

Construction Barbarossa – Hitler turned East
 Construction Barbarossa – Invasion of USSR
 Construction June 22, 1941 – Hitler invades USSR, assumed it would be a quick win before the Russian winter set in

US Entry to War

Recall: When was Pearl Harbor?

☑ Dec. 7, 1941 – the date that will live in infamy

After Pearl Harbor, the US joins the war – Allies

US fight in Pacific against Japan (Pacific Campaign) & Europe
 First stop – N. Africa



Battle of El Alamein

Gen. Rommel (the Desert Fox) & Axis Powers had Egyptian city of El Alamein
 Brits, led by Gen. Montgomery, took them by surprise with massive attack
 Battle of El Alamein (Oct. 23 – Nov. 4, 1942)

-Monty pushes Rommel out

Battle of Stalingrad

2nd Front of Euro. – USSR
 Battle of Stalingrad (Aug. 23, 1942 – Feb. 2, 1943)
 Germ. Luftwaffe bombed the city of Stalingrad, hoped Soviets would surrender

✓ By Nov. 1942, Germ. controlled most of city but winter was coming Soviets surrounded Stalingrad and cut of supplies to Germ. troops
Both Stalin and Hitler told soldiers to win "at all costs"

☞ Feb. 1943 – Germ. Soldiers surrender, but city is mostly destroyed

 Am. made important contributions to Allied war effort


S Produced weapons and equipment for the war

War Limits Civil Rights

- After PH, prejudice rose against Jp.-Am. – seen as the enemy
- Reb. 19, 1942 Exec. Order 9066 for internment of Jp.-Am. considered a threat
- Internment camps rounded up "aliens" and moved to camps

- Most were native-born Am. whose parents were Japanese
- Many Jp.-Am. volunteered for mil. service and fought for the US
 - 442nd Infantry fought in Euro., most decorated unit in Am. warfare, almost entirely Jp.-Am.
