PICK UP REMINDERS

Rose Bay PS continues to follow the Department of Education guidelines for COVID safe procedures.

2021 INVoices

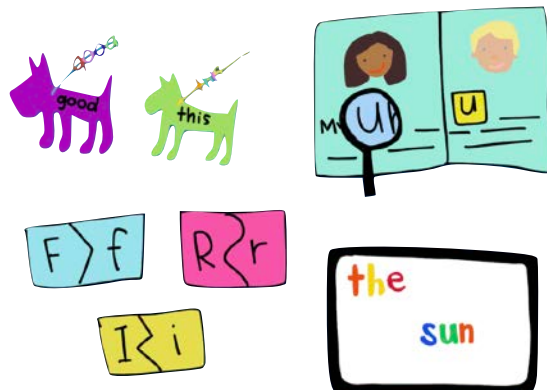
