# Joanne's Jottings

As I write this piece for our next newsletter, it is the afternoon of April 27, 2016, and earlier this morning I conducted Transgender 10I training for all 26 superintendents of the 26 State Correctional Institutions, as well as 3 Deputy Directors of the Department of Corrections (DOC), and other key staff members.

This is a direct result of a new partnership between TransCentralPA and the Department of Corrections as they sought our assistance to help provide support for the roughly 150 trans-identified inmates in their facilities.

The training session this morning is the first part of a three-part effort. The second will be assisting with curriculum development for Correctional In-service Training as well as assisting in the presentations. Finally, we are jointly in the planning stages to provide a virtual support group for those trans-inmates. This will be possible through the creation of a video conference, available to all units within the Commonwealth, at a set time each month. Participants will come from the DOC, as well as any of our several gender therapists, and representatives from TransCentralPA.

They asked if we were considering any type of follow-on, post release programs that could assist in relocations, housing, and job placement. My response was that it was not on our radar, and might be beyond our ability. If any of our members have suggestions as to how we could provide this level of assistance, I would love hear those ideas.

I do not know about you, but this partnership with the DOC is both groundbreaking and exciting.

In a prior column as well as at one of our recent meetings, I acknowledged that I was aware that some of you had a keen interest in speaking out on behalf of our community, and that I was in favor of that, but felt that we all needed to speak from a similar script. To that end, I proposed a special meeting for anyone interested in a TransCentralPA Speakers Bureau that I would conduct a training session during the month of May. That training will take place on Sunday, May 15, the day after our next meeting. We will meet in the back of the Dog and Pony Restaurant at the Sheraton at 1:00 PM and should last for one to one and a half hours.

Finally, Hayden Denton has finally returned to us after his sabbatical in Baltimore and I could not be happier. To celebrate his "homecoming" he has invited us to a picnic and bonfire at his new residence on Saturday, May 21, from 4:30 PM to 10:30 PM. Bring folding chairs, your choice of beverage and some potluck item to share; we will be posting a signup sheet for potluck items on our website. 

# Did You Know The Navajos Honor Four Genders?

America has been pretty up-tight when it comes to gender roles for a long time, now, but that wasn't always the case. The Navajo have long recognized four different gender identities, rather than two, and those who don't fall into traditional, puritanical Eurocentric notions of gender identity are revered, rather than ostracized, or even killed, as was the case of Fred Martinez, the "youngest victim of a hate crime ever," and the subject of the 2009 PBS documentary "Two Spirits."

"The masculine and feminine are oftentimes reflected so completely in the body of one person, it's as if they have two spirits," Two-Spirit organizer Richard LaFortune said. The documentary draws attention to what the Navajo call "nádleehí," which is the confluence of the masculine and feminine within each person, sometimes resulting in what many consider "two-spirited" people – those born with one biological sex but who identify with another gender identity. Fred Martinez was nádleehí, born male but who identified as female. As "Two Spirits" points out in its opening, "In another time, [Martinez] would have been honored. Instead, he was murdered..." in 2001, at the age of 16 – all due to his two-spirited nature and gender identity.

Navajo scholar included in the documentary, Wesley Thomas, states, "In Navajo teaching, in the old traditional world, there were four basic genders. Women are the first gender, because Navajo is a matrilineal society. Men are the second gender; and the third gender is the nádleehí, who is born as a male person but functions in the role of a girl in early child-hood and in the role of a woman in adulthood. And it's just the opposite for the fourth gender," Thomas adds, "where they were born biologically female but functioned in the role of a boy in early childhood and matured into a man, and conducts their life in that gender identity."

"In Western culture, when they say 'a girl,' there's an automatic assumption that that girl is female. Or when they see a boy, they never pause to think that boy may be female," Thomas points out.

Mainstream America would like clear-cut illusions maintained, complete with missing genitalia to keep us all from thinking of those "naughty" parts – otherwise, as Martinez found out, they may just make you pay with your life – proving once again just how much mainstream America can still learn from Indigenous peoples.



# Target Strikes Back at North Carolina Bathroom Law

Target is taking a stand against North Carolina's transphobic bathroom bill, saying its customers and employees can use the bathroom that matches their gender identity.

The company announced the policy on its corporate website today, saying, "Inclusivity is a core belief at Target. It's something we celebrate."

The department store chain even proclaimed its support for the Equality Act that is proposed in Congress.

"We believe that everyone — every team member, every guest, and every community — deserves to be protected from discrimination, and treated equally," the company said in its statement. "Consistent with this belief, Target supports the federal Equality Act, which provides protections to LGBT individuals, and opposes action that enables discrimination."

The bill would revise the 1964 Civil Rights Act to ban discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity, making it illegal to discriminate in hiring, housing, and more. The Equality Act is supported by President Obama and the two Democrats running to replace him, but it is stalled in a Republican-led Congress.

It's the polar opposite of what North Carolina lawmakers passed in House Bill 2, which banned local governments from including sexual orientation and gender identity in their anti-discrimination ordinances. The law also specifically targeted transgender people, who it requires to use the public bathroom and locker room facilities that don't match their gender identity.

Obviously, Target's bathrooms aren't the kind of "public" bathrooms that the law takes aim at — the law applies only to government buildings, not the private sector but the statement is still seen as a rebuke of lawmakers.

Target has come a long way from the days when LGBT activists had threatened a boycott of the company in 2010. The Human Rights Campaign had once even dropped the chain from its annual buyer's guide. That's when Target's political donations ended up supporting an antigay candidate for governor in Minnesota, where it's based.

Now Target not only sells products that celebrate LGBT people and touts the launch of a gender-neutral kids' collection, it's speaking out in defense of LGBT people in the political sphere.

"We regularly assess issues and consider many factors such as impact to our business, guests and team members," the company explained about why it's speaking out. "Given the specific questions these legislative proposals raised about how we manage our fitting rooms and restrooms, we felt it was important to state our position. Everyone deserves to feel like they belong. And you'll always be accepted, respected and welcomed at Target."
