

*Prayer of Confession







from The Study Catechism: Confirmation Version (1998)

One: What is a sacrament?

All: A sacrament is a special act of Christian worship, instituted by Christ, which uses a visible sign to proclaim the promise of the gospel for the forgiveness of sins and eternal life. In baptism the sign is that of water; in the Lord's Supper, that of bread and wine.

One: What is the Lord's Supper?

All: The Lord's Supper is the sign and seal by which our communion with Christ is renewed.

One: What does it mean to share in the Lord's Supper?

All: When we celebrate the Lord's Supper, the Lord Jesus Christ is truly present, pouring out his Spirit upon us. By his Spirit, the bread that we break and the cup that we bless share in his body and blood. As I receive the bread and the cup, remembering that Christ died even for me, I feed on him in my heart by faith with thanksgiving. His life becomes mine, and my life becomes his, to all eternity.


