From the Principal:

This week has been one of the busiest weeks of the year for students and staff at Wauchope High School. We have seen students participating in the Regional Heats for the Worldskills VET in Schools competition as well as all of Year 8 giving their final presentations of their MindMatters projects. I also had the pleasure of listening to students from 7-2 present their findings and recommendations to the school from their Waste Project.

I would also like to congratulate all those students who continue to excel in their ongoing sporting endeavours and in their pursuit of the Creative and Performing Arts. A number of the male members of staff have also been working hard to ensure that the school proudly demonstrates its support for the national Movember Campaign. Don't forget to assist where you can in the fundraising activity next Monday for the Beyond Blue foundation.

I would like to make a special mention of the work that our Year 8 students have put into their Mind Matters projects. It has been very interesting to see the range of projects that have been developed by the students throughout the year and the final products that form part of their all-important presentation. The parents that have been able to be a part of the presentation have certainly walked away impressed by the depth of knowledge developed and the way our students are able to communicate their ideas and understanding of their chosen topic.

The marking of these projects is a mammoth task and I would like to thank all the staff involved. Some staff have made themselves available until 6 pm every night this week to enable students to present their work in the presence of their parents. Well done and congratulations to all involved.

As the school year races towards it close for students on Wednesday 16 December I like to remind you of the important messages I have been giving throughout the year in relation to attendance. It is my expectation that all students are at school every day and in every lesson. Every time a child is allowed to have the day off or is allowed to leave early without an appropriate reason we actually disadvantage them in terms of their success in their learning. Our aim for every student must be 100% attendance if they are to achieve their true and full potential. I thank you for your support in achieving this aim for your child.

Wauchope High School views Wednesday afternoon sport as an opportunity for students to develop 'Body Intelligence', team working and social skills critical for them to be a successful part of our community into the future. This is reflected in the fact that Sport is a mandatory part of the curriculum for all students in Years 7-10. When students miss sport this time is recorded as an absence and could impact on their eligibility for the award of a Record of School Achievement (ROSA). While we acknowledge the difficulty of being able to always get medical appointments outside of school hours I would ask that you support the school and its attendance policy by trying to do this wherever possible. If your child is unable to participate in their regular sport on any particular day because of injuries we can arrange for them to be at school and supervised in an alternative activity until such times as they are able to return to their regular sport.

Worldskills





On Wednesday, Wauchope High hosted a regional heat for the Worldskills VET in Schools competition. Students Zac Flanagan, Lucas Flanagan and Joshua Bannerman represented the school in the Worldskills Carpentry division. The competition was facilitated by Mr Weatherby and Judged by Ian Chegwidden from North Coast TAFE institute (shop fitting and carpentry section).

The field of seven students included Wauchope High Students as well as students from Newman Senior Technical College in Port Macquarie and Hunter Trade College in Maitland. The seven students included students undertaking VET Construction as part of their HSC as well as students completing school based apprenticeships.

The day was a fierce competition with each student building a Cabinet Makers Saw Horse in 7 hours.

This is the first time a local school from the Wauchope/Hastings area has competed in Worldskills Carpentry in 5 years so a big Congratulations to Zac, Lucas and Josh for their

achievement on the day. Though the day was won by students from Hunter Trade College and Newman college, a big congratulations

goes to Zac Flanagan for taking 4th place in the regional heat. Worldskills is a highly respected international level competition and it's great to see Wauchope High School represented in the comp. Worldskills is open to all Year 11 VET students and can be entered during year 11.

It's that time of year again when Year 7 & 8 students at WHS are rewarded for their efforts in Mathematics. Invites are in the process of being handed out to the students who the Mathematics staff feel have worked well throughout 2015.

This is not a compulsory excursion but a reward. There is, however, mathematics work to be completed on the day by all participants who must complete a

booklet of exercises whilst going on the many rides at the venue.

If your child receives an invite then you must complete the bottom of the invite and return the bottom portion on <u>Tuesday 1st December at Lunch 1</u>. They will not be accepted beforehand. Each student must line up outside the Mathematics staffroom where the first 90 students will receive a permission slip and any student thereafter will be placed on the reserve list.

With reference to the school's attendance policy, those students with an attendance level of less than 85% are ineligible to attend.

Those 90 students must pay their **<u>\$80</u>** and return the permission slip and medical form to the front office by **<u>Monday 7th December</u>** or a reserve student will take their place.

The excursion is on **Friday 11th December** and the bus departs from the school at **<u>5am</u>**. The expected time of return is **<u>10:30pm</u>**. We have found in the past that this time can vary due to traffic and the length of stop for dinner on our way home.



Those Marvellous Men with their Motley Mo's raising money for Movember



Support for Parents using NewAccess - a beyondblue initiative

NewAccess - a beyondblue initiative is a FREE coaching program auspiced by North Coast Primary Health Network and funded by beyondblue and the Movember Foundation. It offers FREE support for people aged 18+ years who are not already receiving support from a mental health professional. The program operates from Tweed Heads to Port Macquarie and many small communities in between such as Wauchope and Kempsey.

Simply by getting in touch with a NewAccess Coach, parents can have up to six support sessions to set goals and help change negative feelings. People can self-refer but sometimes find it hard to take that 'first step' and most often, referrals are supported by a health professional, community service worker or a GP. With the option of phone or face-to-face sessions, NewAccess offers a convenient solution to get people early support where they can learn practical strategies to help with life pressures. Absence From School

A note must be provided for all absences and late arrivals within 7 days of the absence. Reporting an Absence

1. Phone the School - 6585 1400

2. Email - email the School email address: wauchope-h.school@det.nsw.edu.au

3. Note - send in a note with your child to give to the office. Be sure to put your child's first and last name on the note.

4. Visit the School and advise the office ladies

5. If the School does not hear from you we will make contact by phone or by mail. Absentee letters will be mailed to you to complete and return to the school so all absences are justified. Unjustified absences can result in other agencies making contact with parents, (Home School Liaison Officers and Police).

A small number of absences may be accepted by the principal. For example, if your child

- is too sick to go to school or has an infectious illness
- is required to attend an exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. a funeral)
- has an unavoidable medical appointment
- has to attend a special religious or cultural ceremony/holiday

If a student is to be away for a period of 10 days or more (e.g. surgery, student exchange) parents must complete an "Application for Extended Leave" or an "Application for Exemption from Attendance at School" form which is available from the school. Families are encouraged to take holidays during school holidays as absences relating to travel will be marked as leave/ unjustified and therefore contribute to your child's total absences. The Principal will consider your application and decide whether to grant a 'Certificate of Exemption from Attendance at School'.

Under the Education Act, All children between 6 - 17 years of age are legally required to attend school, every day that school is open for instruction, and where they are absent have a legal requirement to notify school within 7 days.
