# 2017 Canada Trip

# **About the adventure**

The trip is open to all club member fishermen and their guest. We start the planning with a "kick off" meeting in March. At the meeting we discuss the trip dates and the committee members review last years trip report, both the positives/negatives, and any suggestions for this year. You can sign up for the trip and pay your deposit of \$250 per person (note,



deposit can be made any time before or at the planning meeting). At the June meeting we discuss the final details of the trip. Fishermen usually sign-up in pairs (teams). You will decide if you are bring your boat or using a lodge rental. Each team will be given a list of supplies you are required to purchase and bring to the lodge, and if you have any special request now is time to discuss them. At the "pick up" meeting, which is the Thursday before we leave, we meet at the club and pick up your teams share of the supplies that must be transported to Canada. Also each team will receive a copy of the Lodge room assignments and a duty roster. Since we all share with the cooking and cleaning up, the roster serves as a schedule for each teams assignments.

# A typical day at the lodge

Breakfast is at 6am, followed by fishing on a lake! Bait and ice are available at the Lodge. The lake is LARGE! You can explore the pure Canadian wilderness, fish, spot eagles, and may even have a god chance of seeing a bear or moose. You may not even see another Fisherman! For lunch on a few days we all meet at a predetermined spot for a shore lunch. A team will fry fish (fresh caught), potatoes and anything else they can think of. Dinner is served at 6pm but most Fishermen are in at 5 for some social time and story telling. After Dinner some go fishing, or you can stay at the Lodge and relax.

# Some special activities




# Trap & Skeet
