NCCIL) has collaborated with award-winning illustrators to produce exhibitions of their artwork that are distinctive, appealing to museum visitors of all ages and are of the highest quality. In addition to this unique artistic partnership, following its debut at the NCCIL gallery, each exhibition travels to museums, public libraries and galleries nationwide. The mission of the NCCIL is to exhibit, tour, collect, preserve and promote original art from the finest children's literature. For the local community, the NCCIL offers opportunities to meet visiting artists, free Saturday family art activities, Monthly Art Adventure for pre-schoolers, exhibition tours for students, workshops and book signings. The museum also has a bookstore stocked with books signed by artists who have exhibited at the NCCIL.

When Loren Long first wrote and illustrated "Otis" in 2009, he never planned to write more books about the same characters. But there was something about the lovable tractor that moved Long in a way that took him back to his own childhood sitting on his mother's lap while she read to him. The authentic goodness of Otis compelled Long to write more stories about him, becoming a best-selling series. Otis and other characters created by Long's artwork will be brought to life at the 2020 CALF. The festival honors the featured summer illustrator each year at the NCCIL. The three-day festival will start with the Storybook Parade, costume contest, sculpture unveiling and artist talk Thursday night. All day Friday and Saturday, enjoy dramatic readings, art activities, magic shows costumed characters, workshops, petting zoos, train rides and more!
