Ash Wednesday and the First Sunday of Lent

Dear Friends: I hope that your Lent is off to a good start. It was good to be with so many of you for our Ash Wednesday celebrations. For today's reflection, I thought I would take us back a couple of days to this past Wednesday. I offer these thoughts as an opportunity to reflect on what this season could be for all of us.

On Ash Wednesday, we heard from the Prophet Joel, who writes, "Even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart, with fasting, and weeping, and mourning; rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the Lord, your God." (from Joel 2:12-18).

One of the first things that most of us *focus on* in the morning is what to wear that day. One of the first things that many of us *do in the morning* is look at our phone. How we start our day says something about how we will live it. In today's world, it is very easy to get caught up in how we look, what other people think, and what the world is saying: in the news, through social media, and so on. Lent calls us to refocus, to "rend," as scripture says. One priest I know makes the distinction between *going to the head* or *going to the heart*. Consider, for example, your morning routine, especially as Lent is beginning. In the morning, what's the first thing you go for? After letting the dog out or making the coffee, what do you do next? Do you go for the phone, or do you go to God in prayer? Do you turn on the news, or do you decide to let it wait for at least a few minutes? All of it.

"Rending our hearts, not our garments" begins with a daily rending, a daily going to the Heart of Christ, first thing and in all things. (QUESTION)- can an adjustment to the start of my day be a good thing for me during this time?
