Introduction

The Wales Marine Action and Advisory group (WMAAG) provides a forum for discussion and debate, and the provision of support and advice to the Welsh Government, on strategic marine and coastal policy. It is the overarching stakeholder group for the work of the Marine and Fisheries Division of the Welsh Government, sitting alongside the Welsh Marine Fisheries Action Group (WMFAG), the lead Welsh Government fisheries industry forum in Wales.

The WMAAG is comprised of 36 stakeholder leads who represent the interests of all sectors with an interest or investment in the Marine in Wales. Details of sectors and lead organisations can be found within the group's <u>Terms of Reference</u>.

Key Messages and Outputs

Item 1: Welcome, introductions and apologies

The Chair explained this meeting would be update focussed given the group had not met for some time. Members were also informed there was no 'stakeholder update' circulated ahead of the meeting as items would be covered during the meeting.

<u>Item 2: Marine & Fisheries Division Update</u>

- Gareth Bevington will have responsibility for Domestic Fisheries, Control and Enforcement.
- Gareth explained how whilst both Deputy Directors will have their own areas of responsibility the Division remains one Division with two interchangeable Deputy Directors.
- Gareth explained how the Division was restructured in the summer to bring alignment of policy areas and create new teams to ensure Division is more proactive and agile.
 - Control and Enforcement brought into one branch led by James Watkins.
 - Licensing and Planning brought together led by John Hamer
 - MSFD and marine biodiversity brought together led by Chris Jenkins
 - Domestic Fisheries Policy and legislation led by Julian Bray
 - Fisheries Science and Evidence led by Bekah Cioffi
 - Marine Science and Evidence led by Chris Jenkins
 - EMFF Funding Policy led by Gary Douch
 - Trade led by Bethan Jones
 - International Fisheries led by Elin Gwynedd
 - Brexit and Legislation led by Rob Floyd

Gareth explained there has been significant work involved in ongoing trade agreement negotiations and explained it will continue to take a lot of resource from the Division going forward.

Highlights over the past six months;

- Marine Plan published November 2019. Significant achievement and involved over seven years of work.
- Domestic Fisheries policy working with WMFAG in publishing consultation on flexible management of Whelk fishery in Wales.
- Marine Protected Areas Action Plan delivered end of last year. Marine Resilience have had first meeting and due to next meet 26 March. Division is keen to move onto deliver on commitments.

2.3 Circulate the Permanent Secretary's letter to the scrutiny committee.

Jonathan Monk asked if there is funding for capital for projects as part of the budget – Gareth will get back to him on that point.

David Jones asked whether the Seas and Coast group were still meeting. Gareth questioned the governance of the group and referred to the Brexit and our Seas (BaOS) and future direction on Future Fisheries Policy (FFP), which may have an external group to cover those areas.

Gill Bell asked how conservation will be covered in a new group. Gareth confirmed BaOS and FFP will have an environmental element to it and will maintain an ecosystem approach. He stressed the need to get the governance right and the right people around the table.

Members raised concerns about staffing, especially within MSFD and Biodiversity team. The scrutiny from Assembly Committee highlights the importance of marine biodiversity and Gareth confirmed he is looking at filling vacancies across the Division. Gareth agreed to circulate the Permanent Secretary's letter to the scrutiny committee, to members.

Jonathan Monk welcomed the Minister's commitment to re-investigate Marine Conservation Zone work.

Gareth welcomed Mike Dowell, newly appointed Deputy Director for the Division. Mike gave a brief synopsis of his background as having a degree in marine biology, his previous role as the Fisheries attaché in Brussels and previous career in Defra. Mike re-iterated that he and Gareth would work together heading up one team. The appointing of two Deputy Directors recognises the volume and breadth of work across the Division.

Peter welcomed Mike to the group.

Alec Denny, Sustainable Recreation Coordinator, PCF gave a presentation on the work PCF have been doing on Wales Activity Mapping.	
Members discussed categorisation of different activities such as Jet Skis, RIBs and motorboats. Members discussed how the data was collected and analysed and whether effectiveness of guidance codes could be evaluated using this data. Phil Coates highlighted particular problems with spatial data and stated they should be regarded with health warnings.	

Item 6: Clean Seas Partnership update

Peter Davies gave an update on the progress made by the Clean Seas Partnership. Online and published today (26 February) - marine litter research - marine litter action plan 2020-2023 - Newsletter and revised webpages on the Business Wales website. Members discussed positive impact of 'Blue Planet' and behavioural change. Suggestion to change language from marine litter to plastic pollution. Funding availability was discussed and need to look at what other countries are doing eg Scandinavia, also how to connect into various available resources.

Gareth confirmed WG's commitment to the marine ecosystem approach demonstrated through the MPA Action Plan, Marine Plan, Marine Conservation Zones as well as through the Brexit and Our Seas.	
Tamsin Brown , UK Fisheries Bill Manager gave an overview of progress on the Bill and steps towards a Welsh Fisheries Bill to give wider power to manage fisheries for environmental benefit.	
Jim Evans stated financial burden of UK Fish Bill could provide opportunity to make a bid to UK Government for appropriate finance. Gareth recognised the point and agreed to take that point away.	

Jonathan Monk asked whether the Bill would get rid of several orders. Tamsin	
confirmed several orders were not covered by the Bill.

Gill Bell commented the evidence strategy does not investigate how a fully recovered and healthy ecosystem could benefit the economy and that more research was needed in this area. Gareth stated the newly set up Marine Resilience Group is a good vehicle to raise issues/concerns, however, current focus is on delivery rather than re-strategising at this time.	9.2 Jenny Grubb to check on research projects and feed back.
Jonathan Monk stated Marine Conservation Zone work coming up provides an opportunity to do things better.	
Jonathan Monk explained how the Milford Haven Waterway Scientific working group works together with the Haven and regulating bodies. Action Chris Jenkins and Bekah Cioffi to speak to Jonathan about collective research.	
Mary Lewis commented that the strategy was developed heavily between WG and NRW and the next stages is in making the links between other research projects.
