




Northern Virginia Market Area





Fairfax Government Structure

Fairfax County operates under the urban county executive form of government, an optional form of Virginia county government, and has limited powers.

The powers of government are vested in an elected Board of Supervisors consisting of nine members elected by district, plus a Chairman elected at large. All voters in the county vote for the Chairman, while each district residents votes for one Supervisor.

At its regular meetings, the Board of Supervisors:

- ✓ Establishes county government policy
- ✓ Passes resolutions and ordinances (within the limits of its authority)
- ✓ Approves the budget
- ✓ Sets tax rates
- ✓ Approves land use plans
- ✓ Makes appointments

The Board appoints the county executive, who is the administrative head of the county government.








Housing Type

Tax Rate and Property Values

- √ Wake County
 - Property Revaluation every eight (8) years
 - Total property value: \$118.85 billion
 - Assessment approximates fair market value
 - Property Tax Rate: \$.534 per \$100 of assessed value
 - Personal Property: \$.534 per \$100 of assessed value
 - Sales Tax Rate: 7.75% (5.75% state and 2% county)
- √ Fairfax County
 - Annual Property Revaluation, effective January 1st each year
 - Total Taxable Real Estate: \$206.8 billion
 - Property Tax Rate: \$1.04 per \$100 of assessed value
 - Personal Property Tax Rate: \$4.57 per \$100 assessed value
 - Sales Tax Rate: 5% (4% state and 1% county)
 - Assessment approximately fair market value

A portion of the personal property tax is reimbursed by the Commonwealth of Virginia due to personal property tax relief act of 1998.








EXHIBIT A - North Carolina County-to-County Commuting


